# Take a big bite of Nappanee Apple Festival

*Fritter away your time with food and activities*

Be thankful that Nappanee isn't inviting you to bite into a caramel onion.

The Nappanee Apple Festival will celebrate 45 years when it returns Thursday, Sept. 16, with more than 170 commercial and craft vendors, as well as more than 20 food vendors.

But before the apple festival, the city had an onion festival in the 1930s-50s.

Maynard Miller, who has been involved with the apple festival and has seen it grow over the past several decades, recounted the ideas and local history that brought it into existence.

"In the south of town, they had huge growers who would do onions for processing," Miller said. "Well, over the years that sort of died out, and in 1975 a bunch of the chamber's people and the townspeople got together and said, 'Let's start a festival.'"

Because there was a sizable apple orchard on the southwest edge of town, the hopeful organizers decided to base the new festival on the iconic fruit. This orchard just so happened to be owned by Miller's parents.

"It was a small event," he said, "and over the years it just progressed."

## LOTS TO DO AND LOTS TO EAT

This year, a cornhole tournament will take place on Saturday, Sept. 18, at noon at the Nappanee Elementary School Gym. The cost for this competition is \$40 per team for a chance at the potential \$2,000 purse. Pre-registration can be found at the festival website, and event-day registration begins at 10:30 a.m.

The festival's 5k walk and run will also be held on Sept. 18, at 10 a.m. and will start at the Eastlake Athletic Club on East Market Street. Pre-registration can be found at the festival website for \$25, and race-day check-in and registration will take place from 8:30-9:45 a.m.

Walkers participating in the 5k will begin their race at 9:50 a.m. Cash prizes will be awarded to the overall top three male and female runners. More information about the race can be found at the festival website.

A parade with an airplane flyover will follow the 5k race on Saturday at 10:30 a.m. and will start at the corner of Miriam and Market Streets. The parade will continue west until its end at City Hall on Locke Street.

The Wings and Wheels car and airplane show

will take place on Saturday, Sept. 18, from noon to 4 p.m. at the airport. Airplane rides will be free of charge to first-time flyers ages 8 to 18 with parental consent.

The festival will also host carnival rides downtown on South Main Street for \$20 on Thursday, Friday, and Sunday, as well as for \$25 on Saturday.

The Napple Baking Contest will take place on Sept. 18, at 8:45 a.m. with registration for the contest beginning at 8 a.m.

From Thursday to Saturday, festival goers can experience sawmill demos, wheat threshing, hand baling, steam engines, and an apple press.

The young children's Apple Dumpling Photo Contest will be held from Sept. 16-19. Photos will be displayed at the Gazebo at the Depot Plaza, and the public will use money to vote for winners. The top three kids win cash prizes, as well as a picture frame, when the competition ends Sunday afternoon. For contest registration information visit the festival website. All entries are due by Sept. 15.

The Miss Apple Blossom Scholarship Pageant takes place on Thursday, Sept. 16, from 7-9 p.m. at the Country Cabinets Entertainment Tent.

The Chicago Boyz Acrobatic Team will perform several times on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday in the library parking lot. The group has made a number of television appearances, including *America's Got Talent*, *The Ellen DeGeneres Show*, *The Steve Harvey Show*, and *Good Morning America*.

Comedy juggler and ventriloquist Mike Hemmelgarn will perform on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday at both the Depot Plaza and the Martin's

The Grandpa Cratchet kids puppet show will make a number of appearances during the apple festival from Thursday to Sunday in the library parking lot.

The live animal show Silly Safaris will also take place at the plaza on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. According to their website, the mission of Silly Safaris is to "create positive human animal interactions that inspire responsible pet ownership and wild animal conservation."

The Nappanee Center will host a Quilt Exhibit on Friday and Saturday, Sept. 17 and 18, from 9 a.m.-7 p.m., as well as Sunday, Sept. 19, from 1-5 p.m.

A garden tractor pull will take place on Saturday, Sept. 18, at 5 p.m. with registration one hour prior.

Festival goers can also see a giant, 7-foot baked apple pie at El Cielito Lindo Mexican Restaurant on West Market Street.

To help stop the spread of COVID-19, hand sanitizing and wash stations will be available for use throughout the festival.

# Candlebox to light up the Clyde Theatre on Sept. 22

*Bite into band's new  
album, classic tunes*

Singer Kevin Martin and his Candlebox bandmates had 2020 all planned out. They would release their seventh studio album, *Wolves*, in the fall, then head out on the road for the remainder of the year to support it. But, like just about every other blueprint for 2020, those plans changed.

Now, a little more than a year after the first expected release date, *Wolves* has found its way to store shelves and streaming services. The band will play some of the tunes from that album, along with the hits you already know, when they stop by The Clyde Theatre on Sept. 22, with special guest The Dead Deads.

## RELEASING ALBUM INTO THE WILD

In an interview with *Whatzup*, vocalist Kevin Martin said that he's happy to finally be able to share *Wolves* with fans.

"We've been sitting on this album for two years," he said. "The record was recorded in August (2019), I spent September, October, November, and December working on the lyrics, and went into the studio in January of 2020 to finish the vocals. That was done on Jan. 12, it was mixed by Feb. 15, and was supposed to come out in August of last year. So we're excited to finally get it out."

*Wolves* was written and recorded in a unique fashion compared to Candlebox albums of the past, so it may sound a bit different as a result. But this album isn't so much of a departure that it will alienate fans. An evolution would be a good way to describe it.

"It's kind of bipolar," Martin said of the new album. "It's a record that has deep valleys, very high peaks, and great mood swings in it."

He also said the band didn't put boundaries on themselves when it came to creating the songs this time around, which was something they had done a lot in the past.

"If we liked something that we were doing and it led us where we wanted it to lead us, we finished it and recorded it. That doesn't always happen with Candlebox," he said. "Out of the seven records I've recorded, I can only think of six or seven times where we've allowed a song to just go where it wants to go

and record it, so it's really exciting for us to be able to do that. The eleven songs on here are just so different than anything we've done and so different from one another. They're just great rock songs. I hope people like it as much as we do."

## CORNELL CONNECTION

Of particular note on *Wolves* is the song "Let Me Down Easy," written with Peter Cornell, brother of late Soundgarden singer Chris Cornell. Martin said he hadn't seen Peter Cornell in about 25 years but reunited with him when Candlebox did some 20th anniversary shows in Seattle celebrating their debut album.

"Pete was older than Chris and really the first musician in that family and such a driving force around Chris and his sister and the musicality of that family," he said. "That had everything to do with Pete."

Martin went on to say that when he reunited with Cornell, he had been in the process of reconnecting with some old albums and was getting into the swampy side of blues. Knowing Cornell was a brilliant slide guitar player, he asked if he would be interested in writing a song with him.

"Not too long after that, he sent me this song on acoustic with some kind of mumbled

lyrics and melodies and I thought, 'This is exactly what I want to do,'" Martin said. "I sent it to the guys to see what we could do with it and it came so quickly in preproduction that I immediately started writing lyrics."

"I sent a rough demo to Pete and said, 'This is where I'm feeling it.' He said, 'Man, that's exactly what I heard.' I love that track and I think it was very cathartic for him to get back into writing. He hadn't written anything since Chris passed, and, for me, it was a real honor to be able to write with somebody of his talent," Martin said.

## NEED TO CREATE

A band that has survived long enough to say it has a career that spans three decades has obviously seen a lot of changes in the music industry. Whether or not an established band like Candlebox needs to release new albums is debatable. But Martin said, as a musician, he needs to remain creative and have an outlet for distributing the songs he writes — whether it is on an album or via some other means.

"I think that musicians in general have to be creative," he said. "In its infancy, art is beautiful and it allows you to go into places that you

wouldn't normally go.

"I think it's important for artists to create all the time, and, when it comes to music, I think it's very important for musicians to create because it's what keeps us young and what keeps us connected to what it is that we do and that gift that we've been given. I don't know if it's important for musicians to release records, but I think it's important for musicians to release songs."

## LOVING FORT WAYNE

Because a majority of fans go to a Candlebox show to hear the songs that initially made them known, Martin said he and the band are obligated to play them at just about every stop. He doesn't get tired of playing them, but at times he does get frustrated that he doesn't get to play a lot of newer songs.

"If I could play five songs from the first album and 15 from the last three or four, I'd be way happier," he said. "I'm not allowed to do that, so it's about 33 percent debut album and 67 percent of the other six records, but I think we're going to play four or five off the new record this time around because it's a pretty slammin' album."

Fort Wayne has been a live destination for Candlebox ever since the band began touring to support their debut album, playing here a dozen or so times over the years. Martin has fond memories of the city.

"I love Fort Wayne," he said. "The people of Fort Wayne are amazing. I'm really looking forward to coming back. I just love that town. I'm a big fan of Fort Wayne."

It's arguable that Cream was the first supergroup. Eric Clapton, Jack Bruce, and Ginger Baker joined forces and created songs like "Sunshine of Your Love," "White Room," "Dance the Night Away," and, of course, "I Feel Free," timeless classics that still receive airplay on classic rock stations across the world.

Fifty years later, the band led by Ginger Baker's son, Kofi Baker's Psychedelic Trip, is a celebration of Cream's genre-blurring virtuosity. Displaying many of the outstanding skills his late father had, Kofi Baker often performs with The Music of Cream, a band brought to life with the late Jack Bruce's son, Malcolm, on bass and Eric Clapton's nephew, Will Johns, on guitar.

Other times, Kofi Baker performs as a part of his own band, which you can see at Baker Street Centre in Fort Wayne on Saturday, Sept. 25.

While not playing the music of Cream exclusively, Kofi Baker's Psychedelic Trip still manages to capture

Cream's mood and energy while adding the distinctive styles of the original trio. They play many Cream hits alongside other gems of the era, including selections from The Beatles, Jimi Hendrix, and Blind Faith, pulling the audience along for the ride into a vortex of psychedelic rock, blues, avant-garde, and hard rock.

Across the board, these guys nail the sound and feel of Cream's era without sounding or feeling like a tribute band. — *Chris Hupe*

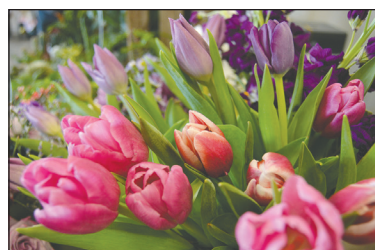

# Top-selling Christian artist relauches her tour at the coliseum

## Writer of 'You Say' welcomes back fans

Contemporary Christian music singer and songwriter Lauren Daigle is heading out on tour again, and her first stop is the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum in Fort Wayne on Friday, Sept. 24, at 7:30 p.m.

After being rescheduled due to the pandemic, Daigle is finally hitting the road for her headlining world tour.

Following the Fort Wayne concert, she'll stay in the state and perform the next evening in Evansville.

Daigle's 26-date tour begins with the Indiana shows, and wraps up on Nov. 19, in Nashville, Tenn.

According to Music Row, her new tour will feature all-new stage production, design, and plenty of Daigle's hits. These hits include her latest No. 1 single "Hold on to Me," the platinum-selling "Rescue," and the four-time platinum No. 1 single "You Say," as well as songs from her previous platinum-selling album, *How Can It Be*.

### THE HITS KEEP ON COMING

Three hit songs were produced from her debut album in 2015, *How Can It Be*. These

songs include "First," "O' Lord," and the Grammy-nominated "Trust in You."

Then, in 2018, Daigle released her second platinum studio album, *Look Up Child*. This album earned Daigle her second Grammy Award after debuting at No. 3 on the Billboard Top 200 Album chart.

With this album came one of Daigle's most popular songs, "You Say."

This song was triple-platinum and was the longest-running No. 1 song to appear on any weekly Billboard chart.

The hit song marked many milestones for Daigle, such as topping *Billboard's* Adult Contemporary chart for multiple weeks, a top five position on its Hot Adult Contemporary chart, and a top 20 position on its Top 40 Singles chart.

Along with those successes, *Look Up Child* also included platinum selling single "Rescue" and gold certified singles "Still Rolling Stones" and "Look Up Child."

In August 2021, Daigle's *Look Up Child* hit its 100th week at No. 1 on *Billboard's* Top Christian Albums chart, breaking the record for the most time on top of the chart in the

list's 41-year history.

In response, Daigle told *Billboard* in an online interview how special it is that music really can be timeless.

"Throughout the record-making process for *Look Up Child*, I remember saying I just wanted it to be a timeless body of work," Daigle said. "I want it to be something that even in 20 years, 30 years, people can still pull up and listen to."

Daigle shared with *Billboard* that the album's success has taken her by surprise.

"It really blows my mind," she said. "I would say I had desired that it would be successful, but to see how effective it has become has been really beautiful."

### FROM LIVE TO STUDIO

As she prepared for her tour, Daigle also released the studio version of "Tremble," which she's only performed live before, in August 2021.

"Lately, I've been looking back on what an incredible ride this song has been on," Daigle wrote in a Facebook post. "The studio release

of 'Tremble' feels uniquely special, being that it's been a part of our live shows for a while now, and it totally feels like setting a part of myself free into the world."

### OUTREACH

Aside from her music, Daigle established the Price Fund in 2018, a global foundation devoted to assisting those in need through community initiatives and outreach.

The Price Fund has worked with organizations including the Ellis Marsalis Center, Young Audiences of Louisiana Charter School, Roots of Music, Kid Smart, and the New Orleans Center for Creative Arts.

Recently, the foundation has partnered with Love Does and Bob Goff. Through this partnership, they will be constructing a school in the Congo, which will serve more than 300 children in Goma, a conflict zone near the border of Rwanda.

Daigle announced on her Facebook page that in addition to the school rebuild, they are going to provide income for the teachers who are now dealing with the aftermath of a true tragedy, a volcano explosion.

"I'm so grateful for the opportunity to help these people — and I hope you'll join in the work that needs to be done to provide these students with quality education, assist in character development, peace building skills, conflict resolution and leadership," Daigle wrote in a Facebook post.

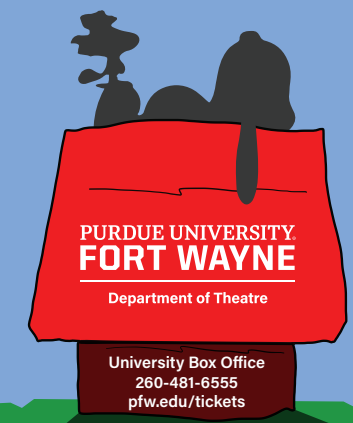

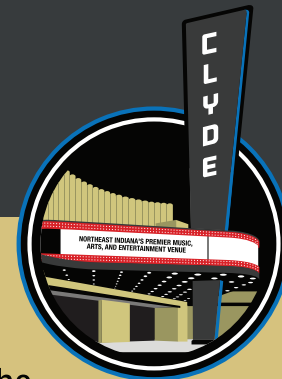

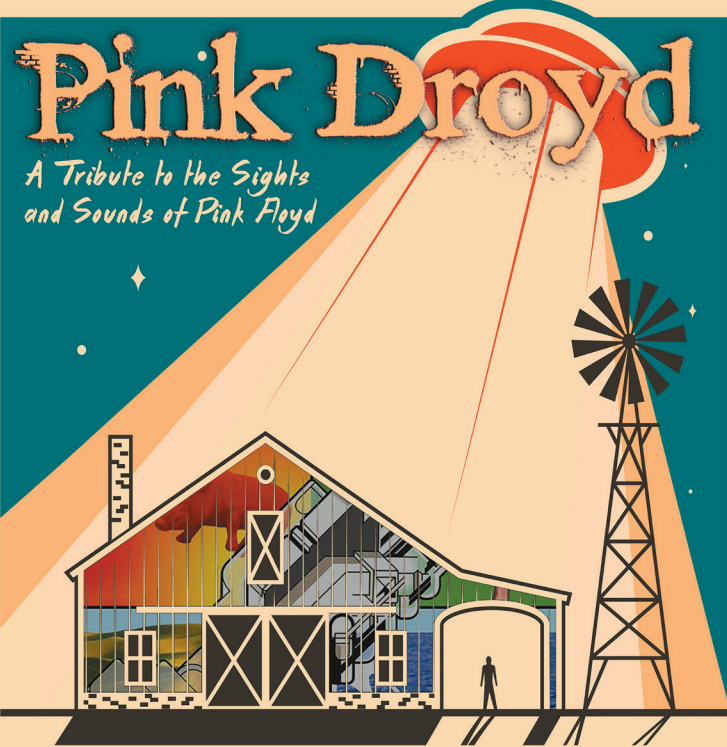

**Chris Young**

*Famous Friends*



*Famous Friends* is Chris Young's first album since 2017's *Losing Sleep*. In the current era of early single releases, the new album seemingly dropped without much sense that we'd been waiting a long time for new music from him.

The album kicks off with two singles that have already had their moment in the sun: 2019's "Raised on Country" and 2020's "Famous Friends."

Beyond that, it serves up standard contemporary country fare and zero surprises.

It's way past time for noting the irony in a song like "Raised on Country," which boasts about country roots while relying entirely on hip hop rhythms and blues rock guitars.

Still, *Famous Friends* does back off a bit from the more overt R&B styling of *Losing Sleep*. Acoustic guitars are pushed more toward the front, and Young's twang is emphasized. You're not going to get any in-your-face steel guitar or banjo, but it's clear which audience the album is trying to appeal to.

The album moves back and forth between slick love ballads (which are all R&B influenced) and beer-based party tunes. The latter are standard country raps, but they range from the shout-along crowd-pleasing "One of Them Nights" to "Hold My Beer Watch This," a slinky tune you could line dance to if you wanted.

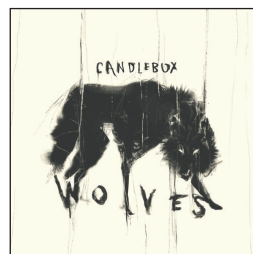
The only thing that *Famous Friends* leaves out is the requisite tear-jerker about honky-tonk regret. "At the End of the Bar," a duet with Mitchell Tenpenny, is an odd song that sings the praises of drinking establishments without resorting to party-hard foot-stomping, but it's still very much pro-saloon.

"When You're Drinking" almost admits that drinking can lead to bad decisions, but it does so in a non-committal way.

More than anything, the album avoids pushing any boundaries. As a result, *Famous Friends* is likely to be more palatable than *Losing Sleep* to fans who want their pop country to be a little more Southern rock and a little less Motown. — *Evan Gillespie*

**Candlebox**

*Wolves*



Candlebox hit the scene with their self-titled debut in 1993. They were a hard rock four-piece coming out of the over-saturated Seattle music scene that was still reeling from the great grunge takeover of 1991.

Candlebox stood apart from their hometown's contemporaries in that they made straight-up alternative rock that veered closer to Jane's Addiction than Tad. With the strong vocals of

Kevin Martin and groove-heavy rhythm section, Candlebox positioned itself as a band that could satisfy both the metalheads and alt-radio listeners alike.

Nearly 30 years after that hugely successful debut, Candlebox release a new album called *Wolves*. Singer Kevin Martin leads a new group of musicians but still manages to capture the vitality of that debut with 11 new tracks.

"All Downhill From Here" opens *Wolves* on a chugging riff and bombastic drums. Kevin Martin laments on the time spent playing rock and roll and its excesses like a veteran of some war filled with debauchery and broken dreams. He can still hit those notes, despite the whiskeys and women of yesteryear.

"Riptide" is the other side of that coin, with poignant piano and balladry the band always balanced well on past albums. "My Weakness" veers almost into Lifehouse and Blue October territory, crossing the line into adult alternative domain.

Thirty years in, sometimes you gotta act your age, right? This is a pretty good fit for the band.

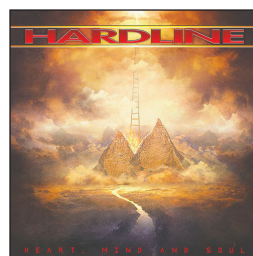
The band veers into bluesy, country vibes with "Let Me Down Easy." "Lost Angeline" is even more of a straight-up jangle rock track. Once again, this is a good fit for Kevin Martin's weathered vocals. His voice has aged well, with a touch of Tesla's Jeff Keith coming out in these dusty tracks.

Not every band can last a decade, let alone three decades, especially when that band sports only one original member.

But it seems Kevin Martin has kept the spirit of rock n' roll alive and well in Candlebox. *Wolves* is a solid rock banger with something for everyone. — *J Hubner*

**Hardline**

*Heart, Mind and Soul*



Hardline first appeared on the scene in 1991 when brothers Johnny and Joey Gioeli joined forces with Journey guitarist Neal Schon. The band released *Double Eclipse* in 1992, charting three singles. Schon left the band shortly after to work on other projects and eventually rejoin Journey, but the Gioeli brothers kept the band afloat.

Now, three decades later, Johnny Gioeli is still at the helm of the ship and the only original member left. But he is still churning out hook-laden rock on the band's seventh studio album *Heart, Mind and Soul*.

Frontiers Records' go-to guy, Alessandro Del Vecchio, is a big part of this offering as his layered synths play an important role, much like his songwriting.

Gioeli is still the star of the show, displaying range in rockers "Fuel to the Fire," "Heartless," and "Waiting for Your Fall," all while doing justice to softer moments on "Heavenly."

The rest of the band is solid with guitarist Mario Percudani showing off his soloing skills on the scorching stand-out track "If I Could I Would" and bassist Anna Portalupi and drummer Marco

**Boston**

*Boston (1976)*



Boston, I can honestly say, was probably the first album I ever purchased with my own money. I remember hearing "More Than a Feeling" on the radio, and the harmony, guitars, and vocals hooked me.

They weren't the greatest band to come out of Boston, Massachusetts (that would be Aerosmith), but they definitely had an original sound. It wasn't Black Sabbath, Foghat, or Kiss. It wasn't pop or folk rock. It was the beginning of a new sound entirely.

They sang about feeling good, enjoying life, and being in love. They didn't do it in a sappy, James Taylor sort of way either. The chorus on "Peace of Mind," for instance, says, "People livin' in competition...all I want is to have my piece of mind." It is an anthem of the mellow, unselfish 1970s.

In the romantic rockers "Something About You" and "Let me Take You Home Tonight," we are taken back to the hard-rock-ballad days. Boston told their story in "Rock and Roll Band," and "Smokin'" is a rockin', boogie-woogie jam.

One of the trademark sounds of Boston is the organ. Yes, they played a Hammond and a Wuritzer, but blended it nicely with the guitar work of Ohio native Tom Scholz. Members Barry Goudreau and Brad Delp, who met at MIT, also had musical chops. These guys were smart and fantastic musicians.

The follow-up record in 1978, *Don't Look Back*, wasn't bad, but the albums they have released since then have been average. The sound is there, but the writing is not.

Boston tour sparingly and have two, sometimes three, original members along with them.

They have added a female singer to the band, as well. I know, I thought that was weird, too. — *Dennis Donahue*

They even have a little fun with "80s Moment," a song that pays homage to the hard rock style of that decade.

While under the radar to most rock fans for the better part of three decades, Hardline continue to hold their own, churning out some really fine rock n' roll.

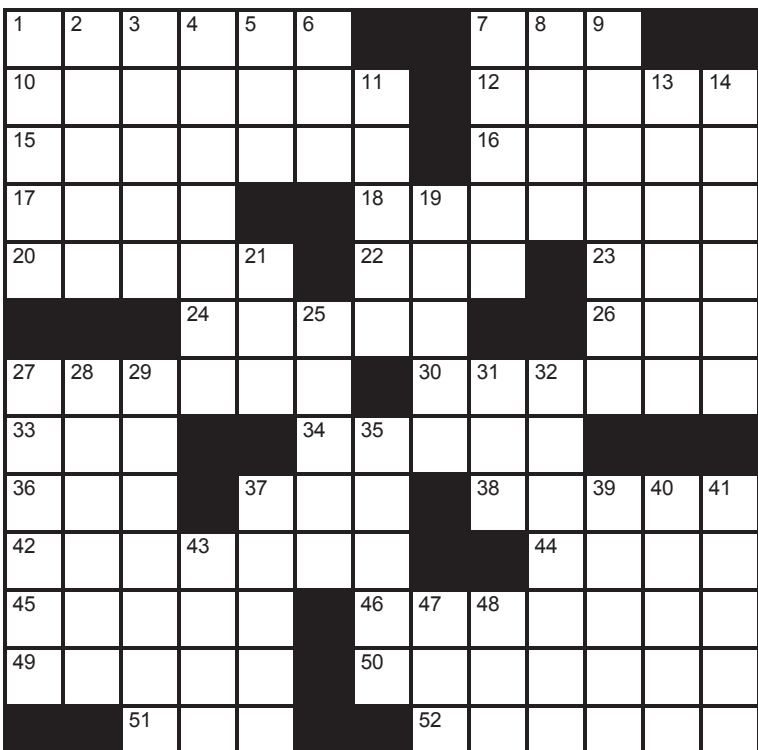

## Strong showing at theaters even with football on

If you're not yet a Schrader loyalist, I suggest you take a look at his filmography. He's capable of greatness, and I think this one might be on that spectrum.

Studios feel weird this time of year. They're hesitant. A huge part of the population is starting school and another is starting to spend all their time away from work watching football games. That being said, the releases might be a little weird for a few weeks.

Eventually, not long from now, we will enter the amazing Oscar bait season, in which a mix of horror film and prestige films color the screens. I can't wait.

With more crime scenes piling up, Madison works with her sister Sydney (Maddie Hasson) and a beleaguered detective (George Young) to put a stop to the brutal violence.

## IN GOOD DIRECTORIAL HANDS

Those worried about another rote scare fest should be heartened by the fact that *Malignant* is helmed by none other than James Wan, the mastermind behind the *Insidious* and *Conjuring* franchises. More pertinently, this is the man who made cars fall from the sky in *Furious 7* and made a CGI octopus play drums in *Aquaman*, which mirrors the kind of devil-may-care attitude he brings to his return to the horror genre.

Wan's direction here is reminiscent of the over-the-top supernatural aesthetic pioneered by *Evil Dead* creator Sam Raimi, who sadly hasn't made a horror film since 2009's minor camp classic *Drag Me to Hell*. I was also reminded of the lesser-known, Ti West-directed *The House of the Devil*, which chugs along like a mild-mannered haunted house movie until its bombastic finale. And boy, does *Malignant* ever have one of those itself.

This is a film that dares you to solve what's really going on in real time and, if you've seen a horror movie in the past 50 years, there's a good chance you'll guess the broad strokes of what screenwriter Akela Cooper has cooked up. But the devil, as they say, is in the details, and

Wan saves the most outlandish reveals for the third act, paying off some clever bread crumbs of foreshadowing while taking things further than the *Conjuring* crowd may anticipate.

In this way, *Malignant* has the most in common with another Wan feature that kicked off a mega-franchise: *Saw*. As in that surprise 2004 success, he peppers in loads of visual cues from moodily lit shots of decaying bricks to a skulking, trench coat-wearing killer who moves like the Jigsaw Killer from the *Saw* movies.

As distinct an impression as *Malignant* leaves in its final 30 minutes, I wish the film had been a bit lighter on its way there. Wan and his editor Kirk Morri could've cut off about 15 to 20 minutes from the runtime and I doubt much would have been missed. A movie like this really shouldn't stick around much longer than it needs to, lest the audience give themselves time to subject the narrative to further scrutiny and uncover plot inconsistencies.

There's also heavy subject material at the beginning, involving miscarriages and child abuse, that is tonally inconsistent with the kind of campy conclusion that Wan is ultimately setting up.

*Malignant* could have used a bit more of a surgical approach to carve out its scares, but Wan proves that, even with blunt instruments, he can get the job done.

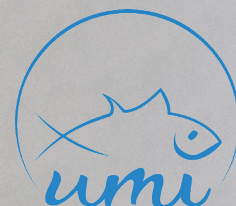
