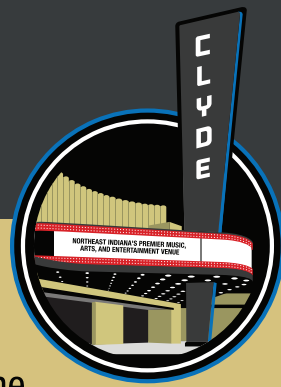

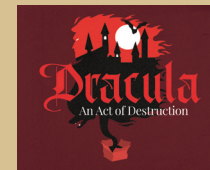
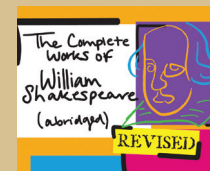

# It's all about belief for psychic reader at Embassy Theatre

## Caputo invites audience to believe in own healing

Theresa Caputo knew she was different from a young age.

No, this isn't about her love of big hair.

It's about her ability to talk to the dead, although her love of big hair is another of her distinctive traits.

Caputo, who will bring a show of psychic readings and personal reminiscences to the Embassy Theatre on Sept. 17, said it wasn't until she reached her twenties that she accepted and embraced her gift for communicating with the deceased.

"(When I did that), I felt complete as a person," she told the *Des Moines Register*.

"I share that part of the story of my life with people because, in some way, shape, or form, we at times feel different."

We all do feel different at times, although most of the ways we feel different don't involve conversations with dead strangers.

### BELIEF IN THE AFTERLIFE

There are plenty of people, some of them prominent, who doubt Caputo's gift.

"I respect that it's hard to understand what I do," she said. "Whether someone believes them, it doesn't matter to me. (There are people who) believe in what I do."

She said her goal is not to prove to anyone that she's not lying about her abilities. It's to get people to believe that there is a world beyond the one in which we exist while alive.

"I want them to believe in themselves, to believe in an afterlife, to believe and to know the things they're sensing and feeling that reminds them of their loved ones that have died is real," Caputo told the *Wilkes-Barre Times Leader*.

"They're not crazy, it's not their imagination, it's not wishful thinking. That it truly is them and it's real and just to embrace it and to know that they're little hellos from heaven."

When she connects with a soul, she feels it throughout her entire body.

"It's almost a cooling chill. That's when the soul moves through me," Caputo said.

She went on to explain that other bodily responses have different meanings.

"[...]I don't know how this works," Caputo said. "All I know is that when I connect with a spirit, I start to sense and feel things that mean

absolutely nothing to me, but it's life-changing to the person standing in front of me."

### AND BELIEVE IN YOURSELF

Not every audience member gets a personal reading from Caputo, of course, but she said that everyone who attends her show is likely to walk away changed by the experience.

"People say all the time that they didn't know what to expect when they walked into that theater, and, even if they didn't personally get read, they'll say that what they did witness was absolutely life-changing," Caputo told *New Orleans Living Magazine*.

"Because what happens is that it might be something in my speech that touches them, or they hear something through someone else's reading, or it may be something that they feel or experience during the show themselves that touches them, and that is really the main thing of why I do what I do."

No matter how a loved one dies, survivors "are left with burdens and guilt and these do not give us the ability to heal," she said.

"There's no right or wrong way to heal," Caputo told the *Corpus Christi Caller-Times*.

"But if you're beating yourself up about a loved one's passing, you are not allowing yourself to heal.

"I want people to believe in themselves and have a life-changing moment," she said. "The only thing that's planned (in my appearances) is my hair and shoes — and that's it."

# A half century of country rock rolls into town at Pavilion show

*Pure Prairie League to give fans what they like*

For over five decades, Pure Prairie League has cemented itself in country rock music history with 50 changes in the band's membership over the years. What started in Ohio as a group of friends playing cover tunes turned into a successful and influential band in the genre.

Their hit "Amie" from the 1972 album, *Bus-tin' Out*, peaked at 27 on the U.S. Billboard Hot 100 after its re-release as a single three years later. The track's 1988 remaster has amassed over 42 million streams on Spotify.

In fact, the track's immense radio popularity prompted record label RCA to re-sign the band that they had previously dropped, according to a biography about former Pure Prairie League member Vince Gill.

The country rockers will play at the Sweetwater Performance Pavilion on Saturday, Sept. 18, at 7 p.m.

a major influence. Longtime bassist Michael Reilly, who joined the band in 1972, cites Crosby, Stills & Nash, Merle Haggard, and The Byrds as some of the band's own influences.

"Poco, actually, was an early influence on us," Reilly said in an interview with *Whatzup*. "Their first album just knocked our socks off."

Since the 1970s, Reilly has welcomed and bid farewell to a number of different members who have come and gone from the band. After having disbanded in the late 1980s, the band surged back a decade later. While they have not released a studio album since the mid-2000s' *All in Good Time*, Pure Prairie League continues to tour today.

"As of 2020 we have had 50 different members, you know, through the group all those years," Reilly said.

He said that through these changes in the band's lineup, they have always aimed to stay true to their craft.

They also made sure that whoever joined the band was not only easy to get along with, but a fan of the band.

"We've always been really lucky about finding those kinds of people," he said, citing Vince Gill and Gary Burr as examples.

Today's lineup includes Reilly, Randy Harper, Donnie Lee Clark, Scott Thompson, and early member John David Call.

"Right now, the band is one of the best bands I've ever had," Reilly said. "The thing is, I got kind of swept into the position of de facto leader and band leader and 'boss' and stuff like that. It was something that I wasn't totally unprepared for, but that's always been a labor of love. It's a lot more work but it's also important to me to keep it 'Pure Prairie League' and not try to be somebody else, or not try to be the 'Mike Reilly Band.'"

It has been these personnel changes, Reilly explained, that have been the biggest difficulty

through the past several decades.

"When somebody wanted to leave, I never stopped anybody," he said. "If this is what you want to do, this is your career — it's your life. The decisions you make are the decisions that you live with and the decisions that I have to live with, as well. We always sent everybody off with a 'good luck' and 'stay in touch.'"

"We were just lucky in finding the right people, but I think the simple laws of attraction dictate that, you know? You put it out there in the right way, the right person is going to come to you."

## FUN AND EXPERIMENTAL

Reilly mentioned that he enjoyed working on a number of different albums, including some of which experimented with different genres and influences in their composition.

"Well, I love *Two Lane Highway*, I really like *Can't Hold Back* because that was Vince's first album and we tried doing some newer types of music. We did everything from salsa to a little bit of jazz influence, to blues to country to, you know, 'top music.' That was a fun album to work on."

*Can't Hold Back*, released in 1979, was the band's final album with RCA before signing to Casablanca Records.

Reilly noted that as the band released more albums, he could hear improvements in each. "It's also very gratifying to know that the

decisions that I was making were leading toward a better product," he said.

Reilly himself joined the band after they called him to be on their second record.

"I had seen Pure Prairie League play in 1970 on a show in Cincinnati that they were the opening — the first act. And I saw them play and I'm like, 'Wow, I love what these guys are doing, and I'd like to be in that band someday.'"

## READY FOR THE PAVILION

One message that Reilly gave fans is, "Know what you like, go after what you want, and I applaud their good taste in listening to Pure Prairie League."

Reilly added that not only will it be a "great pleasure" to play at the Sweetwater Pavilion in September, but also that it is one of his "favorite places."

"I think it's going to be a great show," he said. "People are going to enjoy it, and we're really looking forward to it."

The Why Store will also be performing at the Pavilion that evening. After the band's major label debut with MCA Records, they performed on *Late Night with Conan O'Brien*. In 2016, The Why Store released a live album, *Live at the Slippery Noodle*.

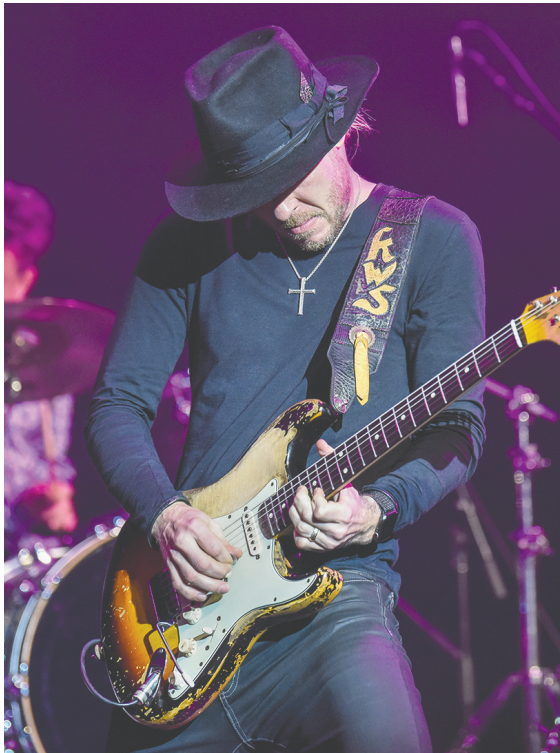

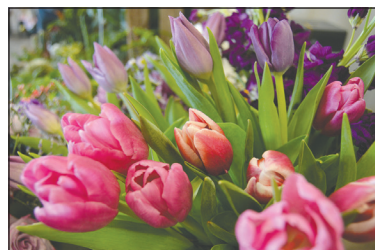

Tower of Power are in the midst of their 53rd year of making music. Pioneers of a distinctive, brass-fired take on soul and funk, the band has been nearly impossible to label, thus appealing to fans of many genres of music. TOP has released 26 albums and have had eight songs on the Billboard Hot 100, including their highest-charting songs "You're Still a Young Man," "So Very Hard to Go," "What Is Hip?" and "Don't Change Horses (in the Middle of a Stream)."

Originally from Oakland, Calif., at least 60 musicians have toured or recorded with the band throughout their half-century career. Regardless of who has come and gone, the core of the band has always been its horn section, still led by original members Emilio Castillo and Stephen "Doc" Kupka.

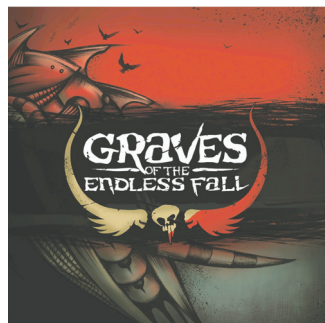

### NEW FOLK ROCK BAND

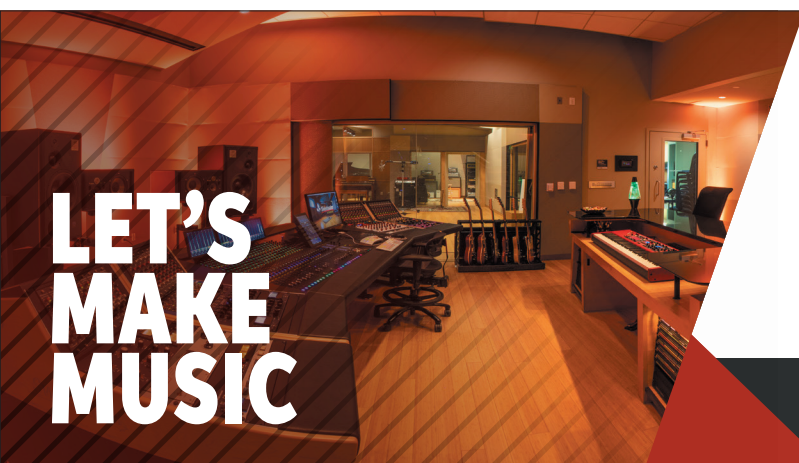

# Hornsby invites listeners to join him with music not stuck in past

*He plays packed house at the Clyde on Sept. 19*

There is a tradition at Bruce Hornsby concerts of fans writing requests on little slips on paper and throwing them onstage. This sound likes a great deal for the fans, but what they might not know is that Hornsby uses these slips to take their measure.

“When I get a group of requests when it’s all ‘Mandolin Rain’ and ‘End of the Innocence’ and ‘The Way It Is’ and ‘Valley Road,’ I think, ‘This crowd is not a crowd that’s stayed with me through my crazy peripatetic wanderings.’” Hornsby told the *Ithaca Journal*. “It’s a crowd that’s stuck in the past. So I say, ‘OK, good luck! I hope you like what I’m doing here, because it’s not what you came here for!’”

Hornsby will bring his peripatetic self to the Clyde Theatre on Sept. 19.

## BEYOND THE 1980S

Most people know Hornsby as the pianist and composer who scored several pop hits (cited above by the man himself) in the 1980s. In 1987, Hornsby won the Grammy for Best New Artist. Nothing to sneeze at. Yet, three years later, he was given ample reason to sneeze.

“I was like, ‘Great, I share this award with Milli Vanilli,’” Hornsby told the *Charleston (W.Va.) Gazette*.

“Let’s face it, the Grammys are not at all about how good you are at what you do. It’s not like winning Most Valuable Player in the NBA. It’s not really quantifiable. What’s mostly nice about it is that my mom’s friends are impressed with it.”

Hornsby owes his initial success to a certain kind of music, but, mostly, he hasn’t wanted to

keep making that kind of music.

He has collaborated with Bob Dylan, Chaka Khan, Pat Metheny, and the Grateful Dead. He has put out solo piano records and records with no piano on them. He has released bluegrass and jazz albums, and composed Broadway musicals and movie soundtracks. He has even been known to perform classical pieces in his concerts.

“I just think anybody who has followed what I’ve done realizes I haven’t been too concerned with fitting into people’s expectations of me,” Hornsby told the *Arlington Daily Herald*. “I’ve always changed, and I’ve gotten letters that say, ‘How dare you?’”

“There are some artists who make the same record stylistically over and over again, and they remain very popular. Other artists do that and fall by the wayside because people get bored. You’re damned if you do, damned if you don’t. So, I just followed my instincts.”

## RULE #1: DON’T BE BORED

His instinct is to first make music that doesn’t bore him, and it’s one that aims for audiences being as excited by his musical discoveries as he is.

“One of my interests I’ve had as a musician

is to be a bit of a crusader trying to open people’s ears to different things,” Hornsby said. “In my playing you can hear Bill Monroe as well as Samuel Barber piano sonatas. It’s been my goal to broaden horizons of people who hear popular music all the time.”

One group whose horizons have been broadened by Hornsby is rappers. His music has been sampled in many rap songs, including Tupac Shakur’s hit “Changes.”

“I loved that. I also loved the checks! It’s a beautiful definition of ‘money for nothing,’” Hornsby said. “To me, his was the best version. It’s a positive message and I’m really proud he was a fan enough to, in his own way, co-write a song with me.”

Another guy who has indicated that his horizons were broadened by Hornsby is Bon Iver’s Justin Vernon. Vernon appears on Hornsby’s 2019 album *Absolute Zero* and Hornsby appears on Bon Iver’s 2019 album *i,i*.

Some of the songs on *Absolute Zero* grew out of snippets Hornsby composed for director Spike Lee’s projects over the years.

“I’ve written 230-plus pieces of music for Lee, ranging from one minute long to four minutes,” he told the *Minneapolis Star-Tribune*. “Lots of these instrumental pieces

— we call them cues — are fully formed. They wanted to be developed into songs. Fully six or seven of the songs on *Absolute Zero* have their origin in Spike Lee film cues.”

It was a “crazy, intangible, strange process,” he said, “putting words to an already completed musical picture.”

## A NOD TO NOSTALGIA, TOO

If you’re reading this and realize that you haven’t kept yourself fully apprised of Hornsby’s forays in recent years — or decades — the artist does have some sympathy for you.

“There’s not enough hours in the day to keep up with what Bruce Hornsby is doing — or Bruce Willis, or Bruce Babbitt, for that matter,” he said with a laugh.

“There’s too many Bruces, and Bruce is not even a common name! Forget all the Jims and Bills and Bobs!”

If you are worrying that Hornsby won’t perform his hits in his upcoming Clyde concert, set your mind at ease.

“I know it’s nostalgic for fans to hear some of the oldies, and I’ll placate them with about five songs,” he told the *Richmond News*. “But if all I did were the oldies, I’d feel like I was in a prison.”

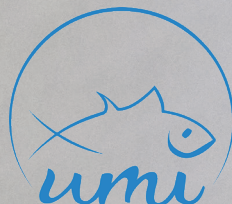

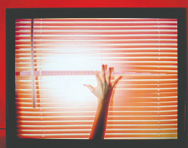

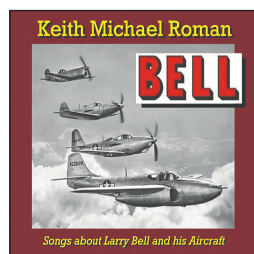

# Spins LOCAL AND NATIONAL ALBUM REVIEWS

## Keith Michael Roman Bell



Musician, history teacher, and aviation buff Keith Michael Roman has put all of his loves into one concept album titled *Bell*.

*Bell* tells the story of American industrialist Lawrence D. Bell, an aviation innovator who founded Bell Aircraft. Bell was born in Mentone, Ind., in 1894 and lived there until the age of 13.

On the album, Roman makes a musical story about Bell's early life, various aircrafts that Bell developed for use in WWII, and the development of the helicopter. Musically, the album is rather proggy — imagine King Crimson; Emerson, Lake, and Palmer; and Yes given the task to teach a course on aviation history with Moody Blues adding a few notes for good measure. It's an odd listen, but an engaging one.

Twelve tracks lay out a history of the one-time Mentone native-turned-aircraft-guru in great detail. Roman isn't interested in getting into the personal life of Bell. He just wants the facts about his airplanes. Throughout the album we learn about the P-63, the XP-77, the P-59, the X-1, and the X-2. Strewn throughout are old radio and film reel clips from the '30s and '40s giving us a narrative connection to the past, while Roman builds the musical world of Larry Bell with drums, keys, guitars, bass, and even a gong. Quirky vocal inflections and story-song lyrics carry us along.

"The Sky Is Not the Limit," opens and closes the album. There's more to it than the surface meaning of the phrase, whether it's planes, people, or a state of mind.

Roman is both a teacher and a musician here, making a concept album about an innovator that many people may not know. He's created an intricate prog album that probably won't appeal to Lil Nas X fans, but those of us that still have tattered vinyl copies of *Brain Salad Surgery*, *Starless and Bible Black*, and *Roundabout* in our collection will find something to dig.

## Billie Eilish Happier Than Ever



At this stage, it's difficult to remember that Billie Eilish is only two albums into her career. She stormed out of the gate so convincingly, telling us how hard it was to be a famous pop star, that we lost sight of the fact that she wasn't quite a famous pop star yet. Although she is now.

*Happier Than Ever* leans even harder into exploring the difficulties of 21st-century fame. Fortunately, Eilish isn't a one-note artist, and this second album hints at a lot of potential that

she and her writing partner and brother, Finneas, could realize in years to come.

Eilish is still a teenager, but her upbringing by actor/musician parents likely gave her a head-start on the contemplation of fame. At times, the obsession can be worrying, like when she says, "things I once enjoyed just keep me employed now," on the track "Getting Older."

If she's this burned out at this point in her career, how much more can we expect from her? Of course, our expectations of her are the problem she's dealing with, but sometimes it seems as if the possibility of a creative flameout may be a self-fulfilling prophecy.

Billie and Finneas continue to show a knack for creating atmosphere and catchy melodies. On this new album, they branch out a bit musically. Pure club tunes like "Oxytocin" aren't very adventurous, but elsewhere the duo tries new things. The dreamy "my future" can't decide if it's '60s lounge jazz, '70s R&B, or '90s trip hop, but whatever it is, it's appealing.

The world of pop stardom is heartbreakingly fickle. The pop star who finds fame at a young age is rarely able to hang on long-term. Eilish seems to be preparing herself for the worst career possibilities. *Happier Than Ever*, though, is a reason to hope that she's wrong. — *Evan Gillespie*

## Darkside Spiral



The last we heard of Darkside, the collaboration between Nicolas Jaar and Dave Harrington, the two had put their spacey music project on hiatus. Their sonically rich debut *Psychic* came out in 2013, but by 2014 it seemed Darkside had dissipated into the ether.

Then last year the duo returned with the single "Liberty Bell," which saw them back to their '70s, Pink Floyd-meets-Tangerine Dream aesthetic, but with more emphasis on Jaar's vocals.

Now, Darkside's sophomore album *Spiral* is here. The band continues to evolve from the pristine production of debut *Psychic* while opening up their sound and letting in some light.

The sound of Darkside has the free-floating vibe of *Dark Side*-era Pink Floyd. The meticulous production of Alan Parsons and the bluesy swagger of David Gilmour's guitar lines permeate their sound. Even further, these two add elements of Tangerine Dream, NEU!, modern electronic music, and even ambient sound. They have created something unique.

The first single off *Psychic* is the epic "Golden Arrow," which establishes Darkside as a project to watch. "Liberty Bell" was the first sound from their sophomore release. While not quite 11 minutes, the song continues the band's knack for groove and feel. Slide guitar, Jaar's restrained vocals (which bring to mind Beta Band's Steve Mason), and some tasteful acoustic guitar all give the song an almost Latin flavor.

"Inside Is Out There" continues that Latin vibe with hand percussion and flamenco guitar. Of

# Backtracks CLASSIC ALBUMS

## Steeleye Span Parcel of Rogues (1973)



Formed around 1969, this folksy band traveled across Europe and had little recognition in the States. This album had some success as they opened for Jethro Tull. It's probably their most recognizable release.

Over the last 50 years, they and their revolving group of members have produced about 25 albums, including this gem with traditional music that was based on a Robert Louis Stevenson book.

"One Misty Moisty Morning" starts things off with a folk sound that evolves into a prog-rock track with Maddy Prior and her lovely vocals.

"Alison Gross" picks it up with trip-folk guitars behind crisp vocals from the brilliant instrumentalist Tim Hart.

Soft and melodic, almost medieval vibes drip from "The Bold Poachers." There is folk in "The Ups and Downs," and it steps right into the trippy "Robbery with Violins," which celebrates the English/Celtic genre.

They take it into a different direction with the children's ballad "The Wee Wee Man." It's one of the few tracks with percussion, and the lyrical content is dark, but it still has a cool arrangement that fits the time.

Prior and her vocals in front of a violin make "The Weaver and The Factory Maid" one of my favorites from an album with many high points. There is more traditional folk in "Rogues in a Nation," a Scottish number about the dangers of nationalism. There's also a surprise rock song in "Cam Ye O'er Frae France."

Folk music never really left rock n' roll, but this was the peak. Bands like this knocked it out of the park. — *Dennis Donahue*

course, Darkside adds electronic flourishes to give it an almost psychedelic feel.

"Narrow Road" has a dream-like quality, opening on ambient sounds and an electronic drone that lays just under the surface. The vocals have a chant-like quality, and the instrumentation goes a long way to give the track an otherworldly feel.

Title track "Spiral" brings to mind late-era Radiohead in its dark and mysterious production. It's heavy in mood and sound.

*Spiral* is a welcome return for one of the more interesting musical collaborations in recent years. Let's hope Darkside doesn't wait another eight years to give us a new album. — *J Hubner*

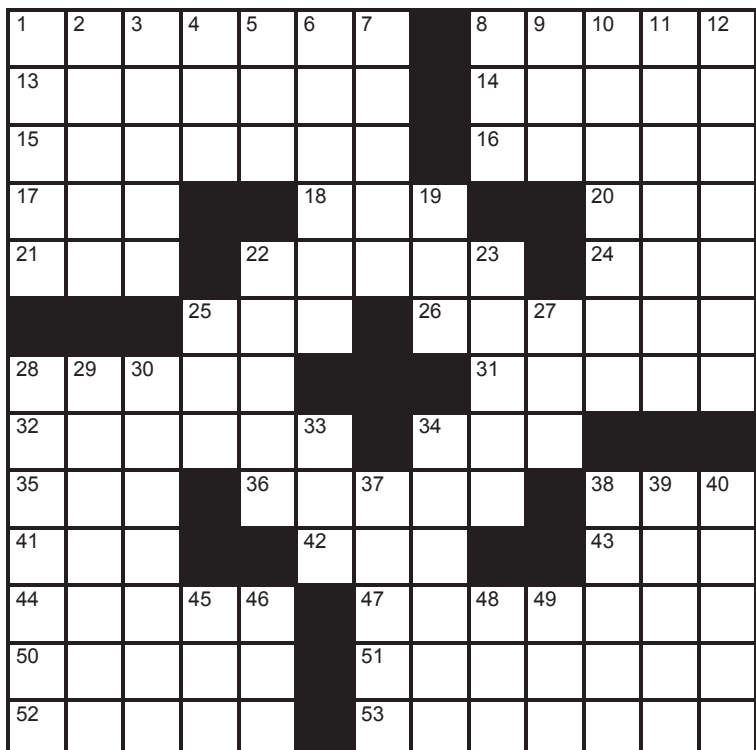

## Newest Marvel flick wins over critics, audiences

Destin Daniel Cretton's first major studio work, *Shang-Chi and the Legend of the Ten Rings*, took the No. 1 spot at the box office over the Labor Day weekend, selling a very solid \$71.4 million domestically over its first three days of release. 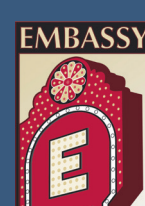

# Netflix offering full of action, but not much else

Netflix's newest action-packed offering *Kate* stars Mary Elizabeth Winstead in the titular role as a ruthless, Japan-based assassin working under handler and father figure Varrick (Woody Harrelson).

Ten months after a botched job in Osaka, Kate contemplates early retirement before Varrick chides ("Two trips to Walmart and you'll be back") and convinces her to take one last assignment. High atop a Tokyo skyscraper, she lines up her shot but gets violently ill. A doctor gravely confirms acute radiation poisoning soon afterward.

With roughly 24 hours to figure out who tried to have her killed, Kate storms her way up the Yakuza pecking order while unwittingly recruiting an impressionable young girl named Ani (Miku Martineau) along the way.

*Protégé*, both released within the past few weeks) are vying to be the next *Jane Wick*, even though few, if any, women are involved in the creative decisions behind these projects.

Along with writer Umair Aleem, director Cedric Nicolas-Troyan seemed to look to the work of fellow Frenchman Luc Besson a bit too closely. *Kate* borrows liberally from the "ticking time bomb" conceit of his *Lucy* along with the assassin-with-a-heart-of-gold feel (and even a specific Gary Oldman line) from *Léon: The Professional*.

Thankfully, Nicolas-Troyan's background in visual effects for *The Huntsman* and *The Pirates of the Caribbean* franchises translates to some kinetic action scenes that make up *Kate*'s backbone. Easily the most impressive is a superb *Kill Bill*-esque brawl in the film's first act, which includes brutal beats like Kate reloading her gun off of a baddie's face and pure white shojis being painted with streaks of red.

A subsequent street shootout showcases more dynamic gunplay with some neat camera tricks that are just the right amount of showy for this sort of movie. By the time we get to the final showdown, the outcome seems inevitable, but the staging and editing still allow us to suspend our disbelief up to the last moment.

## RUNNING OUT OF GAS

Though it's well under two hours, *Kate* sadly peters out around the end of the second act. Much of that can be attributed to the remove at which the protagonist has held nearly every character in the film. It was around that time that I simply stopped caring about Kate, her motivation, and her goals.

Winstead is a talented actress, but she's stuck with a one-note character whose coldness and single-mindedness become laborious after a while. She does have some quality bonding scenes with Martineau, who pushes things a bit too hard, but I can't say that I felt fully

convinced of their relationship and its consequences on the story. While it's not totally uncommon for an all-out action movie like this, nearly every other character is essentially just fodder for Kate to eventually cut, shoot, or stab through.

Perhaps it's an issue of timing more than anything, but after seeing Asians be featured so thoroughly and colorfully in *Shang-Chi*, it's a bit depressing to watch *Kate* offer so little for its Japanese characters. While that Marvel outing had its narrative letdowns, it should be commended for filling its story with characters who had agency and development every step of the way.

If Asian-cast characters aren't being served up one by one to the violent protagonist in *Kate*, they're whispering platitudes about honor and family that ultimately have no bearing on the outcome of the narrative.

I'm not expecting an action movie to give every henchman a backstory, but after watching Asian representation being built up on-screen over the past few years, *Kate* feels regressive in its efforts to sideline its non-white characters.

Streaming on Apple TV+ is *Come From Away*, a live stage recording of the 2017 musical of the same name, which tells the true story of 7,000 passengers who were stranded after the 9/11 terrorist attacks in a small town in Newfoundland.
