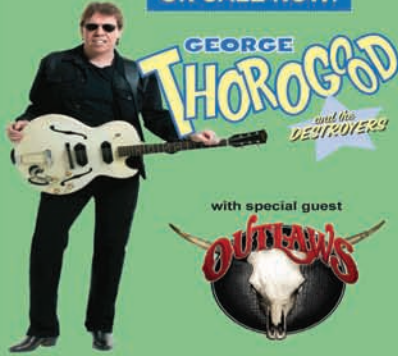

Building It Bigger, Better

Each year as Fort Wayne anticipates the biggest week of a very busy festival season, the upcoming schedule – and changes to the schedule – of Three Rivers Festival is a source of intrigue. Which bands will play at Headwaters Park? What events will be changed or expanded? How many elephant ears and funnel cakes will every citizen be able to consume?

Some of those answers are now available. Junk Food Alley consumption is up to each and every one of us to resolve on our own.

Jack Hammer, popular radio personality turned executive director of Three Rivers Festival, has been building a bigger and better TRF during his tenure, bringing back the beloved raft race and, more surprisingly, turning it into a sober, family-friendly event. This year he's taken another festival favorite, the Crafters Market, and turned it into a week-long extravaganza.

"We've turned Crafters Market into Marketplace, which is now a week-long shopping experience," says Hammer. "I wanted to be able to offer a constant shopping experience for people attending the festival throughout the week, and Marketplace will be open from 11 until 11 each day. I find

myself going to shop at the festival and seeing things that I didn't know existed but suddenly needed to have immediately. So it was hard to say goodbye to Crafters Market, but Marketplace was something that I really thought we had to do to meet the needs of people attending the festival."

Of course, like most of the traditional and beloved events of the Indiana calendar year, Three Rivers Festival is paying homage to the state's bicentennial celebration, making it the theme for the Opening Day Parade on Saturday, July 9.

TRF commissioned local artist Terry Ratliff to design the cover of this year's festival guide, another nod to the bicentennial celebration. Serving as the grand marshal at this year's parade is Bob Chase, a man who has received national recognition recently and is as cherished as anyone in the city.

"Just to call Bob Chase to ask him to be our grand marshal was such a thrill for me," says Hammer. "My uncle was a sales manager at WOWO for years, and he would take us into the station with him. And I would listen to Bob Chase when I was a kid on the beaches of Florida. So I was always a big fan, and I'm so happy that he's going to be

our grand marshal."

In addition to the parade, many of the Three Rivers Festival favorites are returning. The Bed Race, one of TRF's heritage events, zooms down the streets of downtown Fort Wayne on Wednesday, July 13. After a four-year winning streak, DeBrand's had to yield the Bed Race crown to Salus Research, making this year's event a little more interesting.

Of course, the popular Children's Fest at IPFW returns on the final two days of the festival, July 15-16. While there are food and drinks available for purchase at Children's

Fest, everything else is completely free, making a big hit with families for many years. Rides, face-painting, interactive booths are just a few of the stops as the Fest takes over Fort Wayne's largest campus. The Kids Fun Run, an 800-meter run, takes place on Saturday at 10:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m., providing Parkview with a chance to encourage exercise for our youngsters.

Another classic TRF event brought back in recent years, International Village, may be Hammer's favorite revival of his tenure. Although he doesn't specifically say so, it's clear his heart is very much with this event as something bigger and better than a chance to eat really great ethnic cuisine.

"International Village is taking place in the Club Soda lot this year, and there will be 12 countries represented. The food is great, but I really think it all serves a larger purpose. I'm very fortunate that since we brought back International Village, I know so many people of different cultures, people that I can call my friends now. I really think that it helps remind us that we're all really in this together and that we need to love our brothers."

If anything equals Hammer's passion for people as displayed in International Village, it's his love and appreciation for our rivers, something that was somewhat lost for a time.

Despite being called the Three Rivers Festival, the rivers were somewhat lacking from the annual celebration in a move to nestle the events into the Headwaters pavilion and adjacent areas. While close to the rivers, many of the annual events were no longer directly on the rivers or paying tribute to them. A chance to learn more about our rivers up close and personal comes through 30-minute guided pontoon rides. This year's rides can be taken July 8 (4-8 p.m.), July 9 (11 a.m.-8 p.m.) and July 10 (11 a.m.-5 p.m.). With 10 running boats, there's a steady stream of departures and plenty of opportunities to see the rivers. Since the excursions began in 2014, more than 4000 people have taken advantage of the rides.

"The rides depart from the Headwaters dock," says Hammer. "These excursions have been very special because 95 percent of those riding have never been on our rivers before."

Then there's the Raft Race. Once one of the most popular sporting events in the state (some estimates put attendance second only to the Indianapolis 500), it had become a somewhat soggy affair. And the liquid wasn't necessarily river water. With things getting slightly out of control, and the family-friendliness long

gone, the race was suspended for several years. While previous directors did consider ways to reintroduce the much lamented race into the festival schedule, Hammer was the one who came up with a plan and made it happen. With cash prizes (this year totaling \$12,000), the race is now a serious competition and open to even more participants through a program designed to get more people involved.

"This year we have built 25 rafts [for] people who want to be in the race but don't have the tools or the truck to haul it. For \$125, four people will get the raft, paddles and life jackets and can get involved and enjoy the race. It's a great chance to get out with some friends and compete for the cash prizes. And these are all cash prizes."

Many other returning events and programs – Luscious Legs, Art in the Park, trolley rides to the downtown area at lunch time – can be found in the TRF guide distributed with this issue of *whatzup* and also available online at whatzup.com.

In addition to many of the free events, this year there are ways to cut costs through the Admiral's Access program. A new means of selling membership to the festival, a ticket sold for \$195 provides more than \$300 of value for a family of four. The package includes passes for music events, drink tickets and all-day ride passes. More information about Admiral's Access and all of the TRF events is available at the TRF website.



CRACKER, NIGHT RANGER



Feature • Three Rivers Festival A Show for Every Taste

The concert schedule in Fort Wayne this summer has been jam-packed with a remarkable lineup of classic pop and rock acts, a veritable feast for the Baby Boomers among us. But if the younger generation, those who grew up listening to the music of the 1990s, feel like they may be getting the shaft, there's good news. Jack Hammer has your back.

The always highly anticipated concert lineup at this year's Three Rivers Festival is bringing in some of the tribute acts that have become popular over the years while also bringing in some of the 1990s most popular music. As has been the case for the last few years, TRF now kicks off with music on the Friday night, July 8, before the Opening Day Parade.

That evening will see a return of the popular Who's Band, a Michael Jackson tribute. Hammer himself raves about this show which was a big hit in the past. With Jackson now gone for seven years, the value of a performance like this is even more appreciated and serves as a great vehicle for a couple of local acts to serve as warm-up. G Money and Fort Wayne Funk Orchestra will kick things off at 7 p.m.

Saturday, July 9 will see a powerhouse triple-header of bands billed as SummerDaze, which features Better Than Ezra as headliners while Sister Hazel and Cracker take the stage as openers at the Headwaters Park Pavilion. The combined hit power of these three groups should satisfy music fans who have been turning out in force the last few years for other bands of their era. While these performers will naturally satisfy the audience's desire for their classic hits, attendees of SummerDaze can also expect some new music, with Better Than Ezra having released their latest studio album, *All Together Now*, in 2014, the same year Cracker released their latest album, *Berkeley to Bakersfield*. Sister Hazel's latest, *Lighter in the Dark*, came out this past February.

Christian music headlines the stage on Sunday beginning at 5 p.m. with Sidewalk Prophets, Danny Gokey and We Are Messengers all performing with an after-party featuring DJ Promote.

Local music is featured on Tuesday, July 12 with the band Brother headlining and the Lennon Brothers and Sunny Taylor serving as special guests. Wednesday brings another packed evening of entertainment with Summit City Rising, which features Oferle with

American Idol Manny Torres along with Eithen/Or and Soft N Heavy.

If you missed Stevie Wonder's performance in Indianapolis last November (or if you saw it and want to relive the incredible experience), Thursday's Second Annual Heart & Soul Affair is the place to be. Cam B will be opening for the evening's headliner, Natural Wonder: The Ultimate Stevie Wonder Experience. The next best thing to seeing Stevie live is to catch this performance. If you want proof, check out some of the many videos available on YouTube. It's uncanny.

Then batten down the hatches for the final two nights of Three Rivers Festival when Night Ranger come to the Summit City on Friday, July 15. It's easy and appropriate to think first and foremost of "Sister Christian" when you think of Night Ranger, and there's no denying that the song is an enduring classic. Still heard on radio more than 30 years later and featured on Broadway and in film – most notably in *Rock of Ages* and *Boogie Nights* – it's come to be their signature smash. But before "Sister Christian" came to define their sound, hits like "Don't Tell Me You Love Me" and "When You Close Your

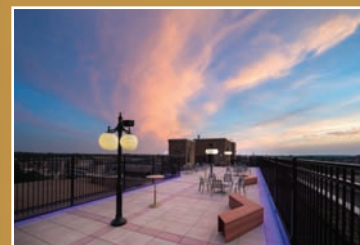

Masters of Mayhem

The hardest working band in rock 'n roll is coming to Brandt's Harley Davidson in Marion for a free concert July 16.

Fans will know immediately who we're referring to – the heavy metal foursome from Georgia with the Southern rock influences known to include a chainsaw among their gear and famous for playing not one, not two, but 21 concerts in a 24-hour period. (Also 100 shows in 50 days. The dudes don't need much sleep, apparently.)

Of course we're talking about Jackyl, otherwise known as Jesse Dupree (vocals), Jeff Worley (guitar), Roman Glick (bass) and Chris Worley (percussion) – are a natural fit to play a Harley Davidson campus. Prior to the show's cancellation in 2103, Dupree was a regular on TruTV's *Full Throttle Saloon* which gave viewers an inside look at the madness and mayhem that is the annual Sturgis, South Dakota Motorcycle Rally. The show's title refers to a 30-acre property in Sturgis that housed not only indoor and outdoor bars but a several stages, a burn-out pit, zip lines, restaurants, stores, a wrestling ring and cabins for rent. Designated the world's largest biker bar, the Full Throttle Saloon burned to the ground last fall.

Which was sad, a tragedy for Sturgis-or-Bust diehards, but working at Full Throttle and appearing in the show was only one of Dupree's many projects. According to the Full Throttle site, the Jackyl frontman isn't happy unless he's split into a million pieces. Hence his Mighty Loud trademark, under whose banner he promotes a number of products, including Crunk!!! energy drink and Jesse James' America Outlaw Beer and Bourbon.

"I always made a connection with the guy I saw on television who was spinning plates with a stick," he says. "There's something that would intrigue me about that. Although I can't spin a plate on a stick for nothing, I can damn sure do it in a proverbial sense."

Back in the late 80s, when Jackyl were just starting to make a name for themselves as tireless and ridiculously energizing live performers, Dupree's main spinning plate was obviously the band he formed along with original mates the Worley brothers, Thomas Bettini and Jimmy Stiff. Stiff, who left the band in 1999, claims in an interview with *Legendary Rock* that the seeds for Jackyl were sown thanks to a fateful move and a shared love of Black Sabbath. Oh, and destiny.

"When I was born I had a guitar already. My dad

and my granddad were guitar pickers. It was a done deal," he said. "When my parents got divorced and I moved down here, I met the Worley boys. It was a snowy day when I saw three guys riding bikes across from my trailer park. They heard me playing Sabbath and came beating on my door. I thought it was the landlord at the time, mad about something. It was all destiny, man. I did it for a decade. We sold a lot of records."

That they did. Having signed with heavyweights Geffen Records in the early 90s, Jackyl hit the rock scene hard with their eponymous debut in 1992, following it up with certified Gold album *Push Comes to Shove*.

Soon fans all over the U.S. were clamoring for a chance to see Jackyl pound out "Lumberjack," "Down on Me," "When Will It Rain," "I Stand Alone," and a few other hits whose titles we can't print here. "Lumberjack," of course, features Dupree's now iconic chainsaw solo.

Jackyl became beloved for their irreverent take on hard rock and their equally devil-may-care approach to live performing and life in general. When a K-Mart in their hometown refused to carry *Jackyl* because of

its naughty nature, the band staged a protest right in the store's parking lot, treating amused fans to an impromptu concert and blowing up a van in the process. Naturally, taped footage from the event was used in the video for the hit "I Stand Alone."

The 90s were Jackyl's heyday. It was during that decade that they toured with the likes of Aerosmith, Kiss, ZZ Top, Ted Nugent and Damn Yankees. They also put out two more best-selling albums – 1997's *Cut the Crap* and 1998's *Stayin' Alive*.

Stiff told *Legendary Rock* that it was a bizarre and beautiful time, and that each member of the band had a particular role to play: "Jessie was the business head. Chris was the technical one. Jeff was the drill sergeant with the drive of 10 men. Tom [Bettini, bass] and me were the toxic twins, into women and chemicals, herbs and spices, powders..."

It was because of the heady combination of women and chemicals that Stiff bowed out. A single dad, he decided to devote himself to his son and to religion, which he credits with saving his life. Even without Stiff, Jackyl, like all shows, must go on and go on the dudes did. They proceeded to put out three albums with indie labels and on their own – *Relentless*, *When Moonshine and Dynamite Collide* and *Best in Show* – and their latest, *Rowyco*, is due to drop August 5.

The release of *Rowyco* will coincide with the grand reopening of Full Throttle Saloon. How fitting. A hard-working, hard-rocking band and a bad-to-the-bone venue get a chance at new life together. Comebacks come in twos, in other words.

Someone cue the violins. Pardon us. Chainsaws.

Performing's in His DNA

From an early age, Gavin Drew was aware of the power of entertainment.

"I think that performing was just in my DNA. Whenever I found someone who was sad, I would put on a show for them," he says. "I wanted to make them happy."

In fact, he says, in addition to his "weird obsession with puppets" (that persists to this day), he was constantly putting on his own shows—"any kind of show I could put on for anyone who would listen or watch."

As a boy in Conway, Arkansas, he taught himself ventriloquism ("it took hours and hours of standing in front of a mirror and watching my mouth") and he says he made up for his lack of siblings by amassing a collection of over a hundred puppets over the years.

Drew wasn't an anomaly in his family when it came to entertaining. "My parents did some high school theater, and my grandfather was a party magician," he says. His father has several musicians in the family.

He was first bitten by the theater bug at the age of five after his family had moved to Wisconsin. He saw his live musical, a high school production of *Fiddler on the Roof*.

"I remember loving it and being so jealous of them getting to have that opportunity," he says. "I expressed this to my mom, and she found an audition for me."

The audition was at The Good Company Too, a Wisconsin children's theater, for a production of *The Wizard of Oz*, the film of which had been a huge influence on his performance ambitions. "I was auditioning for any role I could get," he says. "I was nervous, but my parents were more nervous."

He sang the requisite "Somewhere Over the Rainbow" on the stage, and afterward the director said to the teenage auditioners, "Shame on you. This five-year-old can project louder than all of you combined. That's how it's done!"

"I've never had an inside voice," Drew says now. "I'm a loud mouth."

He was cast as the Mayor of Munchkin City, and it was the last time he was ever nervous at an audition.

"The Good Company Too laid the foundation for my love for the theater," he says. "They held Saturday classes before the beginning of rehearsals to teach us children about the different aspects of theater—makeup, sound, lights, scenic design. It was a fantastic program."

When he was eight, his family moved to Ossian, Indiana.

"We moved around a lot because of my dad's work," he explains. His first major community theater audition was for *Oliver!* at Wells Community Theater in Bluffton. He also performed with and took classes at the Fort Wayne Youtheatre when he was in seventh grade.

While attending Norwell High School (he graduated this spring) he was more involved in show choir than with theater.

"Show choir and theater are very different animals," he says. "In show choir it's all about being uniform with the other performers. That is not applicable to theater. Instead of blending in, you want to stand out." However, he says that theater gave him the basis for learning to "tell a story with your face," which helped him in show choir.

Even without formal theater training in high school, Drew has gotten plenty of theater experience outside of school.

"I am crazy busy with community theater," he says. "My life and schedule revolve around it."



He says community theater has helped him mature as an actor.

"I think that I have a better understanding of why we perform now than I did as a child," he says. "I used to do it just to have fun. But I now understand that we act because it fulfills a secret part of us. It's an alternate reality that we get to play in. When we have good material, good directors and good cast mates, the process is magical."

Since moving to the region, Drew has had opportunities to work with several of the community theaters in Fort Wayne, including the Fort Wayne Youtheatre, Fort Wayne Summer Music Theatre and Fort Wayne Civic Theatre.

But the theater with which he has the most longstanding relationship is Wells Community Theater (WCT) in Bluffton. "They are small, but mighty," he says. "I think they don't get the credit they deserve because they are 'way out in Bluffton,' but they are legitimate and wonderful. When my family moved to Indiana, they welcomed me with open arms, and that kind of brings it back full circle to the show I'm in today."

That show is a one-man comedy, *Buyer and Cellar*, by Jonathan Tolins. The 2014 play focuses on Alex More, an underemployed actor who is hired to work in the mall in the basement of Barbra Streisand's Malibu home. "It is a hilarious piece of fiction," says Drew.

He was actually approached by the Creative Arts Council of Wells County, which

runs WCT.

"I've become sort of a regular at WCT, and they called me with the offer of a farewell performance show," he says. "The idea was that the proceeds would go to my college fund. I jumped at the opportunity."

Drew was given his choice of production. "I did some research and found *Buyer and Cellar* which is hysterically funny and filled with heart," he says.

He says his director, Marlyn Koons, "is one of the best when it comes to creating moments and interpreting dialogue. Marlyn and I work well together. With a show like this, there is a lot of communication between the actor and the director, and working with her makes it so easy."

He is also enjoying the challenge of memorizing a 90-minute show (with no intermission) in which he never leaves the stage. "It has made me grow as an actor as it has pushed me harder than any show has so far," he says.

Drew says his natural sense of humor tends to land him character roles, particularly comedic ones. "I played an old man for Youtheatre for what seemed like decades," he jokes, "but I would love to play the romantic lead every now and again!"

He's not really complaining about his typecasting, though.

"Those comedic roles are very fun and keep me entertained," he says.

Drew hopes to expand his range and repertoire beginning this fall when he enters the music theatre program at Oklahoma City University.

Auditions for the prestigious program were intense.

"We arrived and were immediately escorted to a dance hall," he says, "where they taught us a three-minute dance combination that we performed for the dance faculty. Then I was taken to a smaller room and performed two monologues, and after that I went to a concert hall and performed three full songs for the music faculty." After two long months of waiting he was notified of his acceptance just before Christmas of 2015.

"They have a fantastic musical theater program and a track record to back it," he says, citing such stars as Tony Award-winning stars Kristin Chenoweth and Kelli O'Hara who graduated from the program.

He's already had a small taste of acclaim here in Fort Wayne. Last month he won his first Civic Theatre Anthony Award (it was his third Anthony nomination) for his performance as Igor in the Mel Brooks musical *Young Frankenstein*.

"That show was the most fun I have ever had in the theater, and anyone involved can testify," he says.

Drew's longer-term goals are to make a living as a theater performer after he earns his degree.

"I would love to see myself living in New York and going to work on stage every night," he says. "Broadway is the ultimate goal."

Band of Horses

Why Are You OK

Though 2006's *Everything All the Time* and its standout track, "Funeral," thrust Band of Horses into the national spotlight, it was apparent from the start the Band of Horses weren't in this business for the glory. Their particular blend of desolate-yet-gorgeous melodies, home-fried rock hooks and heart-on-sleeve vocals has always had an audience, but it's readily apparent that the success follows the music and not vice versa. BOH main man Brad Bridwell writes engaging, sometimes gut-wrenchingly honest songs; his emotional honesty lies at the core of what makes this band such a fan favorite.

The latest release, *Why Are You OK*, will only add to the band's appeal. "Home is the heart is / Home is where you are," sings Bridwell on "Dull Times/The Moon," the album's sweeping opener. Reminiscent of earlier BOH work, the song takes its time introducing us to the record as Bridwell lures in the listener with his indelible combination of intimate lyrics and spacious reverb. Just as "There Is a Ghost" kicked off 2007's *Cease To Begin* with little more than Bridwell's plaintive voice reaching out to the listener, so does this track. But the two-part implication in the song's title soon becomes apparent as the tune abruptly jumps up and shifts to something resembling nothing if not an indie-rock Rush. Jarring, yes. But it's also a great way to experience the breadth of BOH's dynamics in less than seven minutes.

Produced by Granddaddy's Jason Lytle, *Why Are You OK* is suitably ornate, heartfelt and sonically fascinating. It's a far cry from 2012's *Mirage Rock* which was recorded as live to tape as possible. Lytle's stamp is nowhere more evident here than on "Casual Party," a pop-kissed gem and one of the album's first singles, and on the laid-back, ELO-tinged "Lying Under Oak." But Bridwell has become his own particular force of nature, and it's clear that BOH are drawing their own pictures with Lytle's crayons.

"Throw My Mess" revels in its Southern-rock vibe and kick-drum drive while "Barrel House" is vintage Bridwell: a keening, melancholy waltz that could use a hug. It's a stunning beauty of a song. Sure to be a live barn-burner, "Solemn Oath" teems with a driving rhythm and hooks galore – and the kind of lyrical realness ("I love you so much, I'm gonna throw up") that's made BOH stand out since their debut.

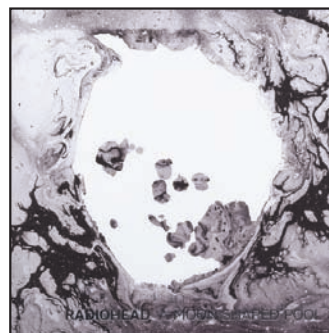
The best compliment I can give *Why Are You OK* is that fans will absolutely love this album while a whole lot of first-time listeners will become Band of Horses fans after hearing it. (D.M. Jones)

Radiohead

A Moon Shaped Pool

In the surreal music video for "Daydreaming," Radiohead's Thom Yorke ventures alone through a variety of settings before finally retreating to the confines of a hidden cave in the middle of a barren, snowy landscape. As he huddles close to a small fire, desperate for warmth, his earlier verse about dreamers who never learn until the point of no return reveals itself as a warning that issues only get worse as you wander from them.

Among other surrealistic songs on *A Moon Shaped Pool*, Radiohead's ninth album, the moments of ominous warnings and nightmarish lyrics are offset by moments of great beauty. It's a balance they have strived for and perfected over 30 years of being a band going back to when they were known as On a Friday. This far into their career, the album feels like a closure statement between themes of regret and forgiveness (inspired by the dissolution of Yorke's 23-year relationship with Rachel Owen) melding with a few songs that have long since been in the Radiohead canon but have not received proper releases until now. The most significant of those is "True Love Waits" which dates back to 1994. While the context of this song about abject loneliness never truly fit on previous albums, its

These guys formed in the early 90s in San Francisco and were celebrated for their psychedelic-meets-shoe-gaze sound which, unfortunately, took a back seat to grunge during that period in rock n' roll. This was their first full-length album and fits safely in my Top 20 favorite records of all time.

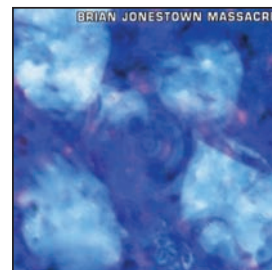
"Evergreen" kicks things off, and you are quickly greeted to the tenacious, droning guitars and hanging vocals from Anton Newcombe (with the purring background layer from Elise Dye). Just when you realize how great of a song it is, it's over. "Wisdom," like most BJM tracks, carries a Velvet Underground echo to it, as does the trippy "Crushed" which, for all of its weirdness, is still one of the smartest things on the record.

"Wasted" mirrors the sound that Sonic Youth was throwing down at the same time, but with less distortion. "Everyone Says" hums along while Paola Simmonds carries a backing harmony and shares some lead vocals with Newcombe. It's one of my favorites from the record, and I distinctively remember it on college radio back in the Bay Area. "She Made Me" was another track that made it on FM radio. It's a groovier tempo, sort of mixture between The Cure and The Smiths.

I can't gush enough about this album, and the space for this column prevents me from going into the details about this band and their catalog of music.

When you think it can't get better, "Hyperventilation" blows your mind for almost 10 minutes. I won't call it Goth; that wouldn't be fair. But it has a darker feel to it and just hammers away on the guitars in the same way that Joy Division used to. It's so good.

I celebrate their whole collection – which includes 13 albums after this one (the latest release was last year). (Dennis Donahue)



placement as *A Moon Shaped Pool*'s closer finds Yorke at his most emotionally vulnerable and brings the album to a devastating end.

While Yorke's separation is the prominent subject in *A Moon Shaped Pool*, he thankfully doesn't allow it to consume the album whole. The opening song, "Burn the Witch," with its origins dating back to the supremely paranoid *Kid A*, fittingly decries the notion of using groupthink to castigate and place blame on another group of people for the actions of a few. The song also makes extensive use of Johnny Greenwood's gift for orchestral arrangements (lovingly performed by the London Contemporary Orchestra) which are utilized to an unprecedented degree on *Moon Shaped Pool* than any other Radiohead album.

Appropriately, *A Moon Shaped Pool*'s general feel is that of floating in a completely foreign substance, which some may welcome while others may not entirely appreciate on the first listen. But even if the lyrics are too much of a downer, one can still appreciate how hard each member works to contribute to the whole experience of the album. Songs like "Identikit" (featuring a brilliant guitar solo at the end), "Ful Stop" and "The Numbers" are classic Radiohead playing to their strengths to convey numbness and unease as expertly as they can create euphoria and paranoia in the same song.

Like the best Radiohead albums, *A Moon Shaped Pool*, requires patience in order to appreciate each song's importance on the record. Even the weakest songs are a matter of opinion, just as the album's best moments are subject to stringent debate among fans. By now, most fans have already listened to the album and bought a copy, so if anything, this review is for those who are still on the fence about the band in general, or have only casually heard songs like "Paranoid Android," "House of Cards" or, most likely, "Creep".

A Moon Shaped Pool dutifully stands as the group's most down-trodden and anxious statement, but its fluidity from song to song invites fans and newcomers alike to dive into it over and over again. (Colin McCallister)

The festival closes on Saturday, July 16 with the return of Pink Droyd, a tribute band which has ably filled the Floyd void. Their popularity in Fort Wayne seems to grow with every passing year, and it almost seems they should become honorary house band for TRF's concert lineup.

Making their performance even more dramatic will be a slight pause in the proceedings for the launching of the TRF Fireworks Finale, a display which Hammer thinks is the best annual fireworks in the city. After the fireworks, music will continue and

will play out another Three Rivers Festival. Opening for Pink Droyd will be Straight On, a Heart tribute band which comes just two months after the Wilson sisters themselves filled the Fort Wayne airwaves with their incredible power.

A Good, Old-Fashioned Weepee

Me Before You is a good, old-fashioned chick flick several hankie weepie. As long as you know that going in, the disappointments will be few and the pleasures more than you might anticipate. Aided by good performances and a welcome and fresh matter of factness to the formula, *Me Before You* makes for a good cry and enjoyable viewing.

Based on the 2012 best selling novel by JoJo Moyes, who adapted her own work, and directed by theater veteran and first-time film director Thea Sharrock, *Me Before You* will remind you of movies in which the conflict comes between the inevitable death of a person with deadly disease or injury and the people, especially the one person, who will be devastated by the loss. *Me Before You* is not as syrupy as *Love Story*, nor as determinedly stoic as *The Fault in Our Stars*, nor as agonizing and multi-layered as *The Descendants*.

The doomed prince, Will Traynor (*The Hunger Games*' Sam Claflin) is the handsome, young, rich, smart, successful, formerly athletic master of the universe who is now a paraplegic in much pain. He is confined to a wheelchair after being run down by a motor scooter. He is closed off – bitter, angry, cynical and often just plain mean.

He has dismissed many paid companions, but he meets his match in Louisa. Louisa (*Game of Thrones*' Emilia Clarke) has recently lost her job at a tea shop that is closing down. She needs a new job fast because her family needs the money, so she becomes caretaker/companion to Traynor. As it turns out, she is perfect for the job. She is the yin to Will's yang.

Louisa chatters too much when she is nervous, which she almost always is. Her fashion sense is beyond quirky, especially for someone with limited means living in a small community in England. Her outlandish costuming is enjoyable. Her body and face are round and healthy; as Bridget Jones would say, she is not a stick insect.

Will and Lou have chemistry from the start. At first, it is a negative chemistry, but it evolves. The first sign of genuine feeling for each other comes from bonding over a foreign film. These two are surrounded by competent people, allowing them to pay attention to each other. Physical therapist Nathan (Stephen Peacocke) takes care of the messes. Louisa learns to help, but she is not responsible for Will's health issues.

What is best about *Me Before You* is that all the supporting players are supportive, not sources for manufactured conflict. The film sticks to the premise that the real drama is Will's struggle with his diminishing health. When Louisa lures him out to hear Mozart, at the end of the evening he wants to linger in the car. "I just want to be a man who has been to a concert with a girl in a red dress," he says.

Will's mother (Janet McTeer) hires Louisa, despite Louisa's bungling interview, hoping a pretty young girl will help her son. Will's father (Charles Dance) is stoic and practical, but loving. Louisa's family is also spot on. It is wonderful to see Brendan Coyle (Bates from *Downton Abbey*) without a limp and without the expression of a man of constant sorrow. Mom (Samantha Spiro) has her opinions, but lets Louisa do as she sees best. Sister Katrina (Jenna Coleman) gives very good advice.

Even Louisa's inevitable break-up with boyfriend Patrick (Matthew Lewis, Neville Longbottom from *Harry Potter*) happens with no more hysteria than needed. At Louisa's birthday dinner, Patrick gets her a

Dory Maintains Its Grip on Box

Tops at the Box: Andrew Stanton's *Finding Dory* once again took the No. 1 spot at the U.S. box office, selling another \$42 million over the holiday weekend, topping the film's 17-day sales total to \$372 million in the U.S. and \$538 million worldwide. That sounds like so much money to me. But in the context of big summer blockbusters in the teens, are these numbers really that impressive? Yeah, I guess they sorta are. *Dory* will probably top the \$700 million mark worldwide, which is still a pretty big deal for the most part. Thus far *Finding Dory* is the second highest-grossing film of the year, behind only *Captain America: Civil War*. Thus far, we've not had anything close to last year's biggest hit, J.J. Abrams' *The Force Awakens* which ended up selling over \$2 billion in tickets (while managing to still be a very good movie).

Also at the Box: Welp, David Yates' *The Legend of Tarzan* didn't do very well at the box office over its first three days of release, selling just \$38 million despite a huge production and marketing budget. I hear the film is remarkably well made, and I've been wondering what was going to become of the *Harry Potter* filmmaker for a couple of years now. Hopefully he gets another shot with a big budget because I think that's the level he should be working at.

Taking the No. 3 spot at last weekend's box office was *The Purge: Election Year* which sold a solid enough \$31 million over its first three days of release. Similar numbers to *Tarzan*, the difference being that one of these films cost \$180 million to produce and

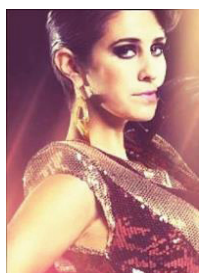

necklace with his name on it. Will buys her a replacement of the favorite garment she has ever owned. Not subtle.

Another particularly blunt bit involves Will's ex-girlfriend marrying his best friend. Louisa and Will attend the wedding for two purposes: to show how miserable Will's life has become and to give Joanna Lumley a cameo as the wise, four-times-married lady.

Spoiler alert from here to the end! Depending on your perspective *You Before Me* is either irritatingly manipulative or true to its convictions. The power of love is not enough to put off death. Will has chosen to die by assisted suicide in Switzerland. Louisa's love and effort do not change his mind.

For all of its stick to the formula moments, it is an odd message for a chick flick to emphasize: that a person in diminished health should be able to choose the way he or she wants to die.

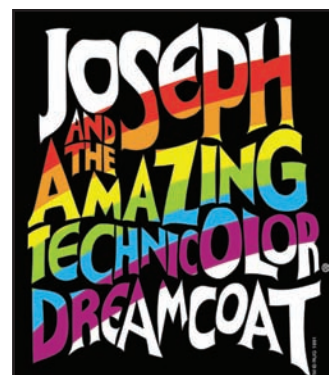
