

Steeped in Zydeco Music

Dwayne Rubin, aka Dwayne Dopsie, got his stage name from his late dad, the zydeco pioneer known as Rockin' Dopsie.

Rubin told the Stockton Record that his father borrowed the name from a Chicago jitterbug dancer called Dopsie (pronounced "Doopsee").

Taking his father's stage name wasn't a marketing ploy, he said. It was an act of musical pres-

ervation. "Keeping my father's tradition going means more to me than anything I could possibly explain to you," Rubin said. Growing up in Lofay

up in Lafayette, Louisiana, Rubin knew from a young age that he would

follow in his dad's footsteps (and in his dad's zydeco stylings).

"Basically, I grew up with the music always in the house," he said. "My father's band was always playing. Sometimes, he'd just take his accordion out and play.

"I was mesmerized by his ability to play left-handed," Rubin said. "I definitely knew I wasn't gonna be a fireman."

Rubin and his band, aka Dwayne Dopsie and the Zydeco Hellraisers, will perform at the Foellinger-Freimann Botanical Conservatory on August 18 as part of the Botanical Roots series. Opening the show will be The Legendary Trainhoppers at 8:30 p.m.

Rubin told the Decatur Herald Review

that every elder male on his father's side of the family played zydeco.

"I admired my father's playing so much," he said. "He was the only guy I've ever seen who played the accordion upside down because he was left-handed. It was very unique."

Rubin said zydeco wasn't just a profession in his family. It was a way of life.

"I can remember how it let my father express what he was feeling through the



instrument, very much like the blues," he said. "It's very spontaneous: Zydeco is one of the types of music out there you really can't buy in a book in a music store. It's pretty much all from the heart, and

you play it differently every time." Rubin's first musical instrument was the

washboard, which he started playing in his father's band at the age of six.

But he ultimately traded it for the accordion.

Rubin said he strove to capture a purer sound on accordion than was being showcased in many zydeco bands.

"My style is the original style," Rubin told the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette. "It's more bluesy. A lot of people don't realize that zydeco music was influenced by the blues, jazz and early rock n' roll. Back in the 1950s, when Clifton Chenier and my father were starting, they were more influenced by the blues. I try to keep it as close to that as I can because I want the younger generation to know where it came from. Zydeco music has deep roots. It started back when people were still picking beans and cotton in the fields."

He must be doing something right. In 1999 the American Accordionists' Association named him the player of "America's Hottest Accordion." He beat out 3,000 other entrants in the contest.

Around that same time, his band came

in at number 29 on a list of the "top 100 reasons to visit Louisiana" compiled by Louisiana-Travel.com.

"That's one of the most impressive accomplishments of my career," Rubin said, referring to the Louisiana Travel list. "I've been playing music in Louisiana and New Orleans, where there are so many great musicians. Being ranked No. 29 is more than

an honor."

Luckily for northeast Indiana residents, Dwayne Dopsie and the Zydeco Hellraisers will be one of the top reasons to visit Fort Wayne on August 18.

Rubin said zydeco is unlike any other music in the world because Louisiana is unlike any other place in the world.

"I feel I've learned that [Louisiana] history," he said. "It bleeds blues. It bleeds zydeco. It bleeds Cajun.

"People here are very resilient," Rubin said. "They'll make instruments out of pots and pans. They don't need much to entertain themselves."

Rubin said zydeco is for anybody and everybody.

"It's not only for the younger or older," he said. "It's very happy music when it's played well. When it's played right, it's something everybody can enjoy and relate to."

Southern Rock Survivors

School yourself a little bit on the life and exploits of Molly Hatchet, often deemed "the South's most infamous prostitute," and it becomes obvious why five men in Jacksonville, Florida would decide to name their band after her.

Legend has it that Hatchet worked the streets of Virginia and the Carolinas, leaving

a trail of headless men in her wake. As irresistible as a siren straight out of Greek mythology, she would lure lonely men into her lair, wow them with her wiles and then lop their heads off. For fun? As punishment for taking part in the Civil War? For simply being alive during one of the most shameful periods of American history?

We'll probably never know. What we do

know is Molly Hatchet the band, who will be at Brandt's Harley Davidson in Marion

Saturday, August 19 for a free show, came together in 1971, the brainchild of guitarist Dave Hlubek. It was the heyday of Southern rock, and Hlubek's mates – Banner Thomas on bass, Steve Holland (guitar), Bruce Crump (drums) and Duane Roland (guitar) – rode the wave.

In 1978, Molly Hatchet put out their eponymous debut. A year later, they released 1979's *Flirtin' with Disaster*, arguably the band's most celebrated record, and one of the seminal albums of the Southern rock movement.

According to Rolling Stone's "50 Rock Albums Every Country Fan Should Own" list, *Flirtin' with Disaster* is "hawked grimy Southern-rock with a heavy-metal glint" and that the band – fast, heavy, gnarly – "knew how to make a stadium as homey as a honky-tonk."

Flirtin' with Disaster probably should have been titled *Flirtin' with Fame* because that album and the single of the same name catapulted Molly Hatchet to the top of the rock charts and brought them out of relative obscurity and on the road. A national tour followed.

In the 80s, Molly Hatchet made a right turn mostly away from their Southern roots into hard rock. Some of this decision was due to a change in musical tastes among the masses (they wanted their rock with a side of hairspray rather than red-eye gravy) but it was also because *Flirtin' with Disaster* vocalist Danny Joe Brown was replaced by Jimmy Farrar of Raw Energy fame. Farrar, thrown into the band with little preamble, worked to make the frontman spot his own. He told a writer with swampland. com that it was especially in the area of songwriting that he tried to distinguish himself.

"I have to be inspired to write a song, and it has to mean something, or you are just stringing a bunch of words together that have no meaning," he said. "That is, to me,

what set Southern rock apart from all other music. The songs are not just words written on a piece of paper; they each represent something that the person who wrote it has lived, and I think the fans can relate to that. Music, to mean something, must be 'familiar to the heart' of the listener. They have to have lived it to love it, or at least it has to be presented in a way for you to feel like you have lived it for it to mean anything."

Fans still flocked, and the band's early 80s releases – *Beatin' the Odds, Take No Prisoners* – sold well enough. Then, in 1984, Brown, who'd recently put out a solo album that didn't do as well as he hoped, replaced Farrar at the mic, and Molly Hatchet reclaimed a little bit of their Southern style with *No Guts, No Glory*.

At the time, Brown told Gary James of classicbands com that the friends and former mates decided it was a stronger together situation.

"We all sat down and discussed the situation and figured we had a pretty good taste there in Southern sauce. If you take one in-

gredient out of it, it doesn't taste the same, you know?"

He went on to say that he was grateful for his time with Molly Hatchet and for the fans that continued to support them as their music changed and members came and left and came back again.

"I wanted to be a rock n' roll singer in a band that had Gold and Platinum records," he said. "I prayed for it. I'm a firm believer

in prayer. Believe me, this band has been on their knees more than one time together as a band. I'm not trying to start a religious cult with Molly Hatchet. I'm just saying we all know who is in charge of the situation. I appreciate some kid who's hardly got money and one sneaker's got a hole in it, but he still goes out and buys the damn album. When I was a kid, I didn't have much at all, and that's a fact. I'm glad to be where I am. And I appreciate the fact that

folks appreciate what I do."

One more studio album, a live album, and a greatest hits compilation followed, and in 1990 the group announced to fans they were breaking up.

Didn't someone once say that breaking up is hard to do? It certainly proved so for Molly Hatchet, who formed and reformed and broke up a number of times during the 90s, coming together to record *Devil's Canyon* in 1996 and *The Silent Reign of Heroes* two years later.

In 2000, guitarist Bobby Ingram became the torch bearer of the Molly Hatchet brand, and founding member Hlubek returned to the fold. It would seem to be the start of a golden era for Molly Hatchet. Then Brown and Roland died within a year of each other. This April, Thomas passed away from pneumonia.

Still, in the face of adversity, the everchanging music biz and the loss of members, Molly Hatchet refuse to go gentle into that good night, and now the band in its current incarnation – Hlubek (guitar), John Galvin (keys), Ingram (guitar), Phil McCormack (lead vocals), Tim Lindsey (bass) and Shawn Beamer (drums) – is currently touring the United States, Europe, Australia and Asia. Rumor is, they're working on a new album.

Molly Hatchet, the prostitute, is now thought to be a ghost, haunting lonely lanes and aging railroad tracks, on the hunt for new victims. Who knows? She just might be hanging around the windswept parking lot of a motorcycle dealership as we speak ...

Haim Something to Tell You

The Los Angeles-based sister group Haim started off at a disadvantage if they wanted to be taken seriously as musical artists. Having garnered a significant amount of hype before they even released their first album, they quickly became the kind of band you'd heard *about* more than you'd actually *heard*. The



in-crowd liked them, and once that first album dropped, the critics got on board, too, for the most part. With their sophomore album, *Something to Tell You*, Haim have reached the point that they must prove that they're the real deal. Unfortunately, the album doesn't quite do the trick.

First of all, you have to be pretty young to think the band's vocal harmonies sound like clever retro homage and not just a knockoff of Wilson Phillips. If there's a freshness in Haim's sound, it's in the fact that they literally duplicate 90s pop rather than simply tack some half-hearted retro ornaments onto 2017 pop. But on this sophomore record, the retro parroting loses depth; whereas on their debut album, Haim lifted passages from artists as diverse as the Eagles and 80s guitar bands, on their second effort it's all straight-ahead 90s girlgroup pop.

That doesn't mean that the album doesn't shoot for some modernity, though, and therein lies another of its weaknesses. Producer Ariel Rechtshaid throws lots of tricks at the tracks in an effort to give them a 21st-century gloss, but his tricks don't work as well as they did on the last album. On that record, reverb and distortion gave the songs edge and immediacy. This time around, digital vocal alterations, weird breaks and slick arrangements make it all seem empty, and at times (as on "Kept Me Crying") the songs become a messy hodgepodge. (*Evan Gillespie*)

Astral TV Chrystal Shores

Listening to Astral TV's Chrystal Shores is like receiving some ancient transmission from deep space. It slowly unfolds its interplanetary melodies through breathing synthesizers and tube-driven circuits. This album evokes long, contemplative walks or quiet moments watching the sun dissipate into the ocean.



This record is made up of what I call "big picture" music. You get lost in the language of machines when you hit play or drop the needle, and in times like these a record like this is essential. Astral TV are asking us to slow down and smell the roses, or contemplate our own reality. *Chrystal Shores* is an aural manual on how to navigate our universe, one dreamy song at a time.

So what is an Astral TV you ask? Well, I imagine that creepy television that shows up in David Cronenberg's *Videodrome*. You know, the one James Woods sticks his head into? Or maybe it's some ancient console TV you find abandoned in some nondescript Midwestern basement where those strange transmissions from the great beyond arrive on clear, star-filled evenings. James Woods may not be involved with this one, but there's definitely some strange, beautiful transmissions happening here.

Astral TV consist of Keith Canisus and Rasmus Rasmussen. Canisus is a producer and composer of electronic, dream pop and lo-fi tunes. He's self-released, as well as released through Darla Records. Rasmussen is the keyboard wizard for Denmark's Causa Sui and also puts excellent electronic music out under the name Aerosol. Together these two have formed Astral TV, and their sound is new age for the new age.


Chrystal Shores blends both ambient song structures with classic Berlin School aesthetics to create something sublime, yet heady. "Before We Meet" opens the album with a feel of new beginnings. It opens like pure light cutting through fading blinds. "Mirrors" blows

Utopia Oops! Wrong Planet (1977)

Utopia were formed by musical guru Todd Rundgren in the mid 70s. Blending light progressive, pop and alternative rock, these guys all wrote, produced and even sang on most of the Utopia releases. This, their fourth LP, blended soft rock with bright pop, and while not a



mainstream record, it was received well by the loyal Utopians.

"Trapped" opens the record and has a heavier rock sound with synth and harmonies and has Rundgren wailing away on his Gibson SG. "Windows" has a very mellow yacht rock feel and captures the sunny alternative the band was able to produce. "Love in Action" gets back to the pop-rock, and "Crazy Lady Blue" has an Electric Light Orchestra feel about it. Side one closes with "The Marriage of Heaven and Hell," a foot-stomping track that has a bridge that sounds like the Beatles. Let's call it "art-rock" if we need to give it a name.

"The Martyr" opens side two and is a super ballad that has a Journey or Styx sound (this was a staple in the late 70s). "Abandon City" has sort of a pessimistic view of urban decay but also has a little soul to it. The negative view of the corporate (and governmental) world is also obvious in the poppy "Rape of the Young," but again, Rundgren and the boys rock out in this one and blend an almost new-wave sound with late 70s prog-rock. The album closes with the uber-ballad "Love is the Answer" which reached No. 1 on the Billboard charts two years later when it was recorded by England Dan and John Ford Coley.

If you like pop-prog-art-rock, Utopia cover the bases and with 10 records through 1985. They occasionally tour, with just Rundgren and bassist Kasim Sulton as the remaining members. (*Dennis Donahue*)

by your ears like a breezy rainfall just before the sun breaks through the afternoon overcast. You get a real Vangelis-meets-Tangerine Dream vibe here, and that's not a bad thing. "Staying Home" wavers in the air with echoing guitar lines that ground this otherworldly track, giving the song an overall earthy feel. "Human" sounds like the beginning of existence itself, unfolding like some circuit-driven pop up book that explains the meaning of it all.

And we're only four songs in.

Though these songs take various forms of atmospheric, ambient music, they all carry with them a heavy 70s vibe. I picture shag carpet in a basement with beanbag chairs and an old console stereo where stacks of vinyl wait to be spun, after school specials and Kool-Aid in the fridge. These songs tap into a very specific time, a time where beer commercials and kids shows are soundtracked by strange machines named things like "Moog" and "Prophet 8."

Still, there's something far deeper going on in tracks like "Sun Flares," "0000," "Welcome" and the epic creeper "Surveillance." You wouldn't hear anything like this in a Schaefer Beer commercial. "Surveillance," especially, starts out with an ominous drone that feels like strange eyes staring in on something they shouldn't. If you could somehow blend the sonic humidity of *The Fog* with the neon-lit doomed futurism of *Blade Runner*, you might have an idea of what's going on here. It's dark and light coming together somewhere in the middle.

Astral TV's *Chrystal Shores* is new age music for a new age. There's nothing "hippy dippy" about this record, though. It sounds like a soundtrack for enlightenment. It's wide open spaces and technicolor dreams. Canisus and Rasmussen have made a record for serious moments of contemplation and headphone explorations. Navelgazing or stargazing, take your pick. It's a record that opens your head and lets some serious light in. (*John Hubner*)

David Crosby, 270 years old, shows no signs of slowing down. Crosby, actually about to turn 76, has a new solo album dropping September 29 and will hit the road for the David Crosby and Friends Sky Trails Tour a month later. The tour kicks off at City Winery in



Chicago on October 30, followed by a visit to the Palladium in Carmel on November 4 and The Kent Stage in Kent, Ohio on November 5.



The band just released their ninth studio album, *Louder, Harder, Faster*, and it's pretty darn good. If you pick it up and are expecting "Cherry Pie" or "Down Boys," you're going to be disappointed but if you just want a good old fashioned rock n' roll record, you might want to pick it up. Of course, Warrant's live shows focus on the hits you know from "back in the day," but they have been known to mix in a new song or two from time to time as well. I mean, you have to have bathroom breaks, right?



'Flossy Posse' Runs Wild

Girls Trip is just what you imagine - a raunchy reunion rumpus fueled by alcohol, dancing, friendship, adventure, sex, and some sharp girl talk. But the ladies of Girls Trip have a lot more fun and a lot more heart than their white sisters of Rough Night.

The ladies who make up the "Flossy Posse" were wild women in college, but over the years they have seen each other less and drifted a part just a bit.

Ryan (Regina Hall) is a bestselling author and self-help guru. Her book is You Can Have It All, and she tells herself so with affirmations about her power, strength and beauty. She is married to a retired football player. They are a power couple building their brand.

Ryan is invited to be the keynote speaker of the annual Essence Festival to be held in New Orleans. She hesitates for just a minute but realizes it is the perfect opportunity to treat the posse to a reunion, complete with five-star accommodations and VIP passes for all.

The other members of the posse are single mom Lisa (Jada Pinkett Smith), celebrity blogger Sasha (Queen Latifah) and wild child Dina (Tiffany Haddish). We get a taste of each of them before they head off to New Orleans.

Lisa is stressing because her mom won't keep her kids on a regulated schedule. She's a stressed out, germ-phobic helicopter mom.

Sasha is telling her blog advertisers that she can deliver more hits, though she is mostly selling them something she doesn't have yet and is having money troubles.

Dina is running circles around a boss who is not having much success at trying to fire her. She is a hilarious tornado, and as she leaves, she thanks him for giving her Friday and Monday off to really enjoy the weekend.

Dina continues her highjinks on the plane, buying drinks for everyone and getting the party started right. The full throttle exuberance and pure celebration of Girls Trip takes over during the opening street scene



in New Orleans. The mood is ecstatic. The music is fabulous. The people are very good looking. The ladies dance in the streets and loosen up. Everybody is jazzed for Essence Festival.

Girls Trip is directed by Malcom D. Lee, who knows his way around ensemble comedy (The Best Man, Barbershop: The Next Cut). He's also worked the screenwriters Kenya Barris and Tracy Oliver. They wrote the screenplay for his Barbershop turn. Barris and Oliver are also the co-creators and writers of the television hit blackish. On the television screen, their work deals with race using a mix of humor, sympathy and sensitivity and including white people in the mix.

The ladies of Girls Trip have almost no time to deal with the nonsense of white people. Early on Sasha remarks at some silly antics, "That's some white boy [stuff] right there." A night of partying later, and she is doing the exact same thing.

Ryan gives her agent (Kate Walsh being brave enough to play the very neurotic, high-strung white agent) a lecture on being a guest in New Orleans and on the culture of black women who will dominate the crowds at the Essence Festival, warning her about her pathetic attempts to imitate "some colloquialisms she heard somewhere."

All the women are wonderful. They all look fabulous. Hall has the most heavy lifting to do. Pinkett Smith transforms from up tight mom to her old wild self with charm. Queen Latifah, well, she's Queen Latifah. You never doubt she will be guided by integrity, honesty and loyalty. Haddish is a standout. She pulls off some outlandish stunts with style.

Dark Tower Fails to Bomb at Box

Tops at the Box: Nikolaj Arcel's The Dark Tower adaptation didn't bomb, as expected, but instead took the No. 1 spot at a weak U.S. box office last weekend, selling a cold \$19 million domestically. Add in another \$8 million and I guess this might be on its way to being a hit. While the film has done surprisingly well so far at the box office, the reviews have been as expected: bad. Really bad. One of the worst reviewed major films of the year. Anyone see this one? If so, what did you think? Did you just go because of the Idris and Stephen King appeal? Because I would understand that. If you went because you liked the trailer and the stills, then I'm afraid I don't understand that. Or you. You psycho.

Also at the Box: Christopher Nolan's Dunkirk continued to roll, selling another \$17.6 in the U.S. last weekend, upping the flick's 17-day worldwide total to \$317 million. Not Batman numbers. Not Inception numbers. Not even Interstellar numbers. But still very good. Can't wait to see this one and am ashamed I haven't already. The nerds are convinced that this will finally be the one that gets Nolan his first Best Director nomination at the Oscars. He should like have like seven already. Seven! And I would argue that each of those seven films has the potential to eventually be considered a classic.



Taking the No. 3 spot at the U.S. box office last weekend was The Emoji Movie, selling another \$12 million, upping the stupid movie's 10-day sales total to \$49 million in the U.S. and a whopping \$12 million abroad. Looks so bad. Surprise hit Girls Trip took the No. 4 spot at last weekend's U.S. box, selling another \$11.4 million and bringing the movie's 17-day U.S. sales total to \$85 million. Exactly zero people saw that coming. Rounding out last weekend's Top 5 was Spider-Man: Homecoming, a title I love typing out every week. Homecoming sold another \$8.8 million in the U.S. last weekend, bringing the film's five-week worldwide total to \$671 million. Yep, those are Spidey numbers.

Kathryn Bigelow's Detroit finally opened wide, selling a decent enough \$7.2 million. But is it surprising? It's a Bigelow film featuring an in-topic that's playing on over 3,000 screens, so maybe it should



A Tragic Fairy Tale Well Told

Blood Brothers is a dark, grown-up fairy tale about poverty, class division and mental illness. Written by British writer Willy Russell (who also wrote Shirley Valentine and Educating Rita), the plot follows twin brothers (Ennis Brown and Kibwe Cooper) separated at birth. Fate repeatedly brings them together, and the horrible pact made by the boys' biological mother and her employer results in tragedy.

Jake Wilhelm assembled an incredibly talented cast for this production. Debbie Moore exudes warmth and maternal love as Mrs. Johnstone, the impoverished single mother of seven in danger of losing her children to the welfare system. Her voice is powerful and heartbreaking as she sings about her past and the downward turn her life has taken. Elaine Gerke portrays Mrs. Lyons as the coldhearted epitome of wealthy privilege and ennui to perfection. Albert

Brownlee is excellent as her cheerfully oblivious workaholic husband.

Brown and Cooper are fantastic as the brothers, Mickey and Edward, who are portrayed at ages 7, 14, and 18. Their chemistry onstage is wonderful, and their youthful exuberance and innocent friendship makes the finale all the more tragic.

The progression of their growing up throughout the story is believable, and Brown in particular has the challenge of portraying Mickey's downward spiral into desperation and depression.

Carissa Chrzan is lovely as Mickey's girlfriend/ wife Linda, who has a dangerous affection for Edward. She also seamlessly transitions from unruly child to troubled adult. Fatima Washington is the story's ominous Narrator who personifies Mrs. Johnstone's superstitious fears. She adds a sly humor to her bit characters that interweave throughout the story, and her gorgeous voice brings chills. Duke Roth is scary as heck as Sammy, the juvenile delinquent big brother who is the catalyst for Mickey's (and Eddie's) ultimate downfall.

The cast is rounded out by a chorus, whose members play multiple characters: Susannah Chadwell,



Quentin Jenkins, Maggie Leavell, Elliott Mitchel and Taylor Moriarty. Each performer has the chance to shine.

The universal talent of the cast is matched by the orchestra, led by Ben Wedler. Featuring Wedler and Tommy Saul on keyboards, Adam "Mexico" Robi-son on guitar, Tyler "Panda" Bill on cello/bass, Liam Hickey on drums, and John Leavell on saxophone, the band perfectly complements the singers without overpowering them.

The sparse set design by director Wilhelm is remi-

niscent of the designs for his two previous Arena musicals (Bat Boy and Violet) and features innovative folding doorways and movable set pieces to depict a variety of settings. The lighting design by Brock Eastom also adds to the sometimes eerie, dreamlike feel of the production. Leslie Beauchamp's dialect coaching was also used to great

effect, with the entire cast using Liverpudlian accents (except Gerke and Brownlee, whose accents are a bit more posh).

Blood Brothers was written in 1983, and it's still extremely relevant over thirty years later. The serendipitous casting of a racially diverse group of performers offers some particularly chilling parallels to the current social climate that were unintended by Russell, whose show was written with white protagonists.

Despite the serious subject matter, however, the script, along with Wilhelm's cast and direction, allow for plenty of laughs. Although it's not a show for young children (the "F" word is used throughout), it offers something for just about everyone. It should not be missed.
