JoJo set to light up Coliseum stage

YouTube celebrity says girl onstage is same offstage

Before last January, you probably didn't know who JoJo Siwa was, unless you were a parent of young children.

Siwa is one of those largely selfmade YouTube sensations who loom large in the lives of moppets, but tend to fly under the radars of people with mortgages.

Then Siwa came out as pansexual and she instantly gained a progressive fanbase — people who want to support the alterative sexualities of vulnerable young artists, regardless of what songs they sing or creations they create.

Memorial Coliseum is set to host Nickelodeon's JoJo Siwa D.R.E.A.M Tour on Tuesday, Feb. 15.

Siwa began her journey to prominence on the reality shows Abby's Ultimate Dance Competition and Dance Moms.

Like Justin Bieber, Shawn Mendes, and Carly Rae Jepsen before her, Siwa used YouTube to achieve what only a major record label could have accomplished 20 years ago: international musical stardom.

SAME PERSON OFF STAGE

To understand how her musical stylings struck many adults in her pre-pansexual days, here are a few quotes from a 2019 column by Dublin Sunday Independent columnist, Brendan O'Connor:

"JoJo Siwa is shouting at us. She wants everyone to scream. Ten thousand people scream back at her. They want to scream. They are here to scream. And JoJo knows

"JoJo Siwa knows what her audience wants. And you or I don't understand it. We haven't a clue. A TV presenter, who's here with her own kids, looks at me bewildered, and mouths, 'What the (expletive)?'

"As it goes on, I feel my central nervous system starting to shut down. The bombardment of the senses is getting too much for me. I am being pounded with flashing moving videos of candy in primary

colours. And JoJo and her dancers keep changing into ever more sequinny and colour-clashing outfits. Just when you think JoJo couldn't be more shiny and clashing, she finds another outfit, with new loud colours that you didn't know existed."

In an interview with NBC's Today Show, Siwa said she has to fight the misconception that the above-described persona is fake.

"I think a lot of people think that JoJo is a character, and somebody today actually asked me if I was ever gonna put my character to rest," she said. "I was like, 'I mean, she's been to rest because she doesn't exist.' But I think that a lot of people think that it's not true.

"I think all the time people think

that it's just not possible," Siaw said. "But it is."

COMFORTABLE WITH SELF

Since she came out and removed some of the adolescent accents from her appearance, the 18-year-old said she is now feeling like her best self.

"I never expected my journey to take this path, I really didn't," she told Teen Vogue magazine, "I didn't expect to feel the way that I feel right now this quick. I knew that I always wanted to feel like this, but I remember thinking I was never gonna get here. I want to move forward, and I want to age as I age. I think I'm in a great spot right now. I love what I look like, I love what I feel like, and I just want to keep that momentum."

Cat in Hat, Horton appear in production by Civic Theatre

Fans of American children's author and illustrator Dr. Seuss will have the chance to witness the classic story Horton Hears a Who as it comes to life when actors take the stage for several performances of Seussical at Fort Wayne Civic Theatre, beginning Saturday, Feb.

Seuss' iconic Cat in the Hat character will narrate the story of Horton, an elephant whose mission is to protect a tiny speck of dust after he discovers an entire community known as Whoville lives on that spec.

"Horton faces a double challenge," the Civic Theatre announced in a press release. "Not only must he protect the Whos from a world of naysayers and dangers, but he must guard an abandoned egg left in his care.

Although Horton faces ridicule, danger, kidnapping, and a trial, ultimately, the powers of friendship, loyalty, family and community emerge triumphant."

PUTTING ON A SHOW

Doug King, a veteran guest director at the Civic, says Seussical is a "fun-filled family show full of wackiness."

"(Audiences) can come expecting some great music (and) some incredible performances," King told Whatzup in an interview. "Also, the Civic Theatre here, this year, is putting all their big budget of technology into this

Not only will the show feature advanced, high-budget lighting, but a number of high-flying acrobatic feats will be on display during the several performances this month.

"We also have two people that are aerialists. At one point, there will be two people doing silks, and at another point, there's a girl doing

"And we have acrobats, so we have all kinds of stops that we're pulling out for this show, including, of course, a wonderful set and beautiful, bright, colorful costumes.

"So just a lot of fun and a lot to look at. A lot to take in."

King added that because the actors are volunteers, many have full-time jobs. This means that a production like Seussical is rehearsed and built within a particularly tight

According to King, Seussical had just five weeks to "put everything together," then one week of "tech," which is when the show is rehearsed with technical elements in place, like lights and sound.

ASSET TO THEATER

King, who is New Haven resident, grew up with local theater in northeast Indiana and boasts a strong list of shows he's directed at Civic Theatre.

"I actually did a show — I did Can-Can with Phillip Colglazier, the executive director at (the) Civic Theatre, in 1979."

After touring for Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, King's prowess and knowledge of the musical attracted the attention of Colglazier when Civic Theatre planned to put on the same musical a while later.

"Once Phillip took over and they were going to do Joseph, he thought it would be good to get me in to give some 'tour insight' on their project," King said.

Since then, King says, Colglazier has invited him to direct a number of shows.

"And ever since then, he's had me back as a guest director pretty consistently every year, which is very nice because I love the work that they do there, and I love having the work also. So, once a year, usually, I'm in as guest director."

FAMILY AFFAIR

The Civic Theatre performance of Seussical will have a few slight changes that may boost audience enjoyment of the spectacle.

"We're taking some new twists," King said.

"The Sour Kangaroo character usually plays two parts: she plays Sour Kangaroo and Young Kangaroo, and the young kangaroo is (usually)

He says the kangaroo puppet will not be part of the local performance, however, and the character will have a bit more life than a puppet brings to the stage.

"Instead, we cast a young actress as the young kangaroo, so we've added a part there,"

Another interesting aspect of the cast lies with the family of the show's musical director, Ben Wedler.

"He's the musical director, his wife is the bird girl, his daughter is this young kangaroo character we added, and his young son is in the show, too," King said. "So, the whole family affair is involved with the show. That's been neat, also, to work with."

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

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Elvis Costello & The Imposters

The Boy Named If

The title of Elvis Costello's latest album suggests a theme of boyhood. Even more so, a deluxe edition



comes with an illustrated book called *The Boy Named If and Other Children's Tales*, implying a nostalgic examination of an early stage of life. But the album, while perhaps touching on nostalgia, is more about life as a whole than childhood.

The characters in many of the songs are not, by any stretch, boys, except maybe in the way they behave.

"What If I Can't Give You Anything But Love?" comes from the perspective of a man who can't be faithful to his partner. "My Most Beautiful Mistake" is about a woman who is the focus of male manipulation and unconcern. These are stories about looking back with regret, but from the perspective of someone who's seen plenty of difficulties and betrayals.

Musically, the album gives us the Costello who stands in front of his band, the Imposters, with bravado and energy, not the musical chameleon who loves to wind his way through unusual genres.

The songs are mostly rock n' roll, from the opening "Farewell, OK," that resurrects rockabilly by way of the Beatles, to "The Death of Magic Thinking," which hews closer to '80s New Wave. The constant in all the tracks is the kind of grit that has been Costello's defining characteristic.

The album ends with "Mr. Crescent," a dreamy metaphor that conflates celestial bodies with bad relationships. It's another take on human frailties disguised as a children's lullaby, a fitting close for an album that points out that being a child at heart isn't necessarily a good thing. — Evan Gillespie

John Mellencamp

Strictly a One-Eyed Jack



For anyone who hasn't heard a John Mellencamp album in a number of years,

the voice they'll encounter on *Strictly a One-Eyed Jack* is jarring.

Sounding like a Tom Waits impersonation, Mellencamp credits years of smoking to his new, raspy sound, though he actually takes delight in it. "It never dawned on me that it would happen, but I'm happy I sound that way," he told Forbes in a recent interview.

The rough voice does oddly fit in on an album that seems like it could have been recorded in late-night tavern surrounded by folks down on their luck.

Opening with "I Always Lie To Strangers," Mellencamp sets the tone for an album of a man who

goes by the beat of his own drum, not caring for the opinions of others. That carries through to "I Am a Man That Worries," with lyrics such as, "I come across dangerous and mean/That's my angel's dream."

Other songs, such as "Driving In the Rain" and "Gone So Soon" are of a man looking back on a life that was taken for granted, and how days are much more precious now, epitomized most in "Wasted Days," sung along with fellow Hall of Famer Bruce Springsteen.

Springsteen also joins his friend on the more upbeat "Did You Say Such a Thing," while helping close out the album with the bleak "A Life Full of Rain."


Mellencamp's definitely moved on from his "Jack & Diane," "Hurts So Good," and even "Wild Night" days, but if you're looking for an album to listen to while sitting next to a fire with your favorite glass of whiskey, this might be for you.

dUg Pinnick Joy Bomb

dUg Pinnick has a lot of music in him just waiting to get out.

As his main band, King's X, has slowed down the frequency of their releases,



Eight years since his last solo outing, *Joy Bomb* won't sound unfamiliar to fans as the main focus of most of Pinnick's works is his soulful voice, which never seems to falter. But there is some diversity to the 13 tracks here.

King's X fans will be pleased with the first several offerings as Pinnick offers up fare that sounds similar to what you would typically hear on a King's X album. The guitar tone on "Jon Boy," "A Long Way From Home" and "Key Changer" mimics the unique tone King's X guitarist Ty Tabor uses and the vibe throughout these songs are similar as well.

"Equally Divided" brings the added influence Jimi Hendrix has had Pinnick's music, but "I Can't Fight This Feeling" and "Social Distancing" take detours into a pop sound we've not heard from Pinnick in the past.

"Love and Fear" takes a left turn, bordering on Americana, "Long Live Love" sounds a bit Beatles-esque and the best song on the album, "Slaves," leans in a progressive rock direction. He closes the album with "Making Sense of the Bones," the most energetic and straightforward track on the album, leaving the listener wanting more.

Pinnick takes this opportunity to write some socially relevant lyrics as well, taking on big food corporations on "The Poison," the state of the divided nation in "Equally Divided" and, of course, the toll the pandemic has taken on all of us in "Social Distancing."

Backtracks CLASSIC ALBUMS

The Damned

Strawberries (1982)

This was the fifth album from the Damned and was more of departure from their post-punk sound



that established them in the late '70s. The band borrowed elements from the '60s and added some horns and tight melodies to make them more accessible on college radio. And even though tensions in the band were high, they still entertained fans across the globe with a fantastic live show that would keep album sales respectable.

The album opens with "Ignite" a gritty guitar-driven track that melds punk rock and indie rock and may have been one of the more familiar tracks from the release. Great bridge in this one with a chaotic solo from Ray Burns, better known as Captain Sensible. "Generals" is more melodic pop that resembles the Jam or Gang of Four, but the piano and horns give it a softer approach. "Dozen Girls" also has the pop-punk vibe, yet the melodies (and keyboards) remind me of something from the Dave Clark Five or Paul Revere from the mid-60s.

Things change slightly with "The Dog," a number that goes more than seven minutes. It's a ballad (mostly) but musically has all the DNA from the early '80s (synthesizer, high production, and a dash of goth). But "Gun Fury" takes you back to the roots of the Damned with sonic guitars and intelligent, yet snarky lyrics. My favorite song from the release is "Pleasure and the Plain," if only because they drop a cello in this one from Burns' then-girlfriend, Rachel Bor. It may sound like a mismatch, but I can't imagine hearing this track without it. Another pretty song is "Life Goes On," which again shared the pop sensibilities of Madness and other English bands from the period.

The original lineup will tour in 2022 (mostly in Europe) after the last tour was canceled due to you know what. — *Dennis Donahue*

Bomb gives a glimpse into what's currently on this septuagenarian's mind. Still sounding like a man half his age, who is obviously filled with the same passion for music he has always shown, this album unveils some aspects of Pinnick's personality we have not seen or heard before, giving us a glimpse of what the future may hold.

Following a 14-year wait, a new King's X album is due out some time this year. Until then, *Joy Bomb* should be in constant rotation to help us get there. — *Chris Hupe*

Going under radar to select favorite actress

Thad been wondering for a while who my favorite actress of all-time **⊥**is. Sure, sure, sure – the easy answer is to just always say Meryl Streep. Gena Rowlands is always acceptable as well, and if you find yourself in a conversation in which someone believes otherwise, never speak to that person again.

But I digress ... Favorite Anything of All-Time is always a slippery slope, as there are so many brilliant artists in the world right now. Just the other

day I realized Philip Seymour Hoffman is probably my favorite actor ever. At least that's the answer right now. For a while, I said David Thewlis; for a while I said Daniel Day-Lewis; for a while I said Joaquin Phoenix; it probably is Denzel much of the time; for a very long while I said Robert De Niro was my guy; tomorrow (and ever more) I might say Denis Lavant; most folks think it's Leo or Hanks, and I won't argue; I wonder if it's already Plemons; (shouldn't Wood Harris be in this conversation by now?); and sometimes, when no one is looking, I say it's Hoffman ... Dustin Hoffman ... or, wait! Philip Seymour

So you get it: Picking a favorite is impossible. The little details of life that we connect to most deeply are always changing. For a long time I called Martin Scorsese my all-time favorite director; then I started to say it was Godard for a bit; then I started to say it was Krzysztof Kieslowski, and that one lasted a long time. Maybe it's just Kubrick or Tarkovsky after all? Sometimes it's Wes Anderson and most of the time it's Paul Thomas Anderson. Who cares about favorites, that's my point. Picking favesies is a scam, but also, in 2022, it's a fun structure

And so for the sake of typing words about film for another week, let me circle back to the lede ... favorite actress of all-time.

My first favorite actress ever was Halle Berry, after seeing her legendary run of early flicks (Jungle Fever, Strictly Business, The Last Boy Scout, and Boomerang). That run owned me and my best friend, Teddy, as we were getting into movies. We had seen the future. Ha.

Then, for a while it was the inevitable cinephile pick, Juliette Binoche - an actor who knows how to pick projects and directors as well as anyone ever. Period. Like all cinephiles, I had a time in which I was also obsessed with John Casavettes' work with his wife, Gena Rowlands. Most days I still say Rowlands is my all-time favorite. Other days Rooney Mara (Dragon Tattoo) or Kirsten Dunst (Melancholia) or Jennifer Lawrence (Winter's Bone) or Frances McDormand or Amy Adams or Marion Cotillard or Cate Blanchett.

But after really digging in and doing the research, looking at the careers of all my GOATs and attempting to quantify and analyze the value of their career to me as a movie fan, I came up with an unlikely result. I thought the very vanilla pick Blanchett (or even Julia Roberts) would be my destiny, but no ... it's gotta be Binoche. Hands down favesies. Juliette, it was you all along.

Her performances speak for themselves, obviously. I'm not going to state my case for Binoche's talent. She always shows up and she can be as big or as small as the screen needs. It's remarkable.

I think it's safe to say that most know Binoche for her Oscar-winning performance in The English Patient. It's a

classical, elegant, and thoughtful performance by what has to be one of the most beautiful human faces you'll ever see on a big screen or anywhere else. She had everyone in a trance.

The English Patient was true movie star power but from this quirky, dark French girl. And Binoche won an Oscar for the performance and she was immediately an A-List talent forever. And while that might sound like a hands-down obvious Mount Rushmore moment for any actor, I'm not sure The English Patient is anywhere near a Top Four moment in Binoche's still-very-active and interesting career.

Rather than comb through Binoche's busy, even downright epic, 39-year career (which, by the way, includes a lead role in the upcoming Claire Denis film, Fire), I figured I'd keep it simple and give you what I believe to be a conventional wisdom-based summing up of all the classic films Binoche has been in, listed in the order in which they were released: Mauvais Sang (Bad Blood) (director Leos Carax, 1986); The Unbearable Lightness of Being (Philip Kaufman, 1988); The Lovers on the Bridge (Leos Carax, 1991); Damage (Louis Malle, 1992); Three Colors: Blue (Kieslowski, 1993); The English Patient (Anthony Minghella, 1996); Code Unknown (Michael Haneke, 2000); Chocolat (Lasse Hallstrom, 2000); In My Country (John Boorman, 2004); Cach; (Michael Haneke, 2005); Mary (Abel Ferrara, 2005); Summer Hours (Olivier Assayas, 2008); Certified Copy (Abbas Kiarostami, 2010); Cosmopolis (David Cronenberg, 2012); Godzilla (Gareth Edwards, 2014); Clouds of Sils Maria (Olivier Assayas, 2014); Let the Sunshine In (Claire Denis, 2017); Non-Fiction (Olivier Assayas, 2018); High Life (Claire Denis, 2018). According to me, Binoche has 19 very noteworthy

films spread out pretty evenly over the last 33 or so years. Incredible. And along the way she's worked with 12 directors I would classify as highly notable (nine drop dead legends!). What a run! Four of the flims listed above would make my personal All-Time Top 50 and one of those flicks, Blue, easy nabs a stop in my Top 10.

Eventually, Binoche will win her second Oscar in a PT Anderson or Maggie Gyllenhaal-directed masterpiece, but for now she's the under-the-radar GOAT.

Apologies to Meryl, the actress most folks consider to be the GOAT. You ranked really well for me, Meryl, but were not in my Top 5. Also, your Top 10 films can't touch Binoche's Top 10. So there it is, a verdict: My Favorite Actress, Juliette Binoche. The GOAT.

Screenplay keeps film from reaching greatness

The 22nd film from prolific Spanish writer-director Pedro Almodóvar, Parallel Mothers, doesn't quite hit the highs of 2019's terrific Pain and Glory, but it is another solid soap opera from a reliable storyteller.

Penélope Cruz stars as Janis, a photographer whose shoot with archaeologist Arturo (Israel Elejalde) leads to an affair and subsequent pregnancy. While waiting to give birth, Janis shares a hospital room

with young mother-to-be Ana (Milena Smit), with whom she strikes up a friendship and exchanges her phone number after the pair of babies are born. When Arturo meets Janis' newborn, he becomes convinced at first glance that the baby is not his daughter, leading Janis to conduct a maternity test with surprising results.

Almodóvar is known for casting the same actors in numerous films throughout his career and Parallel Mothers is no exception. This is Cruz's seventh time

working with the acclaimed filmmaker. Along with her transcendent work in 2006's Volver, this performance stands among the very best she's given in one of his movies. Her transition from a freewheeling fortysomething in the midst of a tryst to an anxious mother with mounting uncertainty about her situation is heart-wrenching and utterly convincing. Even when completing uncinematic tasks like staring at a baby monitor or scouring a PDF on a computer screen for answers, she sells the character flawlessly even

with the darting of her eyes.

But Cruz's face isn't the only one that Almodóvar's camera loves in *Parallel Mothers*, especially in close-up.

In her second feature ever, Smit more than holds her own in a role that gets more knotty and complicated as the story progresses. The circumstances that led to Ana's pregnancy are even more unfortunate than Janis', and Smit's fragile but resilient delivery gives her character instant pathos.

Both Cruz and Smit are crucial in portraying the unusual but deep connection that fate seemed to concoct when the duo met in the hospital. While overcooked writing serves up curveballs in the third act that cause these characters to act in ways that don't seem especially consistent, the acting remains first-rate to the film's final scene.

The main element that holds Parallel Mothers from greatness is the screenplay, which introduces a conceit that's already a bit of a stretch to begin with then expands on it with subplots that don't always pay off. There's also a layer of sociopolitical commentary that's clumsily lumped into this sensitive story about maternity that felt relatively unnecessary.

The movie begins and ends with heavy-handed allusions to the Spanish Civil War and ends with a political quote from Eduardo Galeano, a didactic turn that left me more confused than inspired. The dialogue isn't quite as melodramatic as the tone of the film overall, but it does often spell out the main themes of the piece rather than allow the audience to glean insight into the characters' feelings on their own.

The musical score by Alberto Iglesias also lacks any real subtlety, although this could be intentional and in keeping with the soap opera feel that Almodóvar seems to be evoking. The opening credits are grabby, but Iglesias' urgent strings and slinking piano recall Bernard Herrmann's work on any number of Hitchcock's films. Based on the tone established, you may think you're being set up to watch a psychological thriller like Psycho, but the tension in Parallel Mothers is, of course, much more subdued by comparison.

José Luis Alcaine, another frequent collaborator of Almodóvar, lends a keen eye to the cinematography, juxtaposing lush greens with bright reds to suggest a start/stop motion in keeping with the chief theme of disrupted motherhood.

There's enough in Parallel Mothers to recommend it but too much holding it back to count it among Almodóvar's best.

Playing only in theaters is Moonfall, a science-fiction disaster movie starring Halle Berry and Patrick Wilson about a pair of astronauts tasked with resetting the moon after it's knocked from its orbit by an unknown force and put onto a collision course with Earth.

Also playing only in theaters is Jackass Forever, a comedy sequel starring Johnny Knoxville and Steve-O which finds the crew of the infamous MTV reality series reuniting one last time after an 11-year hiatus for more pranks and stunts.

Screening at Cinema Center on Feb. 4 and 5 is The Burial of Kojo, a Ghanaian drama starring Joseph Otsiman and Cynthia Dankwa about a man who is trapped in a mine shaft by his vengeful brother while his daughter embarks on a magical journey to rescue him.

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
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
