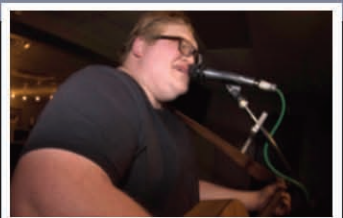

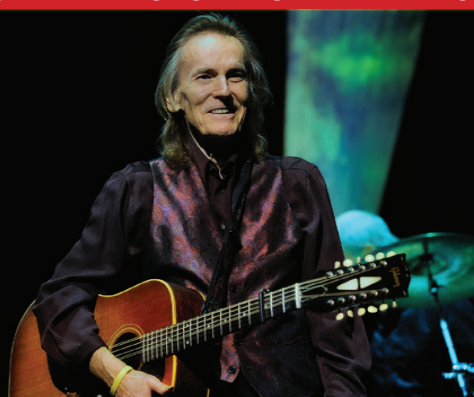

# Celebration of Inclusion

If you traveled back in time about two decades and told people that an LGBT pride festival in Fort Wayne would one day draw more than 10,000 attendees, they'd call you delusional.

Even the originators of Fort Wayne Pride probably never dreamed it would be as successful and widely welcomed in largely conservative Indiana as it has become.

"I have seen this shift about how Pride is perceived in the community," said Nikki Fultz, director of Fort Wayne Pride. "People are more willing to sponsor, more willing to help promote it and more willing to attend. It's been a national shift as well, but also it's the community itself. A larger crowd has been embracing what we're doing and that's been nice to see."

This year's edition of the festival happens July 21 and 22 in Headwaters Park.

Fort Wayne Pride has outgrown its tentative, apprehensive beginnings to become one of Fort Wayne's premier summer festivals.

It not only attracts a multifarious and multifaceted collection of celebrants and supporters, but it attracts nationally recognized talent to its stage.

Featured acts this year include Colorado alt-folk trio Edison which features Maxwell Hughes, formerly of The Lumineers.

For many years, Edison were a duo consisting of Sarah Slaton and Dustin Morris. Hughes joined in 2015 because, as he told the Albuquerque Journal, he "was drawn to the sound they were creating."

"When we came together, we were on the same page," he said. "It's been interesting to see how the band has grown ... I'm having fun being part of this trio, and being on the road again is fulfilling."

"[Lead singer Slaton has] just got a powerful voice, haunting in a lot of different ways," Hughes told the Amarillo Globe-News. "It's just beautiful, beautiful to listen to."

Slaton told Denver Westworld that Counting Crows and Death Cab for Cutie

are two of her main songwriting influences.

The band's songs are often inspired by the evocative and widely divergent locales they encounter on tours, she said.

"We all quit our jobs and took a van around the country," Slaton said. "We would stop to write in different places."

"Back & Forth" was written on a dock on the Chesapeake, and you can hear that

of the 22nd is soulful singer-songwriter Johnathan Celestin.

In an interview with the Davis Enterprise, Celestin described his sound as "edgy, pop, rock; a little bit of everything."

Influences cited by Celestin include Lauryn Hill, Stevie Wonder, Donnie Hathaway, Sam Cooke, Allman Brothers, Eric Clapton and Bob Marley.

"My musical style is pretty open right now," he told PrideSource magazine. "It's very R&B-pop, very visceral of all music, honest, vocal heavy. My music for the most part showcases my vocals. But I'm actually looking to open up my palette in terms of the type of music I'm doing. My new single, which is coming out in a month or so, is called 'Quicksand.' It has small elements of EDM (electronic dance music) in it. I'm trying to fuse more sounds together."

Like Edison, Celestin said he draws songwriting inspiration from his surroundings.

"I live life and then I experience things, then I try to write about it," he told the University of North Georgia Vanguard.

Celestin said his music illuminates and celebrates marginalized voices. He loves playing Pride festivals, he said.

"It's always big energy and lots of love," he said. "I think a lot of times people come to Prides to celebrate."

It's a celebration and that's important, but a large part of my show is that I aim to impart to people a message of

encouragement. There are a lot of people going through a lot of things, so I try to make sure while I'm there I impart some kind of encouragement. I want to leave people with that. I want people to remember how I made them feel."

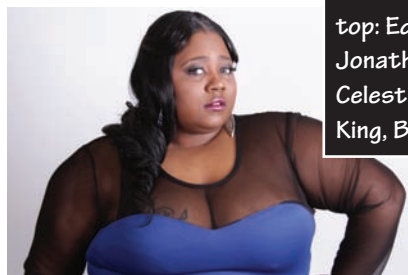
Celestin said he wants his music to empower the listener.

"Within the LGBT community," he said, "where suicide and drug use are disproportionately high, Pride festivals are not only perfect opportunities for celebration, but also perfect spaces for uplifting and fortifying queer communities with self-worth, value and love."

Other national acts performing at Fort Wayne Pride this year are self-described "one-woman looper band" Kristen Ford,

sway in the rhythm that the water brought out," Slaton told The Country Scene website. "On the other end, you have 'Water in the Well.'"

That was written out in the desert and brings space and loneliness into the song that was stirred from the feeling of being out there."

Asked by the Sound Dessert website what the band's "we made it" moment would look like, Slaton responded that there are many such moments.

"I personally think you continuously hit those moments," she said, "because there's always room for improvement. 'We've made it' by having the opportunity to travel and play our music, but we continue to work hard and look to build a sustainable career long-term."

# A Beauty-ful 90th Season

Fort Wayne is lucky to have a remarkable and thriving theater community, one driven by the love and passions of many who volunteer countless hours to rehearsals and performances for the sheer joy of performing. The fact that many of these theaters have been busy for decades speaks to the dedication the community has shown in supporting them. It's that spirit of commitment that has brought the Fort Wayne Civic Theatre to this 2017-18 season in which they celebrate 90 years of history.

But it's not all history, as the Civic still has plenty to look forward to. And based on the schedule they've put together to commemorate this milestone, so does their audience. Having closed their 2016-17 with the very popular *The Little Mermaid*, this season's opening act – *Disney's Beauty and the Beast* – is a solid choice.

"We have a process for making the scheduling decisions," says Phillip Colglazier, executive director of Fort Wayne Civic Theatre. "We have a committee with board members, staff members and some past board members as well. When we're looking at the season, we look at the size of the show as well as the placement in the schedule. Our summer show is always something that's family-friendly and can be a larger show with a bigger cast because many of the younger actors are home from college. We thought [*The Little Mermaid*] would be a success and wanted to build on that success with *Beauty and the Beast*. We were planning all of this before the new film came out, of course, but there's always an audience for *Beauty and the Beast*."

*Beauty and the Beast*, which runs from July 22-August 6, is a popular choice for families particularly, and there are a few ways to add to the family fun. The Sunday, July 30 matinee will be preceded by a special Brunch with Belle which begins at noon.

The Civic has staged *Beauty and the Beast* in the past, but the second show of its season is something new for the theater: *Jekyll & Hyde*, the musical which inspired a cult of fans who called themselves Jekies. The music and lyrics of Frank Wildhorn and Leslie Bicusse, respectively, provide greater intensity to the familiar Robert Louis Stevenson tale of good versus evil. The running dates, September 8-17, also helps us transition to another season.

"We'll be heading into Halloween season by then, so it's good to have a spookier story in that slot," says Colglazier. "We like to have some balance in what we offer, so this is a very different sort of show than *Beauty and the Beast*. This is something we've never done before, so we like to offer something new to the community."

By early November, Halloween will once again be a memory and thoughts will

isn't that everyone?

"Barbra Streisand famously has a basement filled with all of these treasures, and the story of *Buyer & Cellar* is about this man who gets a job working in her basement, which is like a mall. He eventually meets her and then begins to ponder fame and his relationship to her. It's really hilarious but also very sentimental."

Rounding out the 90th anniversary celebration is *A Tribute to Rodgers & Hammerstein and Andrew Lloyd Webber*, a collaboration with the Fort Wayne Philharmonic staged at the Historic Embassy Theatre. It's a fitting finale for the season.

"We're very excited about this show and really wanted to finish the season with a bang," says Colglazier. "This will be the first time we've collaborated with the Philharmonic in 26 years and, of course, having it at the Embassy is very special. We'll have appearances

by Manna Nichols, who was recently in *Allegiance*, and Christopher Sloan, who was in the cast of *Cabaret* when it came to the Embassy awhile back. And of course, we're excited to work with Andrew Constantine with the Philharmonic. The first act of the evening will be the music of Rodgers & Hammerstein; then the second act will be the music of Andrew Lloyd Webber. When we were planning this 90th anniversary, we wanted to highlight all different realms of what we do, and this collaboration to close the season made perfect sense."

In addition to this schedule, the Civic will also host their annual fundraiser, *Celebrities Act Up*, a parody (written and directed by Colglazier) which allows local celebrities and business and community leaders to show their sillier sides. Colglazier promises some fun spoof of classic shows like *The Golden Girls*, *All in the Family* and *The Jeffersons*. *Celebrities Act Up* takes place on Saturday, October 14.

With the 90th season upon him, Colglazier is even looking ahead to 100.

"We do plan to launch an endowment campaign which we hope will raise \$1 million by our 100th anniversary. The Civic's history can be seen on our website, including our first season in 1927-28. We were the first tenant in our home here at the Arts United Center 44 years ago, so we invite people to learn more about our history in this community."



begin to turn toward Christmas, which makes the next show in their schedule particularly timely.

"*White Christmas* is a show we've had great success with in the past, and placed right before Thanksgiving like it is, the timing is perfect. Our holiday shows are always popular, and we have a lot of corporations who buy tickets to bring their employees so they can plan their holiday celebrations with that show."

February 17-March 4 will see another Civic debut, *La Cage Aux Folles*, something Colglazier says has been considered for some time.

"We've gone back and forth on this for some time, but it finally feels like this is the right time. Of course, the story is a classic – the French films and then *The Birdcage* with Robin Williams and Nathan Lane were all very popular. The storyline has really become very mainstream. Time have changed, and I think we're ready to share this story because the message is really very universal: families supporting one another."

The fifth show of the season, *Buyer & Cellar*, is a complete change of pace from the previous four – a one-man show staged at the ArtsLab black box theatre at the Auer Center across the street from the Civic's usual home at the Arts United Center. The show, which will star Civic favorite A.J. Lorenzini, is a quirky story which will appeal to anyone with a great love for Barbra Streisand. And

# A Big-Hearted Voice

Not often do you find yourself standing in front of someone who you can instantly feel would be a good person to know, a "one piece of advice from them and it changes your whole outlook on life" kind of person.

When that someone is in a basement full of friends, belting out songs that are familiar yet yearningly original with everyone around you singing along, that feeling intensifies. And when you get so caught up in the moment that you don't realize the person isn't using a microphone or an amp to fill the dingy, dirt-floor room with modern folk music that makes you long for a time decades before you were even born, you know you've found someone special.

Ryan Kerr is a musician who can make you feel like that. Though he's from North Manchester, he can be found playing shows in Fort Wayne anywhere from actual music venues to someone's living room or porch. His folk-punk, Americana music is decidedly Midwestern, but bigger than that.

Kerr, a big guy, not only in stature but also in presence, voice and heart – has been heavily influenced by family.

"Raising children has changed songwriting for me, and continues to. I think my perspective on things has just broadened a bit over the last 10 years of being a father, and now I'm mindful of a legacy for my kids," said Kerr via email.

Kerr's solo music has changed a lot from the beginning.

"Through middle school and high school I was in a few different punk bands. My family moved around a lot, so sticking with one band was really difficult, and by the time I was a senior I was writing solo acoustic stuff. At first the project was a complete joke. I wrote story songs inspired by westerns I was watching at the time. I played a show at a local coffeehouse because they needed another act on the bill, and I ended having a lot of fun. That was when I realized that being a solo musician on a bill with a bunch of bands was exciting. I started writing songs that weren't jokes and playing shows while standing up and moving around with folks in the audience. I didn't know anybody in northern Indiana, so I just started booking shows at every coffeehouse and bar that would have me," he said.

Young acts tend to have a rough start quality-wise, but the friends you make when starting out can last a lifetime.

"They were terrible shows, but I started making friends with some bands that would ask me to come play bills with them. It took awhile, but the solo sets on full-band billings started to make sense. Since 2011, I've toured as much as being a father and holding down a full time job will allow. Booking is a lot

easier now because I have friends and know folks all over this half of the country. It's still funny to watch scene kids get bummed when they see me get out of the van with an acoustic guitar and suspenders, but I try my best to give everyone at every show the best performance I can. Oftentimes they end up buying some music from me or coming out to see me the next time I'm in town," said Kerr.

Kerr is no stranger to touring or to playing actual music venues, but intimacy is where he feels the most at ease.



"I love house shows. There is something really special about being invited into somebody's home or onto their property to play music for them and their friends. They also work really well for solo sets because I don't have to worry about a microphone and can just have fun with good people," he said. There's definitely a charm to not being reliant on electricity or certain equipment to sound good, or to make sound at all, especially in the current world

of computer-based instruments and highly processed musical output.

Recently, during a concert for 60,000-plus people in Germany, the power went out on Green Day mid-song. With some quick thinking (and their already electrically catchy songs) the show went on with a lone guitar ringing out and the air filled with voices. What does this have to do with Ryan Kerr? The audience singing there in that field and an audience sitting in a living room watching Kerr are feeling the same thing: camaraderie.

Camaraderie usually takes time to form. Through experience it grows and strengthens. But when you watch someone play songs that spilled out of them through an open valve located behind the ribs, in the middle of the lungs, it makes it something more than just music or more than just a show to pass the time. You can find camaraderie like this at a lot of punk shows, but you can also find it a Ryan Kerr show, and that's a distinctive, special thing.

If you threw some distorted power chords behind Kerr's vocals, you'd have one of the best working-class punk bands in the area. If you had a grand piano and a violin sitting in a high-ceilinged hall, you'd have a beautiful soundtrack to a film like *No Country for Old Men*. With his mostly rhythmic acoustic guitar and without a lot of melody, Kerr stands out among singer-songwriters in northeast Indiana for his punk ethos.

Though you'll most likely find Kerr strapped to his Godin Seagull guitar with his face a little flushed from singing across a room, whatever its size, when he's amplified it's even better. When accompanied by Robert Lugo, Ian Skeans and Aaron Bushong, who

## Cheap Trick

### *We're All Alright!*

With a title taken from the band's most famous song, Cheap Trick's new album would seem to be pandering to the nostalgia vote, but there's more to *We're All Alright!* than the typical early-career rehashing pumped out by many an over-the-hill band. Cheap Trick have been working steadily over the past four decades, and this new album is part of a continuum that has kept them in good musical shape for all these years.

Indeed, sometimes on the album the band seems to forget what it was all about in the 70s and 80s. Heavy rocking songs like "You Got It Going On" and "Long Time Coming" have vocalist Robin Zander growling like the frontman of an 80s metal band and playing it straighter than he did in the old days. "Lolita," on the other hand, steps dangerously close to New Wave, and "Brand New Name on an Old Tattoo" is 100 percent an 80s hair-band jam. On the bland "She's Alright," Zander unwisely tries out a Bob Dylan impression (and the song's title adopts the same misspelling as that in the album title).

The appeal of Cheap Trick has always been the band's heavy-duty rock chops in combination with a sense of humor and musical quirkiness. Fortunately, those strengths emerge on the comfortably punk "Nowhere" and the infectiously energetic "Radio Lover." That same energy kicks through "Listen to Me," and the momentum of these tracks is enough to propel *We're All Alright!* through its slower moments. (Evan Gillespie)

## Ulrich Schnauss & Thorsten Quaeschning

### *Synthwaves*

Ulrich Schnauss is a busy guy. Not only has he released an excellent album already this year (*Passage* with fellow synth aficionado and Causa Sui guitarist Jonas Munk), but he's also readying a new Tangerine Dream album called *Quantum Gate*, which marks the final concepts of TD founder Edgar Froese (who passed away in early 2015) and a new beginning for the Berlin School masters. You'd think that would be plenty for the year, but Schnauss seems constantly abuzz with ideas and creativity. He's teamed up with Tangerine Dream bandmate Thorsten Quaeschning, and the two have made an album filled with analog synth heaven called *Synthwaves*. It's a testament to the golden age of analog sounds and hazy oscillation that komische music gave us in the 70s. It's also a bit of a tribute to the mentor both Schnauss and Quaeschning had in Froese. The record is a heady sonic trip into the past, while keeping eyes firmly pointed to the future.

"Main Theme" feels like a proper announcement to the world of *Synthwaves*. It blankets you in a warm sea of analog waves and melodic early 80s pop hooks. This track could have easily soundtracked a lost Michael Mann film. It's the kind of song that grabs you immediately and doesn't let go. "Rain on Dry Concrete" can't help but feel like Tangerine Dream. TD is in Quaeschning & Schnauss' DNA. It puts me in mind of *Le Parc* with its bright synth structures and arpeggiated sounds. "Slow Life" crumbles into a beautiful abyss. It's crystalline sounds and nearly 8-minute run time create an epic listen. Through headphones "Slow Life" becomes a hypnotic tome, prone to pull you from your existence and carry you into some other ethereal world. Likewise, "Cats and Dogs" paints an aural universe with oscillation and LFO frequencies. It's playful and all-encompassing. "A Calm But Steady Flow" sounds like robotic resonance in a metallic cavern, some kind of AI call from the center of a synthetic world. You can almost touch the square waves in the air.

Elsewhere, "Thirst" recalls classic TD in the form of their *Three O'Clock High* score, while "Flare" has an ominous depth to it, like staring with your toes dangling into some great unknown. "Prism" casts off into the great unknown, not really sure what will be caught. That's the beauty of it, though. The unknown. Something just beyond the horizon.

That's truly the beauty of *Synthwaves*. It's an album of musical

## The Dream Syndicate

*The Days of Wine and Roses* (1982)

Los Angeles gave us The Dream Syndicate, an early 80s band that flew under the radar behind groups like X and The Red Hot Chili Peppers. Even MTV found them to be too "underground." This, their first full-length record, is one of my favorite albums released during the advent of alternative rock.

The record kicks off with "Tell Me When It's Over," a guitar-driven number that reminds me of later Lou Reed with late 70s Television. And if you are a fan of Pavement (or Iggy Pop), this band is right for you. "That's What You Always Say" has shades of some of Nirvana's mellower stuff, but still has a twangy Husker Dü/R.E.M. feel to it. "Then She Remembers" has a post-punk feel to it, but with better guitars and percussion. Side one closes with the epic "Halloween," a six-minute jam that reminds me of some of the European bands from the same era like Echo & the Bunnymen or The Psychedelic Furs.

Side two continues the psychedelic groove with "When You Smile," a number that balances distortion with Goth and is one of the CD's darker tunes. On "Until Lately" The Dream Syndicate experiment with an even murkier sound; the guitars in this one are left over from some of the stuff that Reed's Velvet Underground produced in the decade before. The closer is the title track, a tenacious number that closes a record with some of the best lyrics and guitars from one of the best records of 1982.

The band went on to record just three more albums and broke up in 1989, but have announced a possible new release in 2017. Check these guys out for textbook, alt-rock music from the 80s. (Dennis Donahue)

## Imagine Dragons

*Evolve*

Into every generation a band is born, a band that drops a couple of monster singles, fills stadiums shockingly early on and fades back into the fog within a decade, to emerge on the "Where Are They Now?" lists 20 years later. *Evolve* is Imagine Dragons' effort not to be that band. Now half a decade and three albums into their career, the Las Vegas band is shooting for a sound that's still relevant in 2017. The album is something of a musical reinvention that, unfortunately, makes the band much less remarkable than it used to be, not more.

Through their first two albums, Imagine Dragons churned out brooding rockers that, although monotonous, had an ominous edge that demanded attention. Most of the songs on *Evolve* maintain the familiar plodding rhythms of the band's earlier work, but they're watered-down versions that are better suited to the radio than to stadiums.

"I Don't Know Why" trades the heavier aspects of the band's previous albums for synthpop with very little edge at all. "Whatever It Takes" wraps a pop chorus with the mélange of hip-hop, reggae, and R&B that's ubiquitous on the radio. "Walking the Wire" is a mid-tempo love anthem that could be a chart hit, but good luck remembering who recorded it; it's so homogenous that it could have been produced by robots in a factory somewhere.

That's the problem with *Evolve*. Its songs are the stuff of chart hits and downloads, and they may even get the youngsters swaying at concerts. They're not the stuff that makes a band memorable, though. On "Rise Up," lead vocalist Dan Reynolds sings, "The more I reach, the more I fade away." Alas, he may have encapsulated the band's fate in a single line. (Evan Gillespie)

make up his live band, something exceptional happens.

Lugo plays bass and does backing vocals. He also engineered, mixed and mastered Kerr's superb full-length record, *Live Well*.

"That came out in February of 2016. That record has a lot of full band songs on it, but I wasn't playing with a band at the time. I had a lot of friends that were in other bands and were super helpful and excited to come into the studio and play parts for me," said Kerr.

Skeans plays lead guitar and also recorded a split EP with Kerr back in 2013 while Bushong plays drums. Each musician is talented, and together they truly create something special: one of the best sound-

ing live shows Fort Wayne has to offer from a local artist.

Kerr is currently recording songs for a future record and a compilation.

"We're finishing up the tracking for a song that has been in the works for a little while. That will be on a project that a couple other Midwest acts are involved with, and I'm really stoked.

"Then the plan is to get in the studio and start tracking the next record. I couldn't be more excited to put a record out with this group of guys. They're all great friends and great players. It'll be my first album that is recorded with an actual band that I'm playing shows with and are a major part of the writing process," said Kerr.

For the third straight year, Fort Wayne Parks and Pacific Coast Concerts have brought us an amazing concert lineup at Foellinger Theatre. Just this year we have seen **ZZ Top**, **Kansas**, **Chicago**, **Blue Oyster Cult**, **Mark Farner** and **Christopher Cross**. That would be enough most years but still on the docket are **Diana Ross** on July 16, **Barenaked Ladies** on July 23, **Gordon Lightfoot** on August 1, **The Beach Boys** on August 3, **Aretha Franklin** on August 12, **The Happy Together Tour** on August 23, **Ted Nugent** on August 24 and **Steve Miller Band** on September 20. For sure, the show I'm most looking forward to seeing is Steve Miller Band. I missed them the last time they were in town, and all I heard from people that were able to go was how great a show it was. I've also heard that it was not only a great show visually, but it might have been the best sounding show ever presented at Foellinger Theatre. Ever. That's a good enough endorsement for me. Count me in September 20 as well as most of the other shows as well, schedule permitting.

So, did anyone notice members of **Nickelback** roaming around the city just before they set off on their world tour that was supposed to begin in Indianapolis on June 23? Apparently the band was in town for quite a stay while secretly rehearsing at the Memorial Coliseum. The tour didn't get off to a great start, as flooding at Klipsch Music Center north of Indy caused the venue to postpone the concert. The Feed the Machine Tour now stops at the outdoor shed near the Circle City on August 15. **Daughtry** and **Shaman's Harvest** are still scheduled to open the show.

It's a bit outside of our usual coverage area, but it's big enough that it's something rock fans should be excited about. It's Louder Than Life in Louisville, Kentucky, just four hours away, and its taking place September 30-October 1. **Ozzy Osbourne** headlines the two-day festival with **Rob Zombie**, **Prophets of Rage**, **Five Finger Death Punch**, **Incubus**, **Rise Against**, **Stone Sour**, **Halestorm** and about 30 other bands. If you've ever been to a Danny Wimmer show (Rock on The Range, Chicago Open Air), they don't vary a whole lot, so you'll likely know what to expect.

Since we went there, another festival is brewing in Louisville for September 23-24. This is also a Wimmer show, but it is a little different. Touted as the perfect blend of bourbon, food and music, The Bourbon and Beyond Festival features more of a classic rock and blues lineup rather than the metal lineup we have come to expect from Wimmer shows. **Steve Miller Band** and **Eddie Vedder** headline the first night's festivities while **Stevie Nicks** and **Joe Bonamassa** cap off the celebration of booze the following night. Also set to appear are **Buddy Guy**, **Chris Robinson Band**, **Band of Horses**, **Kenny Wayne Shepherd**, **Trombone Shorty** and about 20 other acts.

# Plenty of Food for Thought

Again this week I am writing about a film that will probably be out of town by the time this is published. I apologize, but the opportunity to see Salma Hayek and John Lithgow spar seemed the best chance to be wowed at the movies this week. *Beatriz at Dinner* is a wonderful clash of two worlds with a provocative ending — actually two provocative endings.

In recent years, Hayek has done a lot of voice work, supporting roles, short films and special projects. She is Beatriz in *Beatriz at Dinner* and is the star of the show.

It is delightful to see her at the center of a film. This is not a typical star turn, though. She wears no make-up and sports a sloppy haircut with especially awful bangs. For most of the film she wears work clothes and sneakers. But her magnetic star quality is not dimmed.

Beatriz, a healer practicing massage and other restorative disciplines in the sprawl of Los Angeles, works at a cancer treatment center and also has a private practice. Since she was young she has been able to feel the suffering and pain of others when she touches them.

When the movie begins, she is in terrible pain. Her neighbor has killed one of her pet goats. This is not a typical starting point for any movie, but we have already been shown that as a girl Beatriz lived a very different life. She grew up in Mexico in a rural bayou-like setting, replete with water, a mangrove forest and a deep appreciation of non-human creatures.

After a day at the cancer center, she braves rush hour traffic to travel to a gated community in Newport Beach to give a massage to a longtime client, Kathy (Connie Britton). Kathy needs a massage as preparation for the dinner party she is throwing.

At the end of the massage, Beatriz's car won't start. Kathy, who wants to be understanding and is grateful for all the help Beatriz has given to her fam-

ily, invites Beatriz to join the party for dinner since Beatriz's friend can't come and fix the car until he's finished work.

The party is to celebrate the successful deal over land that will support Kathy's husband's next project, a shopping center. Beatriz protests, saying she could just wait in her car, but Kathy insists. Kathy's husband Grant (David Warshofsky) isn't enthusiastic, saying Beatriz could just have some food in the TV room. Again, Kathy insists.

As the guests arrive, the enormous wealth and cultural gap between Beatriz and the guests is painfully clear. First to arrive are Shannon and Alex (Chloe Sevigny and Jay Duplass). Alex is the lawyer who just pushed the deal through the legislature. They are thrilled that this deal is going to make them very rich.

The money man, a celebrated billionaire, Doug Strutt (and strut he does), arrives with his third wife, and the party is set. John Lithgow makes a perfect privileged, entitled master of the universe. He thinks he exudes charm, and he does in a superficial way, but he is also arrogant and rude, and his ego knows no bounds.

Everyone at the party is focused on pleasing Doug. Grant agrees enthusiastically with everything Doug says, no matter how ridiculous. Wife Jeana (Amy Landecker) pretends to taunt and tease, but she's the ultimate enabler. Shannon and Alex suck up as best they can.

Doug mistakes Beatriz as part of the staff and

# New Spider-Man Saves Summer

**Tops at the Box:** Jon Watts' *Spider-Man: Homecoming*, starring Tom Holland, Marisa Tomei, Donald Glover, Robert Downey Jr. and Michael Keaton, blew everyone away over the big summer box office, selling a startling \$117 million over its first three days of release.

I actually thought this one might fail. I thought, "No, no way will people accept another person as Spidey already." But yep, they sure did. The film sold \$257 million worldwide over its first three days of release, already making it one of the biggest successes of 2017. The movie currently has a respectable score of 73/100 on Metacritic, with most reviews landing in the C+/B- range. The kid playing Spidey is pretty adorable, but it's director Watts whom I am most interested in. His last film, *Cop Car*, is, in my opinion, a new classic.

**Also at the Box:** *Despicable Me 3* continued to sell well enough, earning another \$34 million over the weekend, bringing the flick's 10-day U.S. sales total to \$149 million. The flick has already brought in \$448 million worldwide.

Edgar Wright's *Baby Driver*, a movie that everyone I know seems to be suddenly, if softly, obsessed with, took the No. 3 spot, selling another \$12.8 million in the U.S. The flick has now sold a surprising \$70 million worldwide in just 10 days, making it Wright's most successful film so far.

*Wonder Woman* sold another \$10.1 million over

the weekend, bringing the flick's six-week worldwide sales total to \$745 million. It'd be excellent if *Spider-Man: Homecoming* doesn't come close to *Wonder Woman's* sales total, but I don't see that happening. Look for Spidey to top the \$1 billion mark.

Rounding out last weekend's Top 5 was Michael Bay's totally unnecessary *Transformers: The Last Knight* which sold just \$6.3 million last weekend, bringing the film's 17-day sales total to \$119 million in the U.S. Unfortunately, people in foreign markets are still all about Bay's *Transformers* flicks, buying up \$375 million in tickets since the film's release. Probably enough to ensure yet another effing *Transformers* movie from Bay. Boo.

Also of note: A24's new drama, *A Ghost Story*, starring Casey Affleck and Rooney Mara, sold \$108,067 while testing on four screens, giving it the weekend's highest per-screen average. The film reunites Mara and Affleck with the great director David Lowery. Looks very promising, and is, so far, one of the best-reviewed American films of 2017.

# Young Actors, Singers Shine

If I say *The Addams Family*, chances are you will reply by snapping your fingers, right? Cartoon characters Morticia, Gomez, the zombie butler, the mop with a ukulele — all are not only familiar parts of American humor, but it turns out that they can be pretty fun folks to watch on stage.

This week, that stage is at Canterbury High School, where *whatzup*-land's own high school all-stars kick over the gravestones to put on a show that is, as the TV show theme used to say, creepy and kooky. It may even be all together ooky, which I've always assumed is a good thing.

Featuring outstanding performers from 20 Indiana and Ohio schools ranging from colleges to middle schools and even the K-12 Online School, the Fort Wayne Summer Musical Theatre program's executive director, Kirby Volz, and assistant director, Andrew Sherman, don't shy away from unusual shows. This one is a hoot, with topical humor popping up in a funny, tuneful show that draws a little from the TV version and more from the New Yorker cartoons about the famously eccentric clan. The plot is a transparent girl-meets-boy affair, but as with many Broadway hit shows these days, how they get to a happy ending takes several wildly silly turns.

Musically, don't expect to have heard any of these songs on your Pandora playlist. Ones that stuck with me can give you a little taste of the "vibe" of the show — "One Normal Night," "Secrets," "Crazier Than You," and "Not Today." Not only is the cast full of good singers, but Choreographer Leslie Beauchamp has converted a *Walking Dead*-type ensemble into a Danse Macabre troupe with good humorous results.

Atticus Bennett shines as Gomez Addams, with a Spanish/Sylvanian accent perfect for the host with the most ghosts. The object of his passion, the death-obsessed Morticia, is played by Kaylee McCullar delightfully, as if June Cleaver traded the beads and sweater for skulls and crossbones. Janae Jeran as Wednesday Addams really is perfect, drawing not only from the cartoon's deadpan daughter but a solid dose of the moopy daughter from the movie *Beetlejuice*. Mason Brindle as Pugsley Addams is cute and slightly menacing, with one of the best high-pitched screams around. Jason Wendt as Fester Addams comes close to stealing the show, all giggles and clowning about love and ghosts. Zara McCord as Grandma Addams, and Dylan Record as Lurch Addams also carry their parts with style. The foils for Addams' unusual tastes are the Beinekes of Ohio, charmingly played by Dan-

iel Moser as Lucas Beineke, Holden Davenport as his dad, Mal, and Gwenyth Baer as his mom, Alice. It will come as no surprise to you that normality ultimately proves to be rarer than a blue moon by the time the Beineke visit is ended.

It continues to baffle me as to why Fort Wayne theater organizations avoid the wonderful musical theater tradition of the pre-show orchestra warmup. We audience members get excited to hear the tuning, trills and phrases from the pit as we filter in, and it's a quick signal to get quiet when the warm-up ends and the

welcoming director steps forward. Opening night, that warm up and tuning would have really helped. Music Director Ben Wedler led the orchestra, with Jill Jeran on Keyboard, Ronny Record on drums, Ian Blair and Kellen Baker on guitar, Alyssa Roesheck and Scott Roesheck on reeds, Joshua Bennett on bass guitar, Samuel Scheele on cello and trombone and Patrick Bassett on violin.

Featured Ancestors include Dallas Sherman, Donovan Stone, Evan Snauffer, Will Francis, Gabrielle Smith, Natalie Chivers, Chali Moss, Gilliam Lintz, Toriana Simoes, and Ally Crumley. An additional ensemble includes Anthony D'Virgilio, Lydia Roop, Sean Findley, Frances Bennett, Jasmin Burton, Annika Lantz, Kate Stumph, Piper Reneau, Emma Bennett, Clarice Scheele, Olivia Spangle, Savannah Strack, Izzy Copeland, Karlie Flanagan, Jaci Perales, Diana Zaldivar and Jordyn Hanni.

Visually, the setting and staging were clever and well-detailed. Credit goes to Set Design & Technical Director Joe Crouch and Stage Manager Morgan Thomas, Lighting Designer Jacob Zeigler, Sound Designer Darren Kessler, Costume coordinators Daniel Meredith and Anya Gouloff and their backstage crews.

questions whether or not she is here legally, but that isn't what really insults Beatriz. She has a sense that she has met him and begins to think that he was the developer who ruined her village with an expensive resort that destroyed the mangroves, stole land from her family and others and promised jobs but instead went bankrupt and closed in a very short time.

Instead of retreating, she (with the help of wine) becomes more aggressive and insistent on challenging Doug's beliefs and practices. The dialogue during dinner is wonderfully written. The set-up could make things feel cliché, but that doesn't happen.

Screenwriter Mike White and director Miguel Arteta have collaborated before (*Chuck and Buck* and

*The Good Girl*). They create a great rhythm, suspense, and a great contrasting visual landscape.

Beatriz becomes increasingly unhinged as the evening progresses. Despite her integrity and nurturing nature, the stresses in her life are no match for Doug's complete confidence that he is always right.

I recommend *Beatriz at Dinner*, big screen or small screen. The ending is maddening, mostly because I have had to keep thinking about the film and speculating on what the filmmakers' message is. But that's one of the reasons I go to the movies, so I got just what I deserve.
