

First, Peter Frampton comes alive on Sunday, July 31, followed by Joe Walsh just four days later, on Thursday, August 2. Even those who weren't around in the 70s, 80s or 90s should be familiar with these two icons of rock n' roll. Frampton's double live album, Frampton Comes Alive!, is still one of the best selling live albums of all time and was voted "Album of the Year" in Rolling Stones 1976 readers poll. And Walsh headed up a little band called the James Gang before going solo in 1972 and then going on to join another little band, The Eagles, a few years later. Another treat for music fans will be Paul Cebar's appearance at the Foellinger-Freimann Botanical Conservatory on Friday, August 5. What's particularly notable about this show is the fact that Cebar was the very first act to take the Botanical Roots stage when the concert series debut in August 2007. Surviving Rock n' Roll Glory

In 1977, three pop stars vied for space on the covers of teen magazines like Tiger Beat

and Teen magazine: Leif Garrett, Shawn Cassidy and Peter Frampton.

About the only thing Frampton had in common with those young men was his towheaded pulchritude.

While Garrett and Cassidy were native Californians with little discernible musical talent, Frampton was a well-established and wellrespected British rocker who was enjoying the unforeseen fruits of a monster success: a double-disc live set called Frampton Comes Alive! which had just surpassed Carole King's Tapestry to become the bestselling album of all time.

Frampton's time in the limelight was brief. Some blame confusion over Frampton's teen idol appeal. Some blame his decision to star in a critically reviled, big-screen, jukebox musical based on the Beatles' Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band.

Frampton, who performs July 31 at the Foellinger Theatre, blames the pressure he felt to come up with something half as newsworthy and noteworthy as Frampton Comes

"I guess I got very excited," he said in a phone interview. "Everyone was riding the crest of a wave, and it was a very exciting period. But it can have its downside too ...



You're not only a successful album, you're not only a No. 1 album, you're not only a Platinum album many times over ... Now, go follow that one up.

"And that's where the pressure really

came in," Frampton said. "I don't think I was, at that point, ready to go right back in and do the album that then became, I'm in You. That should have been done about

three or four years later. We should have just waited because, people say you're only as good as your last record. 'My last record was the biggest record of all time. I think I'll wait a little bit."

Frampton acknowledges that his career didn't progress precisely as he'd hoped, but he has no major

"I'm still here talking to you," he said. "Frampton Comes Alive! is 40 years old this summer, and I couldn't be more proud of it. We're still talking and I'm still playing around the world to wonderful audi-

"That's something I love to do. playing live," Frampton said. "It's something I am able to do as long as I want to, and that is a very luxurious position to be in. I couldn't be more grateful.'

Of course, being a celebrity musician and being a good musician are sometimes mutually exclusive concepts.

Frampton was a good musician before

A Guitar Player's Guitar Player

Most music aficionados who do not play an instrument know Joe Walsh by his nickname, "the clown prince of rock."

They also know him for such funny, self-deprecating hits as "All Night Long" and "Life's Been Good."

What many of them probably do not know is that Walsh, performing at the Foellinger Theater on August 2, is widely acknowledged as one of the best guitar players in rock music.

Joey Ortega (aka Joey O), a northeast Indiana resident who is widely acknowledged as one of the best guitarists in the Midwest, has been well aware of this for a while.

He remembers watching a DVD of Eric Clapton's 2004 Crossroads Guitar Festival, which featured performances by Robert Cray, Jimmie Vaughan, Jonny Lang, B.B. King, Buddy Guy, John Mayer, Steve Vai and Walsh, among many illustrious others.

"It had all of Clapton's buddies in it," Ortega said. "And Joe Walsh for me was the highlight, and that's saying a lot. When I watched that, my mouth was hanging open:



'Holy (expletive)! Did Joe Walsh just steal the show? Was Joe Walsh the best guitarist there?' He just killed it."

The average person little suspects that Walsh enjoys such a distinction, Ortega said. But another guitar player will "be the first one to tell you that [Walsh] is one of a small handful of guys who can really play," he

Chilly Addams, a longtime local media personality and a bassist in the band Phil's Family Lizard, said Walsh isn't the sort of player who tries to dazzle you with how many notes he can pack into a solo.

"He's not into making it so technically difficult and awesome that people go, 'That was really technically difficult and awesome," he said. "It's more like, 'That was really fun! That sounded great, man!"

"Not a lot of guys express themselves at his level," Ortega said. "Any kid in any little town can play fast, but at the end of the day. that means about as much as talking fast."

Walsh came up at a time, Ortega said, when the better you could play, the cooler

"If you couldn't play, you were David Cassidy," he said. "Nowadays, everybody

he got preposterously famous, and he has improved considerably since fame faded.

His chops are well displayed on his latest album, *Acoustic Classics*, a collection of stripped-down hits and deep cuts.

The idea was to commemorate *Frampton Comes Alive!* in some fashion. But he said he could never do slavish remakes of any of his old material, so he tried a different tack with this.

"I can't go backwards," he said. "I want to go onwards and upwards. What I decided to do was do it acoustically and do it as if you had come over for coffee and I said, 'Hey, I'd like to try this new song out on you that I just wrote last night.' And I get the guitar

and I sit down at the kitchen table and I play it for you."

Releasing an album in 2016 is a different proposition from releasing an album in 1976, Frampton said.

"A lot of people have said what I am about to say," he said, "but you used to go out and tour to promote an album. Now we make an album to promote a tour. It's completely reversed."

The album that eventually outsold *Frampton Comes Alive!* in 1978 was another double disc set: the *Saturday Night Fever* soundtrack.

The double album has since gone the way of the rotary phone, the three-martini lunch and the human attention span.

"You don't need to put out as much stuff at once," Frampton said, "even though I did with this *Acoustic Classics* because I felt that there were songs I knew everyone would want to hear and also songs that maybe didn't see as big a light of day."

From an artist's standpoint, the streamg music economic model is about as far from the double album economic model as canned tuna is from fresh lobster.

"I'll just give you a figure," he said. "An iTunes download was 99 cents; \$1.29 for better quality .. I know people who have had a hit record and it's streamed hundreds and hundreds of thousands of times and their check is \$31. You'd be better off being a vacuum salesman door-to-door than a musician."

The streaming music booster club claims that streaming gives artists massive exposure that they can use to make money elsewhere and in other ways.

But that may not mean much to a serious musician who has never had much interest

in using his music or celebrity to sell skin products or colognes.

Frampton has lived in Nashville for several years and he said many of his friends and friendly acquaintances there have

scaled back their musical aspirations.

"I just know from the songwriters who have had to go back and get day jobs," he said, "and engineers from studios – the same thing. And studios that have closed down. It's quite amazing to think that if it goes on much longer ... people are going to have to go into debt to make records and not get the money back. It's a losing concern."

This year has felt like a particularly pivotal one in the music industry with the passing of such giants as Prince and David Bowie.

The lives and careers of Frampton and Bowie were intertwined since the two were teens

Frampton and Bowie attended a technical high school located in the Bromley sub-

wants to be David Cassidy."

Venerable local DJ Doc West may not be a guitarist, but he has been a sagacious and passionate music devotee longer than Walsh has been a professional musician.

West recalled seeing Walsh perform with the Cleveland-based James Gang in 1969 at a now defunct Columbus venue called the World Theater.

Clapton's band Cream was popular at the time, and the James Gang had whittled itself down to a power trio in a similar vein.

"He was just phenomenal on guitar," West said of Walsh. "I remember thinking

that it was like Ohio had its own Cream."

A year later, West saw the band open for The Who. That was the tour where Pete Townshend first developed his lifelong and oft-expressed love of Walsh's playing.

"Pete Townshend said, 'Hey, we love a band from your parts here called the James Gang," West recalled. "Everyone went nuts. He said, 'You know, they just released an album called *Yer' Album* and we love it. So tonight, we want to be known as Yer' Who."

Ortega believes that even if Walsh had hung up his guitar after leaving the James Gang, his place in the pantheon of great rock axe men would have been assured.

But he didn't hang up his guitar after leaving the James Gang. He went on to a successful solo career and two stints with the Eagles, the second of which led to Walsh's sobriety.

Before that second stint, Walsh was known for partying hard.

In the late 1980s, Ortega recorded at Sound City in Van Nuys, California. He said

he was puzzled by a camper that seemed permanently anchored in the parking lot.

"There were always a lot of nice vehicles, of course," he said. "Maybe I was the only one who didn't have a nice vehicle. And I kept seeing this big-ass camper. I thought, 'Who the hell has this big-ass camper out here?'

"It had this orange extension chord running out of it to the studio," Ortega said. "Turned out it was Joe Walsh. This was back in Joe's party days. They didn't want him driving home and getting arrested, so he just slept out there."

Ortega said Glenn Frey added Walsh to the Eagles because he had a vision for the band and he knew Walsh could fulfill that vision.

"They were successful before Joe Walsh," he said. "They were

a country band. But Glenn Frey wanted to be more of a rock band, and he wanted to be as successful as a rock band."

Walsh's eventual sobriety was greatly helped along in 1993 by fellow Eagles Frey and Don Henley, according to an article in the Washington Post.

West said Walsh's sobriety was made a condition of payment.

"My message is there is life after addiction, and it's really good," Walsh told the Post in 2015 after he'd been sober for 11 years. "If I had known, I'd have stopped earlier."

In Walsh's case, sobriety has one discernable downside, according to Addams.

"The only thing that bums me out about that is that he started wearing blazers," he said. "He wears blazers all the time now. The Eagles turned him into blazer wearer!"

Spreading the Joy Around

Paul Cebar is the kind of artist who's hard to pin down. Is his music R&B laced with blues and jazz? Or does it fall under that large and enticing label "world," influenced by Cuban, Calypso and African beats? Do you, when you listen to one of his records - 1993's

That Unhinged Thing or 2011's Tomorrow Sound Now for Yes Music People, for instance - hear soul mixed with funk and straightup New Orleans dance hall mu-

The answer to all of the above is both a resounding yes and an equally resounding "does it really matter what style he plays when the style sounds this good?"

Cebar will light up the Foellinger-Freimann Botanical Conservatory courtyard Friday August 5 with his band, The Tomorrow Sound, and local openers Kitchen Table Players as part of the Botanical Roots Outdoor Concert series. The Tomorrow Sound are Cebar on vocals and guitar, Bob Jennings on saxophone and keys, Mike Frederickson on bass and Reggie Bordeaux on drums.

Cebar got his start in music as a student of the art form. A native of Milwaukee and for a while a member of the 1970s earnest folk scene there, he eventually moved to Sarasota, Florida to attend New College. It was during this time that he soaked up as much knowledge as he could pertaining to the New Orleans music scene, writing his thesis on the work of Louis Jordan and Buddy Johnson. He was also teaching himself to dance.

"It was a sort of music apprenticeship for me," he said in a recent phone interview. "I was hoping that through scholarship, through studying what was at that time relatively obscure rhythm and blues stuff, the tunes of Jordan and Johnson, I would figure out what kind of music was my kind of music. I thought I might also figure out what kind of man I was. Back then I was your typical frightened-of-dancing-and-makinga-fool-of-myself guy, but I quickly noticed at the outdoor parties we attended then that the people dancing were having the best time. The good time was always had by the people out on the floor.

"I decided to go ahead and dance," he continued. "No one was watching me anyway. They were too busy having their own fun, and through that I basically tricked myself into having more enjoyment in life."

It became his goal to provide the same sort of enjoyment for others. In 1980, he joined a group of like-minded musicians called the R&B Cadets. For six years, he and his mates got audiences in and around the Milwaukee area up on their feet and enjoying themselves by playing a combination of high energy originals and old B-side covers designed for dance

But sometimes dance hall days come to an end, and in 1986, after the Cadets called it quits, Cebar started his own band, Paul Cebar and the Milwaukeeans, which brought together the irresistible, foot-tap-

so strains that had begun to inspire Cebar and transform his ideas about original mu-Milwaukeeans put out several albums, including the aforementioned Unhinged Thing, as well as Upstroke for Downfolk, I

Can't Dance for You, The

jazz and blues with the Ca-

ribbean, African and Calyp-

Get Go and Suchamuch. They also toured widely, performing all over the U.S. and Canada. Despite their growing acclaim and their focus on world beats, they were, deep down, a Wisconsin act.

Cebar explains the unique musical milieu of Milwaukee this way: "It's an underdog town, probably not unlike Fort Wayne is an underdog town. It's not expected to be a hot bed of anything, but at the same time, it's always been a soulful town with a lot of access to music, and there are a few homegrown hit makers that hail from here. I think the main thing is you're out of the glare of the coasts and Nashville and the other music centers. It's the music that matters, not the fame.'

The name can also matter. In the mid-aughts, Cebar rechristened Paul Cebar and the Milwaukeeans "Paul Cebar and the Tomorrow Sound." Several of the band members remained the same. What Cebar hoped to change was the band's image, which the media in their coverage of the group often mislabeled as "old timey" and backward looking.

"I kept seeing stories saying we were 'interpreters of old music,' and things like that," Cebar said. "I thought to myself, 'I've been making original music for 25 years!' It was time to shift the focus forward. We hoped, of course, that the fans who really loved the old name wouldn't be too angry to come out and

Sean McConnell's self-titled debut album on Rounder is just about as comfy as a thing can get, unless that thing is a big, overstuffed feather pillow when you're really sleepy. McConnell has been around for a while, and he's been recording indie-style for more than a decade. This big-label de-



but, though, dispenses with any indie edge that might still be clinging to his music and delivers songs that are as gentle and radio-friendly as can be

The album's tone is set from the start by "Holy Days," a tune that combines Taylor Swift-esque sentimentality about young love with the hook from Philip Philip's "Home" and an irresistible pop-country bounce. In fact, the resemblance to "Home" surfaces again on "Bottom of the Sea," and even if there's an abundance of twang in McConnell's vocal delivery, he's serving up the kind of country music that's palatable even in urban coffee houses up north (in "Queen of Saint Mary's Choir," he even admits he was born in Massachusetts).

It's a very safe kind of country, too. Not once on the album does McConnell sing the praises of God, guns or alcohol, an omission that will keep him from getting his radio-cowboy-club membership card, but will allow his music to run more toward the mainstream. Instead, he sticks to themes of nostalgia and resilience, sweetly self-affirming messages that couldn't possibly offend anyone. (Evan Gillespie)

Alienation

Umberto's Alienation feels like a cross between New Age, a giallo score and a soundtrack to some strange early 80s sci fi film. Previous albums like Confrontation, Night Has a Thousand Screams and Prophecy of the Black Widow all took their cues from the Gothic and dark world of horror films



from guys like Argento, Fulci, and Brava: beautifully shot, provocative nightmares. Each of those albums were these imagined scores to films of Umberto's own making. But with *Alienation* there seems to be a feeling of a fully formed, standalone record. The theme or concept is created solely in the mind of the listener. It's still dark and mysterious, but *Alienation* has more in common with Depeche Mode than Walter Rizzati.

Matt Hill, aka Umberto, has a knack for creating intense mood with the synthesizer. He's obviously filled his head over the years with horror films and, in turn, the music that accompanies these films. That influence has come through quite brightly through the music he creates. Slasher Film Festival Strategy's Christopher Ashley is another creator of nightmare scores for imagined horror/sci filicks. These guys may not have the means to make those films, but they can show us what they'd be like through their music. It seems though Hill wanted to do something different this time around. While Alienation could very well be a soundtrack to some Gothic film, it stands on its own as a singular piece of art. The mood and feel created just for this moment.

Musically this album feels like a late night listen; slow burn rhythms and looming synth patterns create a "walk along the lake by midnight" kind of vibe. "Drifters" feels like the pulse of some underground club in London, while "Black Sea" sounds like some Gothic ritual taking place somewhere in the Middle East. "White Night" is perfect in its simplicity, and the addition of Victoria Gokun's vocals only makes the song even more ethereal. This song also feels very modern in comparison to Umberto's previous work. "Dawn of Mirrors" moves and sways like a ghost you encounter in a long, dark hallway. It's 80s-centric rhythm track only enhances the vibe. "Awakenings" is a stunning work of classic Gothic horror and 60s melancholy. With it's woodwind opening and haunting harmonies that accompany it, this song has a deja vu feel. It takes you somewhere familiar, but you just can't put your finger on it. This could be the music to an opening credit sequence in a movie you find channel surfing late some summer night. The music alone makes you stop and watch. A truly great track. "Passage" closes the album out with a

Grand Hotel (1973)

The sixth album from English prog-rockers was one of the first 8-track tapes that I purchased (at a garage sale for 25¢ in 1980). Beyond their 1967 hit A Whiter Shade of Pale, these guys had a lot in them musically. This release is still one of my favorites.



The title track opens the record with a folksy piano and the crisp vocals from Gary Brooker. A beautiful arrangement, it carries on in the same vein as Moody Blues, yet has its own identity and is a little heavier. "Toujours l'amour" brings on a heavier vibe as well, with a strong organ component, a guitar bridge and thicker drumming. "A Rum Tale" brings back the Brit-folk, and the tasty "TV Caeser" (and its string arrangement) close the first side of a really good record.

Side two opens with "A Souvenir of London" and its practically bluegrass sound. Sometimes Procol Harum remind me of The Band, and I don't think that insults either band. "Bringing Home the Bacon" has a pop sensibility to it and whirls around like a cross between Big Star and something from the New Wave 80s. "For Liquorice John" sounds like something from 1973, but could be from '63 or even '83. They were able to spread themselves around very well, and I think their stuff is noteworthy even today.

"Fires (Which Burnt Brightly)" is poetic, and almost too pretty for this album, but they close on a high note with the spirited "Robert's Box."

This really is my favorite Procol Harum record and would be a nice addition to someone wanting some artsy prog-rock in their collection. They did release a record in the 90s (after a 14-year break) and occasionally tour in Europe playing smaller venues.

urb of London where Frampton's father was an art teacher. Frampton sat in on jam sessions with Bowie and his mates during which they performed the music of such American rockers as Buddy Holly and the Everly Brothers.

Bowie was still called David Jones at the time.

"David was already in a local band called The Konrads, and I'd seen him play, and he was already a mentor of mine right from the off – 'I want to be like him,'" Frampton recalled. "So even though we were only three years apart, he was already someone I was looking up to. He was already singing like Elvis and playing sax as well."

Bowie went on to open for Frampton's band Humble Pie.

When Frampton's career took a nosedive in the early 1980s, Bowie invited him to join his band. Frampton's stint as Bowie's guitarist reminded people of his virtuosity on that instrument.

"With the 'Glass Spider' tour, he could have chosen any guitar player he wanted, and he chose me," Frampton said. "We'd always wanted to play together on the same stage at the same time. It was a wonderful gift. He took me around the world and introduced me as the guitar player. It was incredible."

Being known as a guitar player is all Frampton has ever really wanted.

"I just want to play something on the guitar today that I couldn't play yesterday," he said. "It's just always been about the guitar for me. I'm so lucky that passion reinvents itself. That is something that I have always been so thankful for, that my first addiction is still with me and it's roaring right now."





Hatebreed have established themselves as road dogs over the years, relentlessly touring to promote every album they have put out over their 22-year career. The Connecticut band just released *Concrete Confessional*, their first new album in three years, and, of

I'd expect more dates for both Hatebreed and Devildriver hitting tertiary markets like our own to be announced in a couple of months.

Probably my favorite guitar instrumental album of all time is **Steve Vai**'s *Passion and Warfare*. That's why I was excited to hear the news that Vai is planning celebrating the 25th anniversary of its release by playing multiple cuts from the album on his next tour. A VIP experience with a Q & A session and the usual meet and greet privileges are available for fans wanting such a thing when Vai visits Cleveland October 25 and Grand Rapids October 28.

Is it a marketing ploy or is she for real? While she continues to fight legal battles with her former producer Dr. Luke, pop star **Kesha** decided to go on a brief tour "purely for the love of rock n' roll and my soul," according to her press release. Appearing as Kesha and The Creepies, Kesha says she will play songs her fans have never heard her play before and probably will never hear again. She continues to lay it on thick when she says that "this project and upcoming tour comes from my deep eternal love of dirty rock n' roll and country music. I thrive from making and performing music, and much like a flower with no sun, my soul slowly dies when I don't get to create and perform. So, for a short ride and in mostly small intimate venues, I will be performing a new creepy creation. It's been too long. Until I can release my own music, I will be reinventing some of my old songs and some of my favorite songs from my musical idols. The time has come to get creepy." Take advantage of this unique chance to see a huge pop star in small venues when Kesha and The Creepies visit Cleveland August 9, Grand Rapids August 13 and Cincinnati August 16.

In what is likely to be a step up from Kesha and The Creepies, **Elvis Costello and The Imposters** have announced a few more dates for their fall tour. Costello's band now features two original members of his former band, **The Attractions**. The shows will revolve around Costello's 1982 album *Imperial Bedroom*, and Costello plans to dust off a few other oldies as well when he drops by Chicago October 29 and Ann Arbor the following night.



Why Not More Women Roles?

Summer is slipping away fast, and in just a few weeks the serious Oscar contending films will start coming out. Just this past weekend five films earned more than \$20 million dollars. That doesn't happen very often.

Three of them are new releases: Star Trek Beyond, Lights Out and Ice Age: Collision Course. Two are holdovers, The Secret Lives of Pets and Ghostbusters.

I reviewed *Ghostbusters* last week, but I want to mention it again and recommend it. The haters are no longer limited to fans of the original who just can't bear the idea of women being cast in the reboot. There was plenty of that kind of noise since the moment the project was announced.

Leslie Jones, the black ghostbuster, felt compelled to drop her Twitter account for some days because she was getting such racist rants from people. In the movie

when she stage dives and lands on the ground, she asks, "Is it a woman thing or a black thing?"

It is probably a little bit of both, but she is very funny in the film. She holds her own with Melissa McCarthy, Kate McKinnon and Kristen Wiig, not inexperienced comediennes. She is also the only non-scientist in the film, but she's not stuck in a sidekick

role. She is front and center and has as much knowledge and common sense as any character in the film.

And the ensemble works. These ladies are funny. They aren't afraid to shoot some guns, run their own business and fight back against ghosts and politicians. They share genuine friendships and don't get caught up in jealousies or argue over men. They aren't looking for the perfect man to settle down with.

Recent studies still point to the fact that women

account for only about 30 percent of speaking roles in big studio releases. Take the top 10 movies in the country this week. There are real live women in *Ghostbusters*. There is a female blue fish in *Finding Dory*, which took years to make and has now gone on to be the highest grossing animated film domestically. A third movie starring a woman is *Hilary's America*, a rant from conservative pundit Dinesh D'Souza. There is also a little raunchiness for the ladies with Aubrey Plaza and Anna Kendrick making trouble in *Mike and Dave Need Wedding Dates*.

The movie industry is driven by movies for boys and kids. Why not more women? There are plenty of sequels and reboots, just not that many for the ladies. As late as 2009, Dan Ackroyd was talking about making another *Ghostbusters*. The film was going to include the old guys and some hot young women to cover with slime.

In the reboot, Chris Hemsworth is on hand as the dim boy candy, and he is funny. Soon he will be back on screen in something as silly and hunky as *Thor*. In the meantime, seeing him play against type is amusing.

Looking ahead, there are some summer movies to look forward to. I am always up for a Bourne movie.

Tops at the Box: As was very much expected, Justin Lin's *Star Trek Beyond* took the No. 1 spot at the U.S. box office last weekend, selling just under \$60 million over its first three days of domestic release. Internationally, the film has already made about \$90 million. Reviews are mixed but, from what I've heard so far, audience satisfaction is high. The cast is stellar, as usual, and the director seems suited for the job. Looks like a good enough flick. No *The Force Awakens*, but probably very fun.

Also at the Box: The Secret Life of Pets also continued to go strong, selling another \$29.3 million last weekend, upping the \$75 million film's 17-day international sales total to a whopping \$323 million. Chris Renaud is the king. And Louis C.K. as the lead voice? Are you kidding me.

Taking the No. 3 spot at last weekend's U.S. box office was director Paul Feig's *Ghostbusters* reboot, starring Melissa McCarthy, Kristen Wiig, Leslie Jones, Chris Hemsworth, Omar Little and, in a breakout role, Kate McKinnon. The film sold another \$21.6 million, bringing its 10-day sales total to \$87 million in the U.S. and \$123 million worldwide. Not the major hit Sony had hoped for, but not a flop either. I saw the film and thought it was a perfectly satisfying summer trip to the movies. McKinnon, in particular, was great.

Coming in at No. 4 last weekend was newbie *Lights Out* which sold just a few bucks less than the Feig flick. Look for this low-budget horror flick to be

Rounding out last weekend's Top 5 was *Ice Age: Collision Course* which sold an embarrassingly low \$21 million over its first three days of release. Oof. Not great. I've never been sold on the Hollywood theory that people want to watch movies set in the frozen tundra during the hottest part of the summer. The box office results of such films have my back.

New This Week: Here comes my dude Jason Bourne in *Jason Bourne*. Matt Damon and Paul Greengrass are back for their third Bourne film together (fourth Bourne film overall), and this one looks like a truly great action film to me. It almost feels as if Greengrass and Damon are relishing the creative freedom they've been given and really running with it. I expect greatness from this film. I'd love to see it do huge summer numbers, as it's so rare that a movie I love turns into a sensation or whatever.

Also out are comedy *Bad Moms* and thriller *Nerve*. Both look perfectly fine to me. But if you go to one movie this weekend, I'd say maybe just go see the Bourne flick. You know it's gonna be fun.





They weren't. They aren't. The crowds still flock, and Cebar, who hosts his own radio show on Milwaukee's WMSE and can often be found touring with fellow Wisconsin singer-songwriters Peter Mulvey and Willy Porter, is busier than ever. Not only are he and the Tomorrow Sound working on recording a new album, but, in celebration of the Cadet's 30th anniversary, he's been reuniting sporadically with his former bandmates from that era, playing dance music and taking a nice stroll down memory lane. At this point in his life, three decades into his calling as a musician, he has the enviable chance to revisit key artistic periods he went through as a younger man – that of folk singer-songwriter, dance hall musician, and frontman

and bandleader.

"This sort of stuff, revisiting your past, is actually a good way to keep yourself fresh," he said. "There's a mystery to what your music ends up sounding like after a long career. Hopefully you end up with some kind of version of something that has a vital, big heart in it. I think I've been doing that."

Cebar is loving all of it. It's like he said: it's the music that matters, not the fame. And certainly not the labels.

"Sometimes the best thing you'll ever hear is being played in a tiny corner of a tiny bar in a place most people have never heard of. Have you noticed that? I certainly have."
