

Chicago tribute band from Russia exceeds skill of original group

Leonid & Friends brings its faithful renditions

October concertgoers will have the opportunity to witness the result of a YouTube collaboration among friends on the other side of the world that went viral.

Leonid & Friends, a group covering songs by the classic American rock band Chicago, will play at the Clyde Theater on Wednesday, Oct. 27.

There's one catch to this group, however — no one in this global cover band has ever seen Chicago perform live. In addition to this anomaly, these talented musicians come from Russia, Ukraine, Moldova, and Belarus.

REINVENTING THE SOUND

Leonid Vorobyev is the leader and founder of the group, but also fills a number of other roles in his work with Leonid & Friends.

Vorobyev acts as a producer for the band, in addition to playing bass and piano, singing lead and backing vocals, and transcribing all the musical scores so that the musicians can accurately replicate the jazzy sound for which Chicago is known.

Vorobyev also plays the producer role in all of the cover band's audio and video creations.

The band's official website recounts that, after retiring several years ago, Vorobyev "decided to give himself a gift to celebrate his retirement by recording a cover version of Chicago's 1975 song, 'Brand New Love Affair.'"

However, because there were not any scores of the single available for musicians to use, he transcribed the song by ear. Vorobyev and his friends recorded the transcribed music. That launched the collaborative project now known as Leonid & Friends.

CLASSIC MUSIC

Some of the band's influence and interest in Chicago comes from the lack of availability of certain instruments when Vorobyev was growing up.

"In the early 1970s in the U.S.S.R., electric guitars, amplifiers, and drums were rare to find, so at school we were playing self-made instruments," Vorobyev explained on the band's official website.

"We were allowed to rehearse in the same room with a horns band. Those musicians almost always were drunk and quite often tried to play with us our rock songs. It was a nightmare, and I hated them all!"

The musicians collaborating with Vorobyev to bring Chicago's classic tracks to the stage have their own extensive experience in the music industry.

Vasilii Akimov is a vocalist and guitarist for the band. According to the band's website, he has won a number of international music competitions. He has also been a member of Russian rock band Monomakh.

Igor Javad-Zade is the drummer for Leonid & Friends.

Javad-Zade has "collaborated with musicians in Russia and from various foreign countries," according to his online biography.

Another vocalist that plays guitar for Leonid & Friends is Serge Tiagniryadno, who was born and lives in the capital of Ukraine. There, he runs his recording studio, Crystal Sound. He studied to be a television and film director at the Karpenko-Kariy Kiev National University of Theatre, Cinema and Television, and also received education at the Kiev Institute of Theatrical Arts.

In addition to vocal and guitar work for Leonid & Friends, Tiagniryadno also plays bass guitar, clarinet, saxophone, percussion, drums, and keyboards.

Since 2020, Sergey Kurmaev has played keyboards and provided backing vocals for the

group. Born in Kyrgyzstan in 1980, he enrolled at a local music school to study accordion at age 8. His early successes led the Kyrgyzstan National Conservatory of Music to award him admission to continue studying piano.

According to the band's website, during his first concert with the band, Kurmaev said, "When I saw Leonid & Friends on YouTube, I thought myself maybe one day I would play in a band like this. But now I'm here, it's a magic, thank you my God, and I very glad to be part of Leonid & Friends. Thank you very much, thank you for trust and I want to see our friends in the future."

MATCHLESS COVERS

Audiences may be surprised to find how well the cover band matches the original Chicago style.

Rich Jorn, director of a venue in Owensboro, Ky., saw the band perform in 2019. He told *The Messenger-Inquirer* in mid-October that, while he means no disrespect, "If you bought a ticket to see the current lineup of Chicago and bought a ticket to see Leonid & Friends, Leonid & Friends is the better band. They're gonna sound more like Chicago than Chicago."

The Messenger-Inquirer also reported that concert goers may even hear songs from artists like Blood, Sweat & Tears, Earth, Wind & Fire, The Rolling Stones, and Steely Dan.

The band embarked on three U.S. tours in 2019, the first year that they had toured outside of Russia. During a visit to Los Angeles, the group met two founding members of the original Chicago band, as well as the daughter of the late Chicago guitarist Terry Kath.

"We were so thrilled that Robert, Danny, and Michelle took the time to visit with us," Vorobyev recounts in an interview on the band's website. "It was an experience that we will cherish and remember forever."

Music born of struggles and family history

Christian artist made the best of shutdown

Grammy award-winning Christian artist Zach Williams will bring his *Rescue Story* tour to the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum on Friday, Oct. 29.

While the COVID-19 pandemic forced Williams to reschedule his tour, he expressed to *Whatzup* that there were positives to the global shutdown, calling it “a nice time of reconnecting with family and friends that I hadn’t seen in a while.”

FINDING THE FANS

Even in the midst of the pandemic, Williams found a unique way to continue playing live music in front of his fans.

“We were fortunate enough in September of last year, we started going out,” Williams told *Whatzup*. “We had a promoter that kind of figured out this drive-in movie theater model.”

According to Williams, these drive-in theater shows gave fans around 60 concerts from late 2020 into May 2021, calling the idea a “Godsend.”

“We were so grateful just to be out on the road,” he said. “We were a small percentage of bands that were actually out touring.”

Shortly after resuming the *Rescue Story* tour, Williams contracted COVID-19 in late July 2021 and had to quarantine for 10 days.

“For about three days when I had COVID, it was pretty rough,” Williams said. “But for the last seven days I was in quarantine, I didn’t have any symptoms or any fever and so it wasn’t too bad on me. The biggest thing I was concerned about was getting back out and playing a full show and feeling like I had the energy to do it because I was still pretty run down.”

PERSONAL EXPERIENCE IN MUSIC

His Fort Wayne performance comes just over two years after Williams released his latest album, *Rescue Story*, in October 2019 — an album Williams penned with his own personal experiences and struggles in mind.

He said the inspiration for *Rescue Story*, and for his music in general, is “always just the things I’m going through in that season of life where I’m at. I’m always trying to write from some personal experience of something I’ve been through. And also I try to write songs that everybody can relate to in a way because most of us go through the same things.”

According to his website, in Williams’ past,

he had been “seduced away by the illusion of rock stardom, and the drug and alcohol excesses that can so often accompany that lifestyle.”

Now, however, Williams is a “renewed man.” This conversion is evidenced by Williams’ song of choice on *Rescue Story*.

Williams said that his current favorite track on the 2019 album is “Slave to Nothing.”

“Obviously I’ve been a slave to many things in my life and had a lot of issues and things go on, but not anymore,” he said. “So that’s kind of what that song says.”

Williams also thanked his fans for telling him stories about how his music has helped them through their own struggles.

“I think it’s awesome when you hear stories from people who hear these songs, and it’s helping them through a situation that they’re going through in life because obviously that’s why you’re writing them. Your hope is that people are going to hear these and it’s going to impact them in a way that’s going to set them on a different course.”

“And then for me,” Williams said, “once the songs were finished, you know, we had all these songs written, and you kind of put these songs together in a way that kind of tells the story of your life in that season. For me, I thought the appropriate title was *Rescue Story*, and we had this song called ‘Rescue Story,’ and so it’s kind of like, ‘You know, that felt like the lead song, the lead single,’ and it felt like it told the story of every song on that album.”

MORE GRAMMYS

Rescue Story is the artist’s sophomore followup to his 2017 solo debut album, *Chain Breaker*, which earned Williams his first Grammy award. Another Grammy would follow for “There Was Jesus,” a track on *Rescue Story* that featured renowned country singer Dolly Parton.

In May 2021, Williams topped Billboard’s Christian Airplay Chart for the fourth time with “Less Like Me,” another one of the tracks that can be found on *Rescue Story*.

In addition to these achievements, Williams has won six GMA Dove Awards.

Williams says that family led to his tastes in music and inspired his work.

“I listen to all sorts of music for inspiration,” he said. “Obviously growing up in the South,

where I grew up, kind of in Arkansas, my grandpa listened to country music. So I was always listening to Jerry Reed and Willie Nelson, and Johnny Cash and Merle Haggard, and Waylon Jennings and things like that.”

“And then I had uncles who listened to Southern rock,” he remembered, which exposed Williams to rock classics like The Allman Brothers Band, Bob Seger, Bad Company, and Lynyrd Skynyrd.

Williams’ father was a church worship leader, which also influenced the country singer’s taste in music.

“It was kind of a melting pot, and so for me

it’s still that way. I love to just listen to things that are kind of current but also listen to things that feel classic and then take inspiration from those and try to come up with my own sound.”

Two other performers will take the stage that evening. We The Kingdom and Cain will also perform at the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum on Oct. 29.

Cain, a trio composed of three siblings, released their first EP in early 2020. The band released a remixed version of their hit song, “Rise Up (Lazarus),” featuring Zach Williams in 2021.



With 24 No. 1 Billboard Blues Albums — more than any other artist in history — it might surprise some that Joe Bonamassa did not rise to fame meteorically but had to build his career in the music industry steadily over the years.

Fort Wayne was a pivotal city in those early days as Bonamassa received a lot of support from local radio, helping him to gain an audience that demanded he play here on several occasions.

Now often hailed as one of the greatest guitar players of his generation, Bonamassa is showing no signs of slowing down. Check the coolest sport in the Fort

Komets look forward to a full season after two years of delays

Few things are as uniquely Fort Wayne as Komet hockey.

Win, lose, or overtime shoot-out, generation after generation, the team has woven its place into the heart of a community.

On opening night, which is Saturday, Oct. 23, the team will raise a Kelly Cup banner and hand out championship rings and lift the lid on a season they hope returns the Komets to that special place of honor.

The 2021-22 season has a very clear objective: keep it simple and bring back the magic.

RETRIEVING WHAT MAKES THE GAME GREAT

"It's nice to get hockey back and get things a little bit closer to normal," said Josh Testin, the team's director of sales and promotions, in an interview with *Whatzup*. "With everything that's been going on the last couple of years, what better way to start opening night with all the different things that we've got going on?"

With COVID-19 sidelining the team for parts of two seasons, the game experience was much more subdued.

Now, Testin says it's time to welcome back the traditions and game day experience that has anchored the team to Fort Wayne for 70 years.

"We're trying to get back to what it was like two years ago," Testin said. "Last year, so much was taken away from us. We didn't start until February. We weren't able to do a lot of the fun things that we normally do."

Opening night is always a celebration and a homecoming of sorts with a mix of the team's past with a homage to legendary players and coaches from the past and an extended intro for the 2021-22 team.

Hanging a championship banner is something the team hasn't enjoyed for nearly a decade.

"It's been a few years now since we've had a chance to do that," Testin said. "2012 is the last one that we had one. It's the feeling of coming back as the champion and everyone wanting to beat you. Just the visual of it and the participation of our crowd. They are always there to embrace it."

NEW URGENCY

Coming back from COVID adds a new dynamic and a new urgency for fans.

When the puck drops at 7:30 p.m., Testin expects the crowd to be explosive. So he wants to reward their patience and loyalty.

Even with greatly reduced crowds and safety protocols, fans and sponsors stood by the team throughout the pandemic.

"Our fan base showed us this last spring and summer they were eager to come back out and attend games again," he said. "We hope that continues into the fall."

The recipe is more than just winning games and entertainment. Komet hockey is a way of life. Fans sit in the same seat season after season. They have become part of the Komets family.

Testin enjoys watching the fans every game.

"We have more than 3,500 season ticket holders," he said. "You come into any one of the sections and they all know each other. Even if they haven't seen each other for months, the connection is still there. It's fun to watch the interaction."

FAN-FAVORITE EVENTS

The team opens up with fan favorites early in the season.

Friday, Nov. 5, is the teddy bear toss. Testin said it's an emotional night for everyone in the Komet family. During that game, fans flood the playing surface with thousands of stuffed animals. Each bear finds a home with a child with an emotional or financial need.

"We ask our fans to bring in new or gently used stuffed animals, and then when the Komets score their first goal, everybody throws their stuffed animals," he said. "It's a sight to see."

November also has military appreciation night on Nov. 13, pet detective night on Nov. 20, and the Bob Chase memorial game on Thanksgiving.

Testin believes one of the reasons the franchise has endeared itself for decades is because of the game's entertainment value.

"Our cheapest ticket starts at \$14, and our most expensive is just \$30," he said. "If you are looking at options in Fort Wayne or surrounding cities, you are going to have a hard time finding a night of fun with affordability like that."

Testin said the Komets partner with sponsors for game promotions and tickets. He points to the Fill-up promotion with Marathon stations.

On Sunday nights, fans get a chance to skate on the ice after games.

"Bring your skates and get on the ice," Testin said. "That's always a great experience."

More special nights include princess night on March 27 and Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles night on April 8.

Throughout the season, the team hosts Kids Seat Free nights where kids get free tickets with every adult



Indian choral pioneer to perform at PFW

*Kanniks will also offer free
Indiana classical workshops*

Dr. Kanniks Kannikeswaran may not be a household name, but he is considered a pioneer of the Indian American choral movement.

Popularly known by his first name, Kanniks is an Indo-American musician, composer, music educator, and writer with a number of recordings, productions, and scores to his credit. No matter what projects he is involved with, the multi-faced vocalist is consistent with his vision of building community through the celebration of threads of commonality between diverse peoples and culture.

Based in Cincinnati, he is often described as “The Magic Musician from Madras” for creating a new territory in music by fusing Indian classical music with traditional western choirs.

“Indian music systems are ancient and the approach to music is very different from that in Western Art Music,” Kanniks said in an interview with *Whatzup*.

He acquired an interest in Indian sacred music growing up in Madras, India. There he graduated with a bachelor’s degree in engineering from the Indian Institute of Technology Madras.

He eventually came to the U.S. to attend engineering graduate school and ended up staying. Although he is a technology engineer by trade, it’s obvious that his life is music. That is portrayed with his contribution to the Greater Cincinnati Indian Community Choir, which he established in 1994 to explore polyphonic avenues in raga-based music.

The choir has performed sold-out performances at the Aronoff Center and received two silver medals at the 2012 World Choir Games in Cincinnati.

By popular demand, he also started Indian choirs in Washington, D.C., Houston, Tampa, Fort Lauderdale, Minneapolis-St. Paul, and Toronto among other cities. He hopes that someday Indian choirs will catch on around the world.

MAGNUM OPUS

His magnum opus, *Shanti: A Journey of Peace*, has touched the lives of more than 2,000 performers and has been winning over audiences in major cities for more than a decade. It is an expansive and collaborative performance that explores the meanings of peace, joy, and the interconnectedness of all humanity through dance, music, and images of India, set to Western orchestral symphony.

One of his latest projects is “Rivers of India,” a music video that appreciates water resources and raises awareness about the importance of preserving them. It was released on Earth Day, April 22, of this year and tells the story of the growing dependency of an increasing population on rivers, human exploitation of water resources, and its consequences. The hope is that all will unite and to work towards protecting water resources.

Another music video he recently produced is “Yog Darshan: The Story of Yoga,” that has Kanniks melding music, yoga, history, and architecture in a grand view of how the history of yoga is intertwined with the history of the Indian civilization. These videos are on YouTube.

A MASTER PERFORMER AND TEACHER

Kanniks has lectured broadly on Indian culture with music workshops and diversity training at numerous educational institutions, corporations, and cultural organizations nationwide. Good news for us, because he will soon head to Fort Wayne for a two-day residency at Purdue Fort Wayne’s Rhinehart Recital Hall.

“I had visited Fort Wayne in the 1980s and looking forward to this visit,” Kanniks said.

On Thursday, Oct. 28, at 7:30 p.m., Kanniks will hold a lecture and performance that will present an aural journey through the sound-worlds of Indian classical music. He will demonstrate the structures of alap, bandish, and dhrupad in an informal manner, followed by formal performances.

Then, on Oct. 29 at 11 a.m. and at 1:30 p.m., he will hold a workshop that will orient folks to the history and origins of Indian classical music. Participants will engage in listening and discussion about elements of Indian classical music such as raga, tala, shruti, instrumentation, genres within the classical tradition, and various formal structures.

His workshops have been hailed as being informative and comprehensive and have earned praise from various audiences.

“Audiences will join a curated journey through various compositional forms of Indian music and experience the musical cultural ethos of this tradition,” Kanniks said. “The workshops will involve ‘sing along’ passages, and will engage the audience in rhythmic exercises as well. There will be some multimedia and storytelling as well.”

Soldier Field one Midwest stop on tour for Coldplay

Coldplay revealed its return to the road when they announced the “Music of the Spheres World Tour.”

On the run of dates, the band likely won’t over-extend themselves as they are scheduled to play from three to six stadium shows every month from March to August before closing the announced run of dates with a headlining appearance at Rio De Janeiro’s Rock In Rio Festival.

The tour begins in Costa Rica on March 18 and includes 11 stadium dates in North America. The one in our region is May 28 at Chicago’s Soldier Field. **H.E.R.** will open all the North American dates.

In true Coldplay fashion, the band revealed during the tour announcement that the tour would be “as environmentally beneficial as possible,” as it includes plans to cut direct emissions by 50 percent compared to the band’s previous tour in 2016 and 2017.

The shows will be powered “entirely by renewable, super-low emission energy” and each venue the band plays will host solar installations and a kinetic stadium floor will store power “in the first-ever mobile, rechargeable show battery.”



Tony Bennett and Lady Gaga

Love for Sale

Love for Sale is automatically in an unfair position for more than one reason. We know already that it's Tony Bennett's final album because the 95-year-old singer's recent Alzheimer's diagnosis is going to make recording again impossible.

The album is also the second collaboration between Bennett and pop superstar Lady Gaga in which the pair cruise through jazz standards.

So we've got a predetermined landmark album that's certain to come under fire from jazz fans who don't think a pop singer should be allowed to sing jazz. It seems like a definite no-win situation.

That falls apart if you actually listen to the album with an open mind. The album is a collection of Cole Porter tunes, just the kind of winking standards that are best suited to Gaga's persona. Even now, Bennett's voice lacks only a fraction of the power it once had, and there's barely a hint of lost sharpness in his delivery. For her part, Gaga doesn't hesitate to lean into the songs, and only rarely does she falter.

The songs' arrangements tend to hold back a bit, conjuring more of a lounge atmosphere than an over-the-top spectacle befitting two legendary performers. Yes, it's simple fun, but let's not lose sight of the fact that simple fun is all that Cole Porter songs have ever been.

You can complain all you want that the album is a cynical attempt to cash in on the success of the duo's first collaboration. But to do that, you'll have to avoid the question of whether the album is worth paying for. It is. — *Evan Gillespie*

Dee Snider

Leave a Scar

Dee Snider has talked about retiring within the next couple of years, not wanting to continue his chosen career past the age of 70 (he's currently 66).

However, "I Gotta Rock (Again)," the opening cut from his newest solo album, *Leave a Scar*, makes one think he may be reevaluating that plan. Lyrics like "Be a lifer 'til I'm gone," "Won't stop 'til I drop," and "Yes, I wanna rock until the day that I die" really leave little doubt.

Teaming up with Hatebreed's Jamey Jasta as he did on 2018's *For the Love of Metal*, Snider continues with the harder sound displayed on that album, perhaps even kicking it up a notch on one of 2021's best metal albums.

Jasta's influence is heard all over this disc, but this isn't a Hatebreed album with Snider singing. While the bulk of the material has a harder metal edge than one might expect, the songs draw from a variety of influences. Several songs, like "All or Nothing" and "Open Season," fall into the thrash



category, while "In For The Kill" and "S.H.E." are straightforward aggressive rockers. Old-school metal is represented here as well, though it's a far cry from the radio-friendly fare Twisted Sister is best known to offer. "Before I Go" and "Silent Battles" sound like they could have been included on Dokken's 1985 album *Under Lock and Key* and the intro to "Crying for Your Life" brings to mind *Love at First Sting*-era Scorpions. Undeniably, "Time To Choose" is the star of the show, though, with guest vocalist George "Corpsegrinder" Fisher of Cannibal Corpse fame adding some additional "oomph" to Snider's lyrics.

With the release of *Leave a Scar*, it's clear that Snider and Jasta have a chemistry that seems to have re-energized the aging rock star. Snider's voice sounds as strong as ever and he seems extremely confident in his new sound. Even if he plans to retire soon, it's clear that Snider, a man who made his mark on the world of music for many years, isn't satisfied with resting on his laurels; he's going to go out with a bang.

As the the album closer "Stand" says, "Don't leave your mark, leave a scar." — *Chris Hupe*

Steve Moore

Gone World

Steve Moore has kept pretty busy despite a slow time for working musicians. Moore work includes a killer track on the Behind the Sky compilation *Portals*, Zombi's excellent 2020, a series of covers this year under the Zombi and Friends moniker, the collab album *Liminal Migration* with Bluetech, a new Zombi ep earlier this year, and plenty of score work.

Now we now have a brand new solo Steve Moore album to sink our teeth into. *Gone World* is Moore in cosmic groove mode with dance floor bangers and Froese-esque escapism.

Gone World is Steve Moore's first release with label Pittsburgh Tracks and he makes it count. This is eight tracks of pure electronic bliss, a mixture of both groove-heavy tendencies as well as the headier aspects of Moore's sonic explorations.

Think of a perfect coming together of the Kompakt singles and *Escape Velocity*-era Zombi with a touch of his more '80s-inspired film work. It all comes together beautifully in a constant motion of rhythm and melody.


Title track "Gone World" opens the album on bubbling synths and a liquid rhythm. There's optimism here, something I know I've been lacking as of late. It's the perfect note to open on. "Information Superhighway" locks into that *Escape Velocity* vibe with touches of liquid sheen electronica and the headiness of early '70s Komische.

Elsewhere "VII" and "Docking Bay" roll in with gorgeous, ethereal synth textures with a touch of celestial drift. The nearly 10-minute "III" builds peaks and valleys on the backbone of a techno rhythm. I could imagine this scoring camera footage from the Mars rover. Moore knows how

Scotland gave us The Beta Band back in 1996, and they produced three fantastic albums before they decided to call it quits in 2004.

Hard to put them in a genre, and critics called it "folktronica," but to me they were indie rock. I liken them to trip-hop, sort of a Pink Floyd vibe without the (mostly) psychedelic thread. This was their middle album and is one of my favorite albums from 2001.

It opens with "Squares," a track with a tech-pop vibe that bebops around a nice synth and other simulated loveliness complete with a cool companion video. Even dreamier synth and a soft horn is found in "Human Being." Wistful and smart, it's Oasis without the vanity. And yet those guitars near the end give it a nice rock sound to kick off the decade after grunge. "Gone" is one of their shorter numbers and does have a folkadelic sound like that of Floyd from the late '60s. The mellow groove continues in the indie-pop darling that is "Dragon." Maybe it's the comforting pitch in Steve Mason's voice in front of the perfect arrangements and production, but they provide a mellow sound without the boredom.

"Broke" begins the second half of the CD, and Mason hugs you with his vocals while drum machines and an artificial bass fills the rest of the room with a cosmic atmosphere. "Quiet" creeps up on you before going into a full-on indie vibe. Again, they might have been overlooked because of Radiohead and Oasis, but they were friendlier on the ears and could go loud without being too pretentious about it.

The CD closes with "Eclipse," a solid, lyrically abstract number that leaves you relaxed and satisfied that you are part of the few who have experienced the splendor of The Beta Band. — *Dennis Donahue*

Movie swings between scares and 'who cares?'

All things considered, horror movies aren't dissimilar from comedies. Both benefit greatly from the element of surprise and suffer most when redundancy renders story beats predictable. One has setups and punchlines; the other has tension and release.

Scary movies and funny movies tend to perform better in movie theaters than their dramatic counterparts, most likely due to their ability to draw spontaneous reactions from a crowd.

For the same reason you don't see many consistently great comedy trilogies, outstanding horror triptychs aren't very common either. The latest *Halloween* entry *Halloween Kills* is further evidence of why that's the case. It's a middling middle chapter of a three-part saga that is still struggling to find purpose outside of furthering a franchise fronted by an unstoppable force.

A MIDDLING MIDDLE

When Green conceived of this new trilogy (which will "conclude" with *Halloween Ends* next October) with co-writer Danny McBride, he seemed to have a beginning and end in mind but not quite as much for the middle. Asking myself the questions, "Where is Michael and why?" at various times during the movie, I struggled to produce satisfactory answers.

If Michael's sole motivating force is to kill Laurie Strode, as it would seem to be, then this film is nothing more than a collection of particularly gruesome detours.

Perhaps Green and company will have something more profound to say about Myers and Strode in their final chapter. But until then, *Halloween Kills* will have to suffice as a halfway decent time-killer during the spookiest of seasons.

end to Michael's 40-year reign of terror.

Fans of the *Halloween* franchise will recognize the setup of *Halloween Kills* mirrors the now inconspicuous *Halloween II*, which also takes place primarily in a hospital where an injured Laurie Strode hides from Michael Myers. However, the pace and atmosphere of the two movies are vastly different.


Eschewing the cat-and-mouse tactics of that 1981 sequel, this new film favors a much more chaotic and vicious methodology when deploying its narrative. The inevitable slayings at the hands of Myers are curiously absent of the kind of suspense that John Carpenter built up so flawlessly in the original 1978 *Halloween*. Instead, returning director and co-writer David Gordon Green seems especially fixated on the bone-crunching and blood-squelching brutality exhibited towards Myers' victims.

Of course, this is a slasher movie, and I can't exactly begrudge its impulses to stack up bodies, especially when some of Myers' murders are admittedly well-staged and well-lit. Additionally, the camerawork and editing during the film's climax are more compelling than most of the aesthetic choices Green made previously in 2018's *Halloween*.

Another welcome diversion that he makes to the traditional formula for this series is the exploration of



'Fringe' filmmaker steps into horror spotlight

David Gordon Green, a self-anointed "fringe filmmaker" I've loved for almost 20 years, has the biggest movie in the world right now. Amazing and heart-warming.




