Local band puts some sizzle in the scene

Meat Flowers serve up delightfully quirky music

Fort Wayne band The Meat Flowers is not your typical rock band, so it is not surprising that their history, album goals, and target audience are delightfully quirky and definitely not typical.

Though not many may be familiar with the band, lead singer Jared Andrews is a familiar face around Fort Wayne and a previous *Whatzup* subject piece.

GAINING A REPUTATION

Formed in 2013, the band is formed by three friends: Jared Andrews, Dan Obergfell, and Jon Ross.

"My old band broke up, and I wanted to do something new, and I love Dan and Jon dearly, so we started a band, gave it a dumb name, and recorded an album," Andrews said. "And then our studio burned down."

Beyond the misfortunate of a studio mishap, the three musically inclined friends quickly made a reputation for themselves in the local music scene by becoming staple performers at bars such as The Brass Rail, The Ruin, and The Clyde.

Don't let their Midwestern roots fool you, though. In their six years of producing music, The Meat Flowers have become no stranger to tour life.

"We've done some touring," Andrews said. "We've played for dozens of people all across the U.S.A. One time we opened up for Squeeze and De La Soul in Long Beach, California. I don't think they remember us."

GRILLED ABOUT THEIR SOUND

To summarize The Meat Flowers' sound presents its own challenge.

"Our sound is kinda heavy, kinda not," Andrews said. "Pretty melodic, pretty poppy, kinda rowdy, kinda chill. We've gotten six percent better over the past 6 years."

While their sound "kinda" draws on a little bit of everything, their eclectic sound has helped the band progress from being a local band to expanding their popularity and reach.

TIME FOR A SECOND ALBUM

Andrews commented on the future of the band. "We just wanna keep writing and recording and making records and playing shows and eventually get our music in an Outback Steakhouse commercial or two. That's all," he said. "We're finally gonna make another record sometime this

When asked what the band's goals would be in regard to a new album, Andrews said: "It's gonna be a lot better than our first one, and we're gonna give it all we got. If it's not good enough for Outback Steakhouse, then we're officially calling it quits forever and you'll never hear from us again."

While The Meat Flowers' appreciation for meat clearly goes beyond just their band name,

Outback Steakhouse commercials are not the only ambition or audience for the band.

"Our target audience is Target employees."

But jokes can't mask the band's success with and passion for music.

"We always knew we wanted to pursue music in some form or fashion." Andrews said.

"For me, it started when I saw Billy Joel's 'Uptown Girl' video on VH1's *Pop-Up Video*. For Jon Ross, he became transfixed by the Dave Matthews Band at an early age, and his fate was sealed. For Dan, it was the first time he caught a glimpse of Mark McGrath from Matchbox 20. So yeah, I guess you could say we're all kinda music snobs."

Living the dream with Joey O Band

Band settles in Auburn after worldwide shows

Ever since he was a young boy, Joey Ortega knew all he wanted to do was be in a band. Now, years later, he's still living that dream with the Joey O Band.

Ortega started playing in a working band during his ninth grade year of high school and by his senior year of high school, he was playing in bars five or six nights every week.

"Even at the age of 14, I could tell who was serious and who wasn't," Ortega said. "That is so important in this business."

EXTENSIVE TRAVEL

Taking his ambitions further, Ortega spent a good amount of his life recording out in Los Angeles as the last person Sound City legend Joe Gottfried managed. When Gottfried died in 1992, Ortega moved back to his home state of Michigan and did a lot of soul searching.

He was then offered to play guitar for Doyle Bramhall in Texas, but after Ortega worked with him for a while, Bramhall got sick. When he returned to Michigan once again, toward the end of 1995, Ortega decided to form the Joey O Band.

"It's a lot harder than anyone thinks to put together a band, but it's easy when you get the right people," Ortega said.

Ortega definitely found the right people; the Joey O Band is led by none other than Joey O on guitar, with Janet Goodyear on vocals, Steve Sahagun on bass, and Kent Klee on drums. In Ortega's words, they are a "classic rock band with a blues lead guitar player." The band enjoys covering music styles from the '60s, the '80s, and in Ortega's opinion, "the glory days of the '70s."

In 1996, the Joey O Band played a show in Angola, Ind., where Ortega met his wife. He announced to the band that he was moving to Indiana for her, and they eventually followed.

The Joey O Band has been very successful, touring places such as Germany three times during the years 2002, 2003, and 2005. They'd go over for about three weeks and play every night in a different place.

"We played together for many years and had a great run, but then an opportunity for me to do bigger shows all the time came up," Ortega said.

Start Me Up is a Rolling Stones Tribute Band that Ortega formed and headlined shows with all

over the world. While he played with Start Me Up, Ortega would still get together with the Joey O Band every two or three years, but it was no longer his main focus.

"Thanks to Start Me Up, I got my name all around, which led to the Joey O Band getting great offers before we even started to seriously play again," Ortega said.

People constantly nudged and strongly encouraged Ortega to put the Joey O Band back in full force, and as a result, he now has a renewed commitment to that band.

"I'd been traveling so much for the past 11 years," Ortega said. "It was fun, but I'm also 11 years older now."

Ortega feels that at this point in his life, he is done with the extensive travel and the bar scenes. The Joey O Band allows him to play in nearby venues and not always be so far away from home. Right now, the band plans to perform seasonally, holding out for big shows of their choosing.

"We will seriously entertain any offers spring through fall," Ortega said. "The bulk of the work will be in June, July, and August. In the winter, I plan to be couch bound."

CATCH SOME LOCAL SHOWS

The Joey O Band's latest CD release in 2017, *Auburn Sunset*, is available on all streaming sites. Ortega has material written for another guitar instrumental album, which he hopes to release later this year.

To avoid oversaturation in certain markets, the band will not be performing many local shows in the future, so be sure to catch them when you can. Upcoming shows for the Joey O Band include a performance at the DeKalb Outdoor Theater in Auburn on July 26 at 7:30 p.m., and Rock the

"My favorite part of being in the Joey O Band is playing music I love with people I love," Ortega said. "If I can't look around the room and say that, I know I'm not working with the right people."

Ortega has had a wildly successful career from working with the managers he did to opening for icons such as Van Halen and Billy Idol to traveling across the world to Nicaragua and Honduras. Later in his career, he was contacted by Dave Grohl of Nirvana as they were creating a movie on Sound City. This movie reconnected Ortega with many of his friends from his past, and was an extraordinary moment for him.

Living in Indiana has been great for Ortega and his wife, and has not held him back from any opportunities.

"I live in Auburn, and look at all the cool things I've been able to do since I've lived here," Ortega said. "So, I don't buy it for a second when someone says you have to move somewhere else."



"Botanica Jones: Scientist, Merchant or Thief?" is a fun and educational exhibit designed for the whole family to enjoy. It is on display through November 17.



₹ort Wayne hearts → have been heavy with the passing of one of its favorite citizens, Sam Hyde. It's hard to believe that Hyde Brothers hasn't always been part of this city's landscape, that Wells Street wasn't somehow built around it.

It has been and will forever be one of the favorite MICHELE DEVINNEY spots for book lovers (and

even casual readers) since it opened in 1992. For bibliophiles, it was a piece of heaven, a treasure trove of the beloved and the obscure.

For those looking for a particular title, it was a beacon of hope, because how could a building so stacked with books not have that title you covet?

But always there to greet was the lovable face of its owner, Sam Hyde. And a cat or two. To walk in and purchase a book was a chance to exchange pleasantries with him, and many developed strong friendships over the years.

Sam will be deeply missed, but his legacy is that he provided this city with its finest brick-and-mortar bookstore, one that will be treasured long after the sad news of his death.

This concept simultaneously celebrates how communal our city is, and exposes many people to the diversity that can exist in a mid-sized Midwest city. We believe that this is a timely project as 'walls' — virtual and physical — are a prevalent concept in mainstream culture."

The campaign seeks to raise \$10,000, but in a community this size, every donation helps move the effort forward.

New focus on songwriting

Decades of experience helps him craft music

One reason Fort Wayne's music community is so strong is that there is very little attrition. Thanks to opportunities for work, often locally for Sweetwater, and plenty of venues in which to play, there are many musicians who were featured in the early days of *Whatzup* (that would be the mid-90s for the young whippersnappers who might wonder) who are still delivering great music and performances today.

Brian Lemert is one such performer. With his new release, *East of Where You've Been*, he provides catchy hooks and lyrics of nostalgia and poignancy.

WRITING ABOUT REAL LIFE

His decision to record new music reflects how he has changed in the past two decades and how his writing process has evolved along the way.

"My approach has changed a great deal over the years," Lemert said. "I write about life experiences now, whereas I used to write things that I thought would be cool. Music is much more a place for the song to live, a way to support the story. Back then I would write the music first and the words later."

Recording as Onionhead in the 1990s, Lemert gained considerable attention for one particular song, "Supersonic Rock and Roll Star." He compared his approach then to how he approached the recording of *East of Where You've Been*.

"When I was doing Onionhead, I played all the parts," he said. "But this time I was happy to do the vocals and guitar and let other people come in and bring their talents to it. There are very few artists who can play all the parts. Very few Princes or Lenny Kravitzs. Mike Campbell didn't have Tom Petty telling him how to play. Keith Richards doesn't have Mick

Jagger telling him how to play. They can still be great without having to play all of it."

Happily employed at Sweetwater's retail store, Lemert juggles musical jobs and saw the opportunity to record again as something he was ready to do.

"I wanted to do this," he said. "There was no reason not to do this. It took about a year. I was much more efficient so if I had a good idea, I'd document it. I'd record tidbits and take good notes when I worked on them. The recording process now is much more professional. Sweetwater is really high quality, and now when I'm recording, it's the difference between good enough and getting it right. It's much more about crafting songs now."

NEW SONGS FOR A NEW AUDIENCE

Through his various gigs — be it Onionhead, cover bands, or original music — Lemert feels he was in a good place to focus on new music and recordings.

"Playing in cover bands in bars like I was doing for so long, it's just a different mindset than when you're writing," Lemert said. "It was refreshing to write again, to get in a different head space."

In an effort to get the music out to more people, he opens for the Yacht Rock Revue at the Sweetwater Performance Pavilion on July 25, a slot he sought out as a way to introduce more people to his new music.

"I asked to open that show," he said. "I



talked to the people booking Yacht Rock Revue and the Sweetwater Pavilion and asked if I could perform the record in an acoustic set. I thought that was a good way to present it since there's no setup needed for an acoustic set. And I picked that particular show because I think the record appeals to a wide enough variety that it would go well with the Yacht Rock Revue. That show isn't a band tribute. It's really a genre tribute, so it's going to attract a wider audience, too."

THANKFUL FOR THE SUPPORT

Lemert appreciates the support he has received over the years, including the love "Supersonic Rock and Roll Star" brought him in 1996. He credits his many influences including one particular Fort Wayne radio icon.

"I was young when I started playing music and played a lot of small halls then I had some success with Onionhead when I was just 23," Lemert said. "It was a big deal. It was awesome for me as a local artist to find people who had faith in me. It was great. That song was a product of growing up listening to the Beatles and connecting it to what was going on at that time. I think we're all a product of what we were listening to when we were kids.

"And sometimes the DJs we listened to were as important as the musicians we were listening to, and Doc [West] is one of those guys. If Doc mentioned your band name on the radio, that was it. It was so big. It sets the bar higher than you could otherwise get to."

Lemert is also pleased with the response to his new music, appreciating those who have already listened and looking forward to sharing it with new audiences in the months ahead.

"I am so proud of this record," he said. "People are listening to it as music and not just as my friend. I'm also getting a lot of compliments from non-musicians which means a lot to me, too."

RAISE THE CURTAIN ON HISTORY



Hicksville, Ohio, celebrates its historic Huber Opera House

Many cities have faced the challenge that Hicksville, Ohio, did with the Huber Opera House. Once a building of splendor, there came a time when it had to be decided whether to save it

Twenty years ago, the city made that choice.

FROM VAUDEVILLE TO BAR TO RESTORATION

"It was an opera house and then it became a vaudeville house and a movie theater," said Chris Feichter, director of operations for the Huber Opera House and Civic Center. "It fell into disrepair in the '60s and '70s and became a bar which ruined a lot of the interior. But 20 years ago, the community decided to save the Huber. They decided they didn't want to tear it down and turn it into a parking lot."

And when Hicksville decided to save the Huber, it wasn't a passive thing.

Volunteers have tackled the project in a very hands-on way, replacing, restoring, and remodeling each aspect of the theater to return the building to its former glory. The project continues with work still in progress on the balcony.

The building is also historical, not just a part of Hicksville's history, but holds a special place in the theater world beyond that city.

"It's a hemp house," Feichter said. "The stage is still run with sandbags and ropes, which is very unusual now. It's run by hand with pulleys with a drop system. We still have the original curtain, and it's dropped from the top rather than pulled from the sides."

HUBER A HUB FOR HICKSVILLE

As progress has continued to restore the Huber, the place has become a hub of activity in Hicksville, not only making it a theater again but also making it a thriving civic center. Visitors might be there for a show or they may be attending a community meeting or even a wedding.

But as a theater, it has provided a special outlet for local talent. Four years ago, a production company, Opera Lane Performers, was formed along with a junior division, Huber Youth Productions.

"We've had four years of productions now," Feichter said. "We breakdown the ages so many people can participate. We have three different levels. We have a group for ages six to 10, and they have a two week camp in June. Then our youth group is ages 10 to 14, and they just did Willy Wonka Jr. in February. Our oldest group is 14 and up, and graduates — we call them our alums — will often come back and participate as adults."


The Huber and their production companies have received support from their home state, allowing them to grow significantly in their relatively brief history, Feichter said.

"In 2018 we received a grant from the Ohio Arts Council which allowed us to have workshops teaching them about costuming and how to make props," he said. "We were able to create our own drop for our production of The Lion King, and we've been able to use that for many of our other productions."

They have also accrued enough in the way of costumes and sets to loan out or exchange with various nearby theater companies. And as Huber Youth Productions and the Opera Lane Performers have grown to three production a year each, they've been able to secure enough materials to take on some bigger productions including one they've been wanting to tackle for a few years.

FAN-FAVORITE MUSICALS

"This October 18-20, the adult group will be doing *The King* & I," Feichter said. "I'm working on the schedule a year ahead, and





we knew we wanted to do *The King & I* for the last two years, so we've been gradually collecting the things we'll need for that show. I wasn't able to announce that show for a while because the touring production was still out. The day after the performance in Fort Wayne, I was able to announce our production."

This month the Huber Opera House hosts a production of Anything Goes performed by Huber Youth Productions and taking the Huber stage July 26-28. The show was one requested by its director Julie Hall.

"I'm always planning ahead and often someone will come to

me and say, 'There's a show I'd like to do,' and I look at the feasibility and try Feichter said. "Julie Hall asked for this show because she's

been in the show twice and has directed it previously. She's always wanted to do it again because she loves the show."

Helping to make the show possible is that costumes from one of those productions, hand-sewn by Hall's mother, have survived and will be used again for this production.

Anything Goes is just one of many events which have and will take place at the revived Huber Opera House. Its rebirth has been a boon for even the local schools.

"Our high school put in a stage, but it's very shallow and at the end of the cafeteria," Feichter said. "Those cafetorium situations are good for awards ceremonies and things, but they aren't as good for performances. So our high school and middle school stage their shows here, too. And we have concerts and Christmas shows and other things here, too. It's a busy facility."

CELEBRATING ITS OWN SUCCESS

As the year winds down, the Huber Opera House is planning a celebration in December to mark the 20th anniversary of the decision to save that facility, one that has become a special part of the Hicksville community as the events court the kids and bring the parents along as well.

"As we've grown and have done these productions with the kids, we brought in families who have become involved. Last year's production of *The Music Man* had 80 people involved, so it was a very family-oriented show. But as patrons and parents come into the Huber and see it, they all say, 'Wow, this is really cool.' Especially if they'd been here when it was a bar, they can't believe how beautiful it is now."

Ingrid Michaelson

Stranger Songs

From a marketing perspective, there's definitely some sense to Ingrid Michaelson's new album, which



was inspired by the Netflix series Stranger Things.

Michaelson has a new album to promote, and Netflix has a new season of the series to push, so it's perfectly logical for the two projects to drop at virtually the same time.

The weird thing is that there's no official connection between the album and the show, so it's not, in fact, a product of orchestrated commercial

Michaelson based each of the album's songs on the show's characters and their relationships, although she doesn't specifically name any of them in the lyrics.

If you're not a fan of the show, you won't know that "Pretty" is about Eleven's journey of self-discovery or that "Hate You" is about Steve's reaction to being dumped by Nancy.

Nor will you find any of the series' homages to '80s culture in the music. Aside from an offhand reference to the show's synth-driven theme song in "Freak Show" and some of the other songs, the music is much more reminiscent of the mid-2000s than of the '80s.

This odd disjuncture is fortunate for the album. Even if she took inspiration from the series, Michaelson generalizes the songs into universal comments on young love and self-expression. The quiet love ballads and exuberant pop tunes are precisely in line with everything Michaelson has been doing for the past decade.

What could have been a gimmick that appealed only to fans of Stranger Things is, instead, a solid collection of generic pop songs that might actually be more appealing to listeners who have never seen the show. — Evan Gillespie

Meytal

The Witness

The Witness will be of interest to a lot of Fort Wayne hard rock fans as it features the vocals of Sahaj Ticotin, otherwise employed as the



frontman of Ra, a former fixture on the million dollar stage inside Piere's.

Ticotin is credited with songwriting credits on The Witness as well, with the bands namesake, drummer Meytal Cohen, adding to the mix.

Cohen, as some may know, gained initial recognition from YouTube. Her drumming is adequate but doesn't take the forefront as one might think and is overshadowed by the presence of Ticotin, who has always had a way of finding a way to write music that highlights his strengths.

What you get with the Ticotin/Cohen collaboration is what you would largely expect from Ra in 2019, if Ra were still making albums: thunderous riffs, catchy melody, and Ticotin's distinguishable

Strangely enough, the best songs on the album, "Out of Chaos," "I Will Leave," and the radio ready "What Do I Have To Do" are also the last three songs on the album.

Still, most of the offerings here are above average. Only the cover of The Eagles "Hotel California" should be considered for the "skip" button.

While those aforementioned three songs are reason enough to give this disc more than a few listens, be aware that there's nothing here that is going to push the boundaries of music.

That's OK, though. Not every album has to be groundbreaking. I'd settle for an album like this that is full of listenable fare over a one-and-done disc any day.

While this album may be a bit underground, it's certainly worth the effort to find it. — Chris Hupe

Mark Ronson

Late Night Feelings

The nagging quesabout Mark Ronson is how much credit he deserves for the monumental success of Amy Winehouse or "Uptown Funk."



Whether he's writing or just producing someone else's song and vocal, his method is to push someone else out front.

It's hard to deny that Winehouse and Bruno Mars were more than minimally responsible for Ronson's biggest successes.

The producer shows up more on Late Night Feelings than he does on some of his other work, despite the fact that he seems to be searching for the next vocalist who will take him to the top of the charts.

Ronson has said that Late Night Feelings is a concept album that grew out of his divorce, a collection of "sad bangers" that set weepiness to a danceable groove.

Of course, there's nothing innovative about sadly romantic pop songs, and the songs, when they work, are successful more because of Ronson's glossy (although often over-indulgent) production and arresting vocals than because of their emotional content.

The album's vocalists are an all-female cast of established stars, indie favorites, and relative newcomers.

Sometimes the vocals slump into the mundane (Angel Olsen's "True Blue" and Camila Cabello's "Find U Again"), but sometimes they are striking, as on "Don't Leave Me Lonely," the best of three songs featuring the Adele-esque YEBBA. On the title track, a '70s pop facade saves Lykke Li's otherwise boilerplate club tune.

Some of the more well-known vocalists stake out their own niches. Alicia Keys melds R&B and hip hop on "True," and Miley Cyrus goes all in on her Dolly Parton impression for "Nothing Breaks Like a Heart."

Lacking a powerful chart-dominator like

horns, rhythm and blues, folk (and gospel) rock, and is still in heavy rotation on my turntable.

Blood, Sweat & Tears 4 is one of those records that captures the mix of progressive rock with topical lyrics. Only Chicago matched the sound of the genre.

It opens with "Go Down Gamblin'," a bright rocker with nice electric guitars and a blend of horns that would be their trademark sound on the release.

"Cowboys and Indians" brings the tempo down with jazzy-blues arrangement and lyrics that were subtle but revealing.

Great piano backs up a sweet composition in the Al Kooper-penned "John the Baptist" which mixes an element of gospel with early '70s folk-rock.

David Clayton-Thomas preaches more in "Redemption," which has parts for horns that would rival Tower of Power. Is it jazz-rock or rock-jazz? Hard to tag this number, but it was snappy enough for rock radio and cruised along in a free-form jam for more than five minutes.

Side two jumps right into the fray with "High on a Mountain," a track that sounds precisely like a Procol Harum song with high production from both the vocals and instruments. "Take Me in Your Arms (Rock Me a Little While)" was covered by the Doobie Brothers in 1975 and was written by the Motown writing team of Holland, Dozier, and Holland.

The melancholy "For My Lady" slows the album down, but it picks up again in "Mama Gets High." This one was based on the band's tongue-in-cheek attempt at a Dixieland number, but it works very well for the nine-piece group with both Americans and Canadians that produced some noble music through 1980.

Still touring, the band has had over 150 members, with sometimes three of the originals on stage. — Dennis Donahue

"Rehab" or "Uptown Funk," Late Night Feelings is probably not going to do much to inflate Ronson's legend, but its retro atmospherics make it a solid soundtrack for a moody night. — Evan Gillespie

Festival grows with support from allies

More than two decades after the first Fort Wayne Pride festival, organizers are hoping to welcome a record number of people to this

"The first festival had less than 100 people there," said Executive Director Nikki Fultz. "In 2005 we moved to Headwaters Park East, which is where we are now. This year we're expecting about 15,000."

"I'd say in the last seven or eight years is when we've really had a big push," she said. "That was when social media started being a thing. That helped to reach out with marketing, and then as social acceptance of the LGBTQ community has come along, we've had more financial support with sponsors, more community support with straight allies, and we've been able to have this festival grow significantly."

The two-day festival takes place on July 26 and 27 and features a variety of activities aimed not just at celebrating the LGBTQ community, but also focused on awareness.

Fultz, who's been involved with Fort Wayne Pride for 19 years, said the organization is all about inclusion.

"My biggest belief in creating acceptance is education and visibility," Fultz said.

"The idea behind Fort Wayne Pride is we provide a place for people to be able to be

themselves, be who they are, to feel comfortable and free from judgement. For some people that's the only weekend of the year where they can do that. They can come out and be who they are and not feel like they're watching over their shoulder.

"Besides giving that place for people, it helps provide a place for people who don't know LGBTQ people or don't realize they know LGBTQ people."

A PARTY AND A PARADE

The kickoff party begins Friday at 7 p.m. and features local bands, a DJ, a beer tent, vendors, and food plaza.

Saturday morning's Pride March is the highlight for many. It starts at Headwaters East at 11:15 and winds through downtown before ending back at the park at noon, when the live music starts.

All afternoon, local acts from Churubusco,

Warsaw, and Wabash will take the stage, along with musicians from Colorado and even Vietnam. Singer Trey Pearson, who once fronted the Christian rock band Everyday Sunday, will perform at 7:30 p.m.

During the day, as many as 130 vendors will make up a vendor market. Kids can enjoy a special area that will include inflatables, games with prizes, a magic show, and character meet and greets. There will also be workshops with different educational topics, where an expert will present information followed by a Q and A.

The big finale is the drag show that starts at 9:30 p.m. on Saturday.

Admission to the festival is \$5 a day for adults; kids 12 and under are free. All ages are welcome, but children 5 and under are not permitted past 8:00 p.m. on Saturday because of the large crowds.

TIME TO BE THEMSELVES

Fultz and her team of volunteers look forward to what's become an annual celebration not just for members of the LGBTQ community but for others, too.

"When we started, the Klan showed up unexpectedly and were protesting," she recalled. "They had a rally down at the courthouse and then ended up showing up at our festival. I remember how we felt so alone and so scared. Now I think about how different it's become. There's not the fear that there used

"Now there are a lot of people who just stumble upon the festival, come in, and they end up having a great time and say, 'I'm going to be back.' It's been humbling to see something that you put a lot of effort into and watch it grow and be able to hear people who come up to you almost in tears. This is their time to be themselves and this is something they look forward to all year. It's a great thing to be able to be a part of."



Silky-voiced powerhouse keeps recording

McKnight packs songs new and old in The Clyde show

From his Broadway debut in Chicago to stints as radio and television host, musical powerhouse Brian McKnight has shown depth and talent in all aspects of a fickle industry.

But it's his smooth-as-silk voice that has brought him the most acclaim.

In a career that has earned him 16 Grammy award nominations and has taken him to major record labels like Mercury, Motown, and Warner Brothers, McKnight continues to win over new fans with his soulful interpretations of songs that run the spectrum.

BUFFALO BACKGROUND

His early days in music helped form the basis of his musical expertise, benefiting from both church choir and school band commitments in his hometown of Buffalo, N.Y.

"I am a product of every piece of music I've ever heard, played and/or sang and all of that began in Buffalo under the tutelage of my family, the church choir, my family's records, and the radio," he said. "Things I still incorporate into my music today are the very foundation of all I do."

Unlike some performers who have slowed down their recording career over the years, McKnight continues to release albums at a steady interval. His most recent is *Genesis*, which hit stores in 2017 just a year after *Better* joined his discography.

But this summer, McKnight releases *Bedtime Story*, his 14th studio album, which includes his new single "When I'm Gone."

There remains some division about whether releasing physical albums continues to be viable versus putting music out digitally. McKnight has chosen to defer that choice to his fans.

"I think both arguments are valid," he said. "I guess it just depends on how your fans feel about either getting one song at a time or getting an entire body of work. It's hard to judge right now."

DIGITAL FUTURE

As evidenced from his variety of projects, McKnight isn't afraid to try out new things. He recently connected with a new app called Video Request Line.

The company behind VRL announced their partnership with McKnight with a recent press release that explained how the app will work to connect performers and athletes with their fans.

"VRL is an interactive communications platform that allows recording artist, athletes, celebrity personalities, public figures, and more to connect with their fan base through personalized, custom video messaging," according to the press release.

Video Request Line joins McKnight's other busy social media platforms, including Instagram, where he shares both his professional and personal life with fans. His recent 50th birthday celebration was well documented, and he keeps fans abreast of his upcoming performances like his upcoming visit to The Clyde.

McKnight may have his irons in a lot of fires, but he said that performing in front of fans is still gratifying.

"When the audience anticipates a song that I wrote a bar or two into the intro and then they sing it louder than I do once the verse starts, it never gets old."

For fans counting the days until he comes to Fort Wayne, McKnight promises a show that is sure to delight those who have been with him since he released his self-titled debut album in 1992.

"My show is a complete retrospective of my career from beginning to now and everything in between," he said. "I'll be doing all of the hits and more."

Sun-drenched horror film grim, disturbing

riter/director Ari Aster follows up his terrifying feature debut *Hereditary* with *Midsommar*, another grim and disturbing tale that will no doubt leave audiences reeling once again.

While both are horror films that feature female protagonists struggling to cope with loss and grief, the narrative structures and thematic ambitions of the two vary drastically. The experience of watching these movies feels different as well: where

Hereditary is more of an immediate shock to the system, Midsommar lingers in the pit of one's stomach for days (and possibly weeks) after the fact.

Florence Pugh stars as Dani, a college student who seeks refuge in her emotionally distant boyfriend Christian (Jack Reynor) after a family tragedy claims the lives of both her sister and her parents. In an attempt to heal their relationship, Christian invites Dani on a summer trip to rural Sweden with his friends Josh (William Jackson Harper) and Mark (Will Poulter). Guided by Christian's Swedish friend Pelle (Vilhelm Blomgren), the group attends a midsummer celebration with the ancestral commune in Pelle's home village, but it doesn't take long before the rituals performed there take an unexpectedly sinister turn.

Aster returns with all of the formal rigor that made his first feature an instant classic of the genre. Starting with claustrophobic close-ups on Dani's anxiety-ridden face, he gradually pulls the camera back to transition into the sweeping wide shots that detail the creepy commune. Pawel Pogorzelski's hypnotic and woozy cinematography gives the impression that the camera is as sun-poisoned as the characters on-screen. The sound design is detailed and dynamic, using Dani's labored breathing at points in the film to ratchet up the tension while also bringing us closer to the main character in the process.

Unfortunately, Aster's control behind the camera isn't fully reciprocated in his undercooked and somewhat disheveled screenplay. Working from a folk horror premise not dissimilar from *The Wicker Man* (the original or the Nic Cage remake, if you like) or last year's

Apostle, he implements a few arbitrary subplots that distract from the main narrative at hand while leaving out crucial details of the central storyline as well.

Additionally, the attempts at foreshadowing feel clumsier and more telegraphed in comparison to the setups that Aster interspersed in his *Hereditary* script.

It all leads to a conclusion that is disappointingly predicable on a surface level but is loaded with resonant subtext and unforgettable imagery that leaves the film on a remarkable high note.

Bringing these final moments home is Pugh, whose stellar, emotionally-wrought performance is as crucial to the success of this movie as Toni Collette's was for *Hereditary*. As a wounded soul flailing helplessly in a toxic relationship, Pugh gives Dani an astonishing range of joy and pain upon which to paint her emotional journey and eventual catharsis. The rest of the cast, the majority of whom are adorned with eerily clean white linens and even eerier smiles, set the oppressively ominous tone quite nicely.


Midsommar is a sun-drenched symphony of sadness that solidifies Ari Aster as one of the strongest voices working in horror cinema today.







Marvel wins again with latest Spider-Man

arvel wins. Marvel always wins. Marvel is the biggest thing to ever happen to the movies. The most dominant single IP holder we've ever seen at the movies.

And, though it does seem as if people are finally (hopefully) cooling on super hero movies, *Spider-Man: Far from Home* took the No. 1 spot at an already-crowded summer box office with another \$45 million in sales, bringing the film's 10-day U.S. sales total to just under \$275 million.

The film, if you somehow don't already know, stars Tom Holland, Zendaya, Jon Favreau, Samuel L. Jackson, Marisa Tomei, and most notably, Jake Gyllenhaal in a performance that is getting a whole lot of attention.

If you're a regular ScreenTime reader then you know that I'm not really a fan of superhero movies. I like them here and there (*Unbreakable*, *Spider-Man 2*, *The Dark Knight*, and maybe like 12 others), but I've seen the irreversibly negative effect that they've had on the film industry and choose not to support them.

But hey, this new *Spider-Man* movie is supposed to be really good. I've read that it's something of a teen vacation film with Spidey themes woven in. That sounds very fun. And I love the cast. So yeah, I'll probably see this one eventually. (End rant.)

ALSO AT THE BOX

Pixar's *Toy Story 4* continued its historic run, taking the No. 2 spot at the U.S. box office with another \$20.6 million in sales, bringing the flick's four-week total to \$346 domestically and \$771 million worldwide. This one might not end up becoming the highest grossing film in the franchise, likely not passing *Toy Story 3*, as was

predicted.

Paramount's new Alexandre Aja-directed, Sam Raimi-produced horror flick, *Crawl*, surprised at the box office, taking the No. 3 spot over its first weekend of release with a stellar \$12 million in sales. Add in \$4.8 million in foreign returns and *Crawl* has already made a \$3.3 million profit. There will be a *Crawl* 2, I promise you.

Odd couple buddy comedy *Stuber* flopped over its first weekend of release, taking the No. 4 spot at the box with just \$8 million in sales. Ouchie. Luckily this flick cost only \$16 million to produce despite being a pretty flashy action film. I hear it's actually very good. Can't wait to see it.

And finally, at the No. 5 spot, we have Danny Boyle's "what would the world be like if The Beatles were never a thing" movie, *Yesterday*. The flick sold another \$6.7 million, bringing it's 17-day worldwide sales total to a respectable \$80 million. Danny Boyle can't lose. But, really, it's hard to lose when you have the Beatles catalog available to you.

Also of note, the brilliant *Midsommar* continued to fill seats, bringing in another \$3.5 million, upping the new classic's 10-day sales total to a decent \$18 million. Director Ari Aster's last film, *Hereditary* (also a masterpiece) ended up selling \$44 million. Looks like *Midsommar* will do similar numbers.

This Ari Aster guy, he's the real thing I think. It'll be interesting to see if he can move away from horror.




