

Fundraiser for bowling right up your alley

Historic bowling alley invites public to help out

It's a not-so-well-kept secret. For nearly 90 years, a cozy, six-lane bowling alley has flourished in the basement of Most Precious Blood Catholic Church and School.

With little promotion, generations have diligently kept the family-friendly endeavor going strong in the Bloomingdale neighborhood just north of downtown.

Larry Sarrazin and a team of about a dozen volunteers lead the operation. A third-generation Precious Blood bowler, he says the facility was an essential part of the church and school's mission.

The school opened in 1930, and two years later they added the bowling center. As the nation was struggling through the Great Depression, bowling provided needed funds to keep the school afloat.

It also provided the city's north side with a recreation hotspot, a precious commodity at the time

"My father started running it back in the 1970s and continued the committee for years," Sarazine said. "He ran it for 49 years with local volunteers and over time has proven itself to continue to contribute to the church and school until today."

The facility is now called The Rich Sarrazin Bowling Center.

FAMILY TRADITION

Another local family has been there from the start: The Henrys.

"Back in the 1930s several of our grandfathers got involved with the church and they wanted to put a recreation area in there," John Henry Jr. said. "They were able to convince (church leaders) it was better to have men hanging around the church rather than a local bar."

They found used flooring from another bowling alley and the plan started to come together.

Then families like the Henrys got involved, Henry said.

"All of our cousins, all of us cousins, ended up doing it for our fathers and each other who wanted to bowl," he said.

Henry even has an uncle who hosted fish frys. Other relatives would play cards while the others bowled.

It was kids from the Henry and Sarrazin families who set the pins in place by hand.

"Back in the day, it wasn't a big deal to really set up bowling lanes because all the pins were set up by hand," Henry said. "They had little pinsetter



kids back there."

"Now they've got automatic pinsetters in there, which they bought from some other place many years ago. And so it's always been close to us. Some of our family still bowls and leagues down there."

According to Henry, Fort Wayne Mayor Tom Henry grew up right across the street from the alley. He and his brother Jerry were part of the crew.

"I think they got 10 cents a game when we used to set pins back then," John Henry said. "They could set three to make a little more money. They'd set two and two pairs at a time or four pairs at a time. It was crazy. They were really jumping around.

John Henry was a pinsetter, too, more than 50 years ago.

Larry's father, Rich Sarrazin, oversaw operations for 49 years. When he died in November, Larry picked up the baton. And like Larry, the elder Sarrazin followed his father, Gene, who was one of the original pin boys.

Larry Sarrazin and a team of nearly a dozen volunteers keep the center running now.

MAKING UPGRADES

After his father's death, Larry Sarrazin and John Henry brainstormed the next chapter.

"(Larry Sarrazin) told me it needs to be spiffed up," Henry said.

The answer: a low-key, family-based fundraiser.

"I thought, let's have a little bowling party down there, maybe a card party with our family," Henry laughed. There's enough of us (Henrys) to generate \$3,000 or \$4,000."

It expanded to include neighborhood favorite Lexy's Pizza.

It started as a Facebook post, but like summer grass, Henry said, it's growing quickly.

"The new floor, we are doing a fundraiser for, has been needed for some time and we are also doing some small cosmetic changes this summer

as well," Sarrazin said.

Items like paint and light fixtures are part of the maintenance plan.

The fundraiser is Saturday, Jan. 15, 1-4 p.m., with a suggested donation of \$50 per person.

Henry said it will include as many as 30 couples bowling, with cards, a drawing, prizes, and pull tabs.

In a lot of ways, Henry hopes it will be much like the old family get-togethers when they were kids

"Everybody's got grandkids now, so we don't get to see what we call our cousins, so hopefully, a lot of them will show up and we can reminisce a little bit because we all grew up down there hanging around the bowling alley," Henry said.

Sarrazin believes it's the bowling alley's rich history that makes it such a special attraction for rentals and other events.

"It's a slice from the past and we hope to continue to make a difference for the community and the parish," Sarrazin said. "In a world of technology, we offer a one-of-a-kind time with friends that become family."

It still has plenty of the original charm. Automatic pin machines and manual scoring add to the environment that's nearly impossible to replicate.

"We love to make memories that people can cherish for a lifetime."

Henry said it's a perfect setup.

"I can't think of a better way to host an event. I'm sure you could go to a bowling alley, which would be great, but just having your own quiet, cozy little setting," Henry said. "What could be better than that?"

Regan sees challenge in keeping comedy clean

Standup comic to avoid 'buzzwords' in Wabash

Brian Regan, who performs Thursday, Jan. 20 at the Honeywell Center in Wabash, is often described as "the comedian's comedian," which means he is the sort of comedian who is regularly praised by other comedians.

Jerry Seinfeld once said of him, "He's really the most beloved guy out there by other comedians because of the quality of his stuff."

In a phone interview with *Whatzup*, Regan said he is honored that other comedians like what he does.

But performing comedy that appeals to other comedians is different from performing for non-comedians.

"Comedians can perform two ways," Regan said. "You can perform for the back of the room. The back of the room means other comedians. Some comedians are much more interested in performing for the back of the room."

Asked which group he performs for, Regan described himself as a pig.

"I want the people in the chairs and the people in the back to laugh," he said, guffawing. "I want it all."

CHALLENGING SELF WITH CLEAN SET

Regan has been doing this a long time. His first national televised appearances were on Pat Sajak's short-lived talk show between 1989 and 1990.

He appeared on *The Tonight Show* when it was still hosted by Johnny Carson.

And he says the best advice he received as a young comic was from the late John Fox.

Regan used to bring a bottle of beer on stage, and he would take sips during lulls. Some of the lulls were created by jokes that didn't work.

"John said, 'Hey, man. It's torture watching you take sips when nobody's laughing. If you want to be a good comedian, you have to earn your sips.'"

Fox was a guy who "worked blue," meaning he used curse words and offended sensibilities. Regan keeps it clean, but he said there is a lot of misunderstanding about why he does that.

"I like to work clean because I like the personal challenge of it," he said. "I want to see how hard I can get people laughing without hitting certain buzzwords. But people attach meanings to it that I don't attach to it."

There are plenty of comedians Regan admires who work "blue."

"What I think is weird is when somebody comes up to me after a show and they try to

feel like we're all in a club," he said. "They say things like, 'I'm glad you're not like *those* people.' I feel like saying, 'I like those people. I like what they do as much as I like what I do.'"

Another common misconception about Regan, and many other comedians, is that he's the same person off-stage.

Off-stage, he can be as shy and awkward as anyone.

"I never tell people what I do unless I am point-blank asked," he said. "Like, if I go to a social gathering, I never tell people I am a stand-up comedian. Because I feel like there's this expectation. Like, 'OK, this guy is going to be a funny guy around us.'

"I have even heard people say to me or to friends, 'He doesn't seem very funny," he added. "It's almost like they're saying, 'He is fooling the whole world with this comedy thing that he does."

PERFORMING DURING LOCKDOWN

When the world was on lockdown during the worst of the pandemic, Regan tried a couple of drive-in theater shows, but they were not for him.

"I literally could not hear a single person," he said. "And I just remember kind of laughing to myself and thinking, 'This is like doing comedy in a vacuum.'

"So, I just turned it into an exercise to see how close I could come to pretending I was getting a reaction."

Many stand-up comics and other live performers found ingenious ways to connect with their audiences during the lockdown. But Regan said he ultimately decided to take a break from performing and writing for a few months.

FINDING NEW MATERIAL

Jokes come to him in the manner of over-eager students.

"I don't sit down in front of a blank computer screen or a blank legal pad and try to create something," he said. "I've learned that my brain just isn't wired that way. I just need to go do my normal things that I would be doing in life. And every once in a while, something jumps up and down. I use this analogy:

You know, when you're in gym class at high school and it's your job to pick the basketball team and there's the kid in the back that's jumping up and down, saying, 'Pick me, pick me'? That's how ideas come to me. I use those as starting points. I have an initial observation and then I build on it."

Regan said about three-quarters of his Wabash show will consist of new material.

The way it works is that Regan builds up an hour of new jokes then records it for Netflix or Comedy Central.

"And that's kind of the end of the line for the material," he said. "But I can't just throw it out and have a new hour the next night. I have to start the process of 'Out with the old and in with the new."

Regan said he still has the same three career goals he has always had.

"One is the individual jokes," he said. "And then there are the five-minute goals. A five-minute TV appearance. And then there are the hour goals: Your next special or DVD or CD. That shows you how old I am. I am using words like CD."



Weird Al returning to stage

Weird Al Yankovic will perform at The Lerner Theatre in Elkhart on July 26 as part of "The Unfortunate Return of the Ridiculously Self-Indulgent, Ill-Advised Vanity Tour."

The tour marks Weird Al's return to the stage for the first time since 2019. The singer/comedian promises to not disappoint as he draws from his back catalogue of 14 studio albums, delivering a different set list every night, all focusing on the hits from his career while still highlighting some of his more obscure parodies and original songs that have largely escaped the pop culture radar but are adored by his fans.

The tour stops in Detroit on May 20, Chicago on July 15-16, Dayton on Aug. 23, and Grand Rapids on Aug.





Green Day

BBC Sessions

When Green Day helped initiate the wave of pop-punk in the '90s, it's understandable that they attracted attention in the land where punk



was born the first time around. The band first played live in the BBC studios in 1994 and did so through 2001, when the latest song on this retrospective collection was recorded.

BBC Sessions is a little bit counter-intuitive. You might expect a live album from a punk band, especially one recorded in the odd setting of a broadcast network's studio, to feel raw and (hopefully) spontaneous. But the album has pretty much none of that.

The band is firing on all cylinders, and the production quality is top-notch. Apart from the occasional brief whine of feedback, you could believe the band, a producer, and an engineer worked long and hard to make the songs sound just right.

On the other hand, the album makes it clear just what a tight band Green Day was in its prime. It might not be in the true spirit of punk, but you've got to appreciate how the band is able to rip through songs like "When I Come Around" or "Geek Stink Breath" without a single misstep.

But does BBC Sessions offer anything novel or surprising that makes it feel necessary? Not really. Real fans might appreciate the inclusion of less obvious songs like "Church on Sunday" or "Waiting," but for most of us, the flawless versions of the band's greatest hits are something we can get plenty of elsewhere. — Evan Gillespie

Volbeat

Servants of the Mind

Volbeat are acquired taste for most rock fans. Their unorthodox mix of hard rock, rockabilly, and other influences



set them apart from the crowd when it comes to originality. There simply is no other band like them. That being said, while most of the band's newest album, Servants of the Mind, will satisfy fans, there are parts that might take some time to grow on them as well.

There are a lot of styles on display here as Volbeat branch out even further to explore new territory. Thrashy numbers "Say No More," "Becoming," and "Mindlock" bring to mind the '80s Bay-area thrash movement made famous by bands like Metallica, Exodus, and Testament and are welcome additions. But the exploration of pop music and the questionable inclusion of "Dagen Før," a duet with Stine Bramsen, and the seemingly pointless "The Passenger" fail to hit

The full-on rockabilly of "Wait a Minute Girl," is placed strangely between two of the better songs and breaks the momentum, but Volbeat do successfully channel Dick Dale in the surf-influenced "The Devil Rages On" and "Step Into Light," adding yet another successful dimension.

Without question, Volbeat are at their best when they stick to their strength and put forth songs with melody and a metallic edge. The single "Shotgun Blues" is a prime example of this as is album opener "Temple of Ekur," "Heaven's Descent," and the standout track "The Sacred Stones." These songs need to be immediately placed into "best of" playlists to provide maximum repeated listens.


Frontman Michael Poulsen wrote this entire album on his own during lockdown, so there is some basis to allow for forgiveness if the effort seems a little unfocused, but there is no doubt that the good far outweighs the not-so-great. While many proclaim that rock is dead or that every band sounds the same, Volbeat are here to smash those theories into a thousand pieces.

One of the most original bands on the scene today has produced one of the better albums in recent memory. Though there are a few holes here, Servant of the Mind is exceptional when this Danish band hits on all cylinders, which is most of the time. — Chris Hupe

A View From the Top of the World

The most commercially successful progressive metal band ever, Dream Theater is back at it with their 15th studio album, A



View From the Top of the World. A listening experience that needs to be repeated multiple times in order to digest everything that is going on, View comes off as the band's most inspired effort since 2011's A Dramatic Turn of Events.

According to a press release about the album, View centers on the idea of intentionally pushing yourself to your limit in the way that thrill-seekers live for the adrenaline rush. On this offering, Dream Theater offer up enough musical theatrics that challenge the listener in much the same way.

"The Alien" opens things up, with trademark multiple time changes and John Petrucci stepping forward with a jaw-dropping guitar solo. This is probably the most accessible song on the album which is also, most likely, the reason it was chosen as a single, though it clocks in at a hefty nine-and-a-half minutes.

"Answering the Call" takes us on a roller coaster of emotions while also standing out as one of the top tracks, with Petrucci and keyboardist Jordan Rudess alternating licks that defy the senses.

"Invisible Monster" is relatively simple by Dream Theater standards but is full of melody and superior musicianship, while "Sleeping Giant" borders on the edge of symphonic metal but manages to retain the classic Dream Theater sound. "Awaken the Master" is as heavy as a 10-ton hammer and clears the way to the album-closing 20-minute title track that defies

One of the best supergroups ever assembled came from the ashes of the New York Dolls



after they fizzled out at the end of the glamrock period. If post-punk needed a face in the late '70s, it was these guys, led by Johnny Thunders (born John Genzale) and Walter Lure. Although the band released only one studio album, they were one of the foundations of the CBGB/Max's NYC scene. It was fantastic.

"Born To Lose" kicks it off with gritty drumming from Jerry Nolan and a Stones-y guitar from Thunders, who really knew his way around a Les Paul. "Baby Talk" grinds away with a progressively louder sound including a fine solo near the end.

"All by Myself" has shades of the Dolls or even the Ramones, who they actually cover on this album in the classic "Chinese Rocks." It's three minutes of bombastic, heavy punk that rivals the original. There's more punk in the two-minute "Get Off the Phone" which was a template for bands like the Cramps and, later, Green Day. "Pirate Love" takes the tempo down but still has a dirty, hard rock feel to it. Again, Thunders was able to blend punk with garage to capture a new sound that was less underground than bands before him, and his guitar was more pronounced than the simple chords that punk revolved around. One of my favorites is "I Love You," which proved that punk rock could still be expressive even when it was loud.

Thunders had a respectable solo career as did Nolan, but neither lived past the age of 45. Even though the music is mostly obscure today, they may have saved rock n' roll during the disco area and have influenced many. — Dennis Donahue

explanation. You'll have to listen to that for yourself, but it is definitely worth the commitment. Split into three sections, the song features everything fans love about this band, wrapped up into one nice package.

Seven songs covering 70 minutes is pretty much par for the course with Dream Theater. Dream Theater know who they are and what their fans want and don't often stray too far from the path they have spent many years paving. Eternals (director Chloe Zhao); 19. The Matrix Resurrections (Lana Wachowski); 18. Nightmare Alley (Guillermo del Toro); 17. Belfast (Kenneth Branagh); 16. Ghostbusters: Afterlife (Jason Reitman); 15. Spencer (Pablo Larrain); 14. Spider-Man: No Way Home (Jon Watts); 13. Drive My Car (Ryusuke Hamaguchi); 12. The Lost Daughter (Maggie Gyllenhaal); 11. West Side Story (Steven Spielberg).

- 10. The Power of the Dog (Jane Campion): Four of Hollywood's most interesting actors, gorgeous landscape photography, a brilliant director with a classicist script. This one is getting talked up as the most likely film to win the Best Picture Oscar. I liked it, but it's not even one of the nine most interesting films on screens. 85/100
- 9. House of Gucci (Ridley Scott): A living legend puts together an incredible cast and makes a flashy, fun, funny ensemble ... err ... comedy? I'm in! 87/100
- **8.** C'mon C'mon (Mike Mills): We don't have a lot of these movies anymore: arthouse dramas with sharp scripts and brilliant performances. Noah Baumbach makes one every once in a while, but most of his films play on Netflix. C'mon C'mon is Joaquin Phoenix at his best, giving a soulful, sweet performance worthy of Mills' incredible script. 89/100
- 7. Dune (Denis Villeneuve): I'm not a big Denis Head. Not at all. I think his most effective movie is still Prisoners. That being said, this is legendary source material and features his remarkable production team. This might be the most beautiful thing you'll see on screen all
- 6. Don't Look Up (Adam McKay): This would maybe be my No. 1 recommendation, but I'm fully aware that everyone already watched it on Netflix over the holiday

weekends. I think this is a new classic, and it stars several of the biggest names of the last 50 years going big on a big script from a big director (with a big message). I thought it was not just brilliant political satire, but brilliantly executed. And super fun funny. Seeing it on a big screen would make it a blast. 91/100

- 5. Red Rocket (Sean Baker): Baker's third consecutive classic, here telling another rough and loose story about, as Dave Chappelle would say, "the Poor Whites." Once again, Baker is a stylist with a vision, purposefully operating at an almost DIY production level. This one also features one of the year's best performances from, gulp, Simon Rex. Didn't see that one coming. 92/100
- 4. The Tragedy of Macbeth (Joel Coen): Coen makes a movie without his brother Ethan, starring Denzel Washington as Macbeth and Frances McDormand as Lady Macbeth. The legendary Bruno Delbonnel shoots it in some of the most beautifully designed black-and-white frames of recent memory. How can you not be in? I've not seen this one yet, but based on everything I know about it, everything I've read about it and the few clips I've seen so far, this looks like one for the ages. 94/100
- 3. Parallel Mothers (Pedro Almodovar): Every Almodovar film I've seen has felt special to me. He's unlike anyone else, and when he works with his muse Penelope Cruz, the results are often very good. 95/100 2. Licorice Pizza (P. T. Anderson): The greatest work-
- ing director essentially does a cover version of Wes Anderson's Rushmore, but set in the 1970s in Southern California. It's fun, freewheeling, artsy, and unique. I've only seen it once, but to me it felt like a purposefully "minor work." The GOAT just having fun making a pretty, breezy, easy, low-stakes film with a cast and crew of friends. Is it an all-time classic like The Master or There Will Be Blood or Boogie Nights or Punch-Drunk Love? I don't think so. But maybe I'll peel away layers as I inevitably watch it over and over. So, yes, go see this. A PTA film on the big screen should not even be a guestion, even when it's a minor work. 97/100
- 1. The French Dispatch (Wes Anderson): By now you know if you're a Wes fan or not, right? A big, colorful, wild new Anderson film on a big screen? What's better than that?! It's an art film, a full-Fellini art film, featuring a big, incredible cast, Anderson's all-star production family he always works with, incredible music (as always for a Wes film), and, in my opinion, some of the best art direction ever in a film. Beautiful acting, imagery in adaptation of *Macbeth*

ew names in modern cinema are more revered than the Coen Brothers. Over the course of 18 films, including Best Picture winner No Country for Old Men and, most recently, Netflix's The Ballad of Buster Scruggs, the duo have conjured up one transcendent masterstroke after another for almost 35 years.

The Tragedy of Macbeth, a linguistically faithful but stylistically ambitious retelling of Shakespeare's perennial play, finds Joel Coen writ-

ing and directing independently from Ethan Coen for the first time in their careers.

Fortunately, Joel demonstrates that he has plenty to offer on his own in this dire and nightmarish interpretation on The Scottish Play, stripping the story down to its barest elements while adding layers of visual grandeur at the same time.



from battle when they are met by a trio of witches (all three portrayed by Kathryn Hunter) with a prophecy. They proclaim the former will soon be king while the latter will raise a son who will come to be king sometime in the future, an ominous prediction that sets the men on divergent paths.



murder, Macbeth seems to have the world at his fingertips, but his obsession with the prediction about Banquo's offspring begins to consume himself and his wife.

A coven of whispering witches open The Tragedy of Macbeth in eerie voiceover, setting an otherworldly and ominous pall over this adaptation that recalls the hushed unease of 2016's The Witch. The rugged 17th century setting, period-accurate dialogue, and presence of that film's star Ralph Ineson further cements the connection between the two movies, though the stories obviously diverge from there.

Coen adapts directly from Shakespeare's original prose; those intimately familiar with the play's text should have fun mouthing the words of their favorite passages along with the actors. Though the occasional line reading can come across as awkward, the cast is uniformly prepared and deeply entrenched in their respective performances.

STARK BLACK-AND-WHITE CINEMATOGRAPHY

Stylistically, Coen and his production designer Stefan Dechant draw most notably from the German Expressionism movement and, more specifically, the works of Fritz Lang like *Metropolis* and M. The stark black-andwhite cinematography from Bruno Delbonnel makes the contrast between light and shadow greater than that of a color counterpart. In some scenes, this makes separation more evident and in others, the visual lines are blurrier. Fog and sand spill over into one another

during the early prophecy scene, but by the time Macbeth is crowned king, the angular castle with its high archways and narrow passages make for more sharply defined settings. It's a clever visual metaphor to articulate how Macbeth's world becomes more governed by absolutes, no matter how unfounded they are, as the narrative progresses.

Washington has always excelled at playing characters with a chip on their shoulder, and he pitches Macbeth's haughtiness perfectly while also generating sympathy at just the right moments. McDormand is a fine counterpoint, wielding quiet ambition for a greater purpose but tragically succumbing to madness along the way.

These two leads, along with fine supporting players like Corey Hawkins and Harry Melling, have turned in plenty of outstanding work on-screen through the years, but the real find here is Hunter. Playing the part of all three of The Witches, she contorts and confounds in a role that is captivating in its physicality and unforgettable in its solemnity.

The Tragedy of Macbeth takes the Bard's play into more haunting territory than it's been before, in ways that only great filmmakers can manifest.




