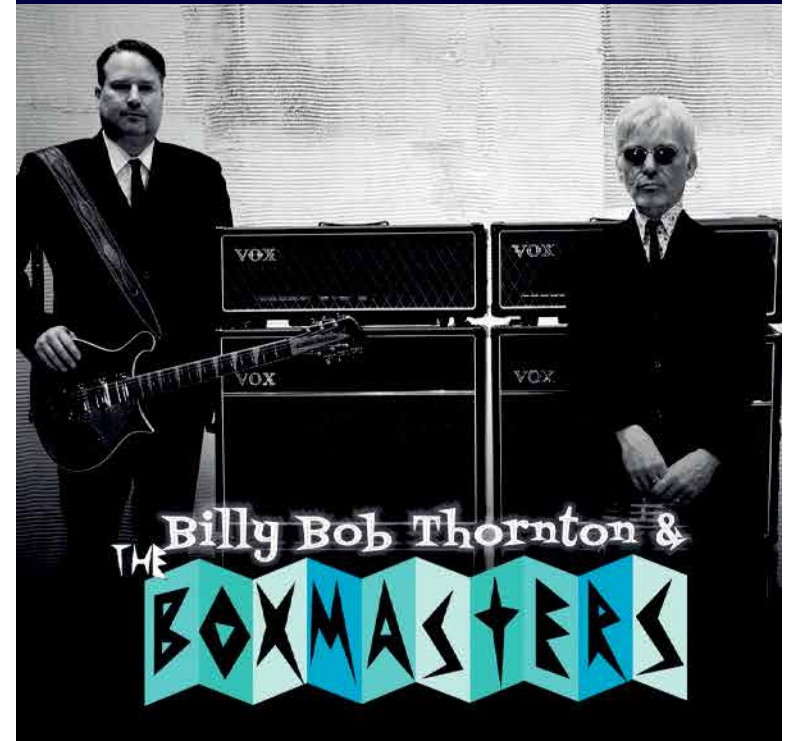

Expect nothing less from Waymores

Americana duo bringing act to Rail on April 30

Fresh off the release of their sophomore album, the Waymores have been on the road so much that they have not really been able to let the accomplishment soak in.

"Trying to squeeze in all the shows we can," Willie Heath Neal said.

Joined by Kira Annalise, the self-described acoustic honky-tonk Americana duo out of Atlanta are currently on a 10-date tour that began in Tallahassee, Florida, on April 15, and will bring them to The Brass Rail on Saturday, April 30.

"It's been a hell of a few months," Annalise said as the two were trying to catch their breath after a three-week stint that saw them travel as far as New Mexico, which included a pair of showcases in mid-March at South by Southwest in Austin, Texas.

"I'm not gonna lie, I was tired after that tour," Neal said.

MAKING ALBUM

The two have been on the road supporting *Stone Sessions*, a followup up to 2019's EP *Weeds*, released by Chicken Ranch Records out of Austin, Texas.

"COVID kind of gave us another year," Annalise said about making their second record, which was released April 8. "People want you to keep churning out records now, but we got a little extra time."

That extra time allowed them to record a diverse album that varies from songs about self-destructive relationships on "Even When," tongue-in-cheek lyrics on "I Don't Like Liquor," and downright silly fun about pets on "Ode to the Animals."

"This album was a lot different to make," Annalise said. "We made it during the quarantine, so the band all recorded remotely from their homes. We missed the camaraderie that you find in the studio, and the happy accidents that usually happen, but he overall result, we think, still sounds like we were all in the same room together."

FAMILIAR WITH AREA

While it might be tough for some couples to spend as much time confined together in a van as they have, Neal and Annalise actually prefer it this way.

"When we'd have a full band with us, we'd return home, and after paying everyone, we were broke," Neal said. "So, we started the Waymores. It's blissful."

When it comes to touring, it's Annalise who does the bookings, though Neal did have a say in scheduling the Brass Rail show.

Before forming the Waymores, Neal toured with other bands as well as a solo artist, and The Brass Rail was a popular stop.

"That's the spot to be," he said.

And the dive-bar setting is just the way they like it.

"I don't like big rooms," Neal said. "I like big crowds, but I'd rather be able to talk with the crowd."

"That's a big part of our show, being able to communicate," Annalise added.

Although they're from the Deep South, the Waymores are pretty familiar with the area.

They have already played at Neat Neat Records and The Ruin in Fort Wayne.

They have also become familiar with local musician Pete Dio, who will be performing the same night at The Brass Rail with his band the Old Dirty.

Starslinger is also on the docket. Fort Wayne will be the farthest

north the duo come during the tour, and they are also looking forward to a couple stops in Tennessee.

"It will be our first time at Cherry's Taven in Chattanooga, but we've played Chattanooga before," Annalise said. "Hernando's Hide-A-Way is a favorite of ours to play."

DESCRIBING SOUND

And their sound fits right in with the Memphis scene, regardless of how you want to define it.

"We've been called everything," Annalise said. "We've had reviews say we're mainstream country, cow-punk, and all kinds of stuff. We just like to say we're acoustic honky-tonk Americana."

Cow-punk?

"Yeah, I'm not sure where they came from," Neal said.

However you want to define their music, the Waymores promise to deliver a show you will not forget.

Debutants ready to have a ball at Clyde

Music, performers, vendors coming to venue on April 30

When most folks think of a ball, they envision an event where people dressed in tuxedos and gowns waltz around to a live orchestra into the wee hours of the morning. Then there are balls where you come dressed in elaborate costumes, don a mask, and enjoy the freedom of being someone else for a while.

Whatever your perception is, you won't see a ball quite like the one coming to The Clyde Theatre on Saturday, April 30, at 7 p.m.

Debutants Ball, spearheaded by the local folk/bluegrass outfit Debutants, will transform The Clyde into something we have never seen. In true Debutants fashion, there will be an array of local and regional vendors, grassroots organizations, performers, contests, giveaways, live art, food, drinks, and live music by Debutants and good friends The Goat's Beards.

"The Clyde has always been super supportive of us, and we've had the pleasure of opening up for national acts on the big, beautiful stage," said Debutants vocalist/mandolinist Lynn Nicholson. "Now, it's our turn. They have given us the keys and allowed us to curate an evening straight out of our dreams. Basically, if Debutants were to throw a circus, this would be it."

VENDOR OFFERINGS

According to Nicholson, there will be circus-esque performers throughout the venue, and without giving too much away, don't be surprised if you come across stilt walkers, jugglers, poi spinners, and aerial performers. There will also be a Bazaar Bizarre, where you can browse a variety of local vendors. Like I said, something we have never encountered at The Clyde.

Vendors will include everything from handmade clothes and jewelry, to houseplants, wellness products, art, henna, and more. Food and drink will be equally impressive as there will be special Debutants-inspired food from The Club Room, as well as specialty drinks to coincide

with the evening.

So, we have performers, vendors, and food, but what should one wear to the Debutants Ball? Actually, come dressed as you please, but I should note there will be prizes given for those dressed to impress and most festive, so plan accordingly.

If you don't take home a prize, don't worry, there will be a limited run of T-shirts honoring the event for purchase, featuring the fine artwork of Phan Gear Prints, who did the magnificent show poster that you might have seen on social media.

NEW MATERIAL ON HORIZON

As for the most important part, the music, The Goat's Beards will kick off the show at 7 p.m., followed by two raging sets by Debutants. Don't be surprised if some of other friends hop up and join them.

Nicholson hopes to make the Debutants Ball an annual event, and I'm sure a lot of folks feel the same way. Many of those folks have

been on board since the band's formation in 2019 and have continued a ride that has seen the band perform festivals, release an EP, perform pandemic livestreams, cover Talking Heads at this year's Down the Line event at the Embassy, and shared stages with Blues Traveler, Little River Band, Hillbilly Casino, Rumpke Mountain Boys, and more.

In addition, if you have been keeping up with the band, you know that in late January they traveled to Carnegie, Pennsylvania, to record their follow-up EP at Studio 110. There, they had the opportunity to work with engineer extraordinaire Tyler Thompson, who recorded last year's *Indiana Newgrass* EP. That weekend trip had them putting together a new five-song EP titled

Nobody Knows, which is due in May.

"Tyler is a dream to work with," bassist Colin Taylor said. "We had a lot of fun trying out new things. This time around, we decided to do the harmony vocals live as opposed to overdubbing them. We typically do everything as live as possible, and on a certain song on this EP, we did the whole track completely live, and we even got a video of the take. All in all, I'm over the moon to share our second EP out into the world."

To hold us over until then, the band just released the first single from the release, "Hard to Say." This gem can be enjoyed on all major streaming platforms.

You will get to hear the new material at The Clyde, and if we are lucky, maybe even Down the Line material. Fingers crossed.

Supporting the new release will be a priority for the band as their summer calendar is beginning to take shape.

"We definitely plan to promote the new release and continue to spread the fire to other towns,"

Nicholson said. "We will be performing several food truck nights at Junk Ditch, Hippie Hill Fest in Brown County, a few other festivals, weddings, and then busking parking lots and campgrounds of some bigger shows and festivals we're attending."

NIGHT TO REMEMBER

Debutants Ball is sure to be a blast, and who knows, perhaps this could spawn similar events from other local acts.

Although we may not see a crowd sporting masquerade masks or a man being shot from a cannon, what we will get is Nicholson, Taylor, Jon Swain, Michael Earl Newsome, Lauren Blair, Sean Hoffman, and Ellen Coplin doing what they do best, blowing minds with exceptional songwriting, stellar picking, and high-octane bluegrass stylings that make for a foot-stompin' good time.

Perhaps Nicholson says it best: "Grab your tickets, tell your people, and join us for our biggest show yet. It's sure to be a ball, y'all!"

Children's Zoo adapts to help make memories

Experience gets enhanced with new renovations

For decades, Fort Wayne Children's Zoo has been the crown jewel of spring and summer fun in north-east Indiana.

Fresh off a record-setting year, the zoo will open Saturday, April 30, with new sparkle and a few new looks, but the same tradition and guest engagement.

The zoo boasted more than 672,000 visitors and 20,000 members in 2021, according to Bonnie Kemp, director of communications. She says with the restrictions of the COVID-19 pandemic eased last year, the zoo was ready for business.

The public responded with enthusiasm.

"I think they flocked to the zoo because they wanted to get out and do things as a family," Kemp said. "And what better place to do that than at the Fort Wayne Children's Zoo?"

CATERING TO YOUTH

Whether it's how the animals are presented with dedicated care and authentic habitats, the zoo's friendly and engaging staff, or nearly 60 years of tradition, whatever it is, it's a recipe that works.

Kemp thinks it might even be simpler than that. It might be in the name: Children's Zoo.

She says team members are intentional about creating an environment that fosters unique moments, even treasured lifetime memories.

"We pride ourselves in making sure that we're following the things that make us a children's zoo, with the lower exhibit areas, so that the youngest of our guests can see and experience the lion sitting right at the window," Kemp said. "You can feed a giraffe, you can brush the

goats, you can touch a stingray for the very first time."

Zookeepers tally more than 100 hours a week of one-on-one talks and hands-on engagement with guests.

The cycle repeats across all ages.

"It brings so many memories for moms and grandparents and great-grandparents that they want to share those experiences with their children," Kemp said.

Those memories are enhanced with iconic symbols from the past. Kemp points to the lion head drinking fountain, the talking frog, and the little train engine children can play on next to the Z.O.&O. Railroad.

"It is very reminiscent of the one that was there 58 seasons ago," she said. "So, there is a lot of the nostalgia that we love as adults that we can share with our children."

KEEPING WITH THE TIMES

The right calls have also been made when adding or expanding exhibits and amusements.

The original seven-acre zoo boasted 20 species across seven acres. Now, it's closer to 40 acres with more than 1,600 animals.

"It is ever-changing and evolving, and we have become a modern zoo, where in 1965 we would not have been considered a modern zoo," Kemp said.

The most visible additions for the 2022 season are a reimagined Indonesian Rain Forest, cosmetic changes to the entrance, and a new coffee shop.

"It won't take long to make an impression at the front gate," Kemp said. "It's hard to miss. All the color. The zoo letters are going to be painted in our logo colors. Then you'll just notice a bright new entrance at the very front of the zoo. It's a move to connect that we'll use with the signature logo colors of green, orange, and yellow."

Another change is in the Indonesian Rain Forest.

"It will be all new immersive experience. It will feel and sound

just like you're walking into an Indonesian rainforest," Kemp said. "It's been there quite a while, and we decided to reimagine that space and make it a little more immersive for the youngest of our guests."

Animals will also have larger homes following the renovations.

"There will be animals hiding in the foliage, on the walls, and in animal exhibit that feel very natural," Kemp said.

The carousel will remain, and the jungle lab will be opened to birthday parties for those up to 20 years old. The picnic pavilion will also be available for larger private events, including corporate outings for the first time since the pandemic.

Near the entrance is the new coffee shop, appropriately enough called Peacock Cafe, resembling the colorful birds flocking around it.

"It's bright blue," Kemp said. "You can grab a cup of coffee, a latte, some beverages, and get your day started right when you get in."

MISSION OF CONSERVATION

In the midst of all the fun and intrigue of animals in real-life vistas, the zoo is actively entrenched in conservation efforts, having partnered with projects around the



world and closer to home.

Kemp says the zoo financially helps more than 30 conservation partners.

"Last year, it was in the tune of \$360,000, one-third of a million dollars," she said. "By guests visiting, they help us make those decisions, and allow us to be able to put that into our giving every season."

The zoo is also directly involved with 63 individual Species Survival Plan programs, including many of the zoo's popular animals such as giraffes, orangutans, kangaroos, radiated tortoises, and Old World monkeys.

And one hits close to home: hellbender salamanders, which are found in Indiana. The zoo has teamed up with Purdue University, the Indiana Department of Natural

Resources, and other Indiana zoos to repopulate state waterways with the endangered amphibians.

Visitors are challenged to embrace the zoo's conservation projects.

"Everybody gets to help us decide how to spend those conservation dollars," Kemp said. "They'll get a penny at the front gate, then drop it in our Kids for Nature Kiosk. They vote for their favorite conservation partner. We highlight three each season. They can help us decide where those funds go. So everybody actively gets to help us make those decisions."

"It's part of our mission," she added. "It hits straight to it, and that's part of our mission: Inspiring people to care. That's the message in everything that we do."

Roller Derby easing back into action

Fort Wayne club finds training space at Icehouse

After more than two years, Fort Wayne Roller Derby is back on track, literally.

Following a loss to Muncie on March 7, 2020, the program was forced to shut things down during the pandemic. Now, more than 25 months later, they're slowly getting back into swing of things with training sessions at SportONE/Parkview Icehouse.

"We're going to go slow, because a lot of us haven't kept up with our training," club President Lahapa Brown said. "Plus, we have a lot of new people, so we don't want anybody pulling muscles. We'll go slow with the strength training, the cardio training, then the skate training."

Training sessions will be held every Tuesday through May at the facility from 6-8 p.m. Anyone older than 6 years old is welcome to attend, regardless of gender or skating level: Just bring \$7.

STARTING BACK UP

"It's been on (the board of directors') minds (to restart the club) at least the last six months," Brown said. "Part of our delay was that we needed to find a new practice venue. Our league, both the Derby Girls and the Derby Brats, under previous names, have skated here in the past."

The Icehouse replaces one of its ice surfaces with a multisport court for roller hockey through spring and summer. After some discussions with the facility's management, the organization got the OK and are ready to go.

"There seems to be enthusiasm, so I hope that carries forward into people wanting to take that step to come out here and check it out," Brown said. "The derby skills will slowly be introduced, but we really just want to make sure people have developed body strength, cardio, and the skating skills required to get into practices."

The goal will be to get a season going again, but there are variables.

"The biggest thing is knowing we have a consistent practice schedule," Brown said of finding a long-term facility to use. "Once we get that taken care of, it's about getting a commitment from the skaters to

continue to be involved, because there's a line that you have to be at to make it financially viable."

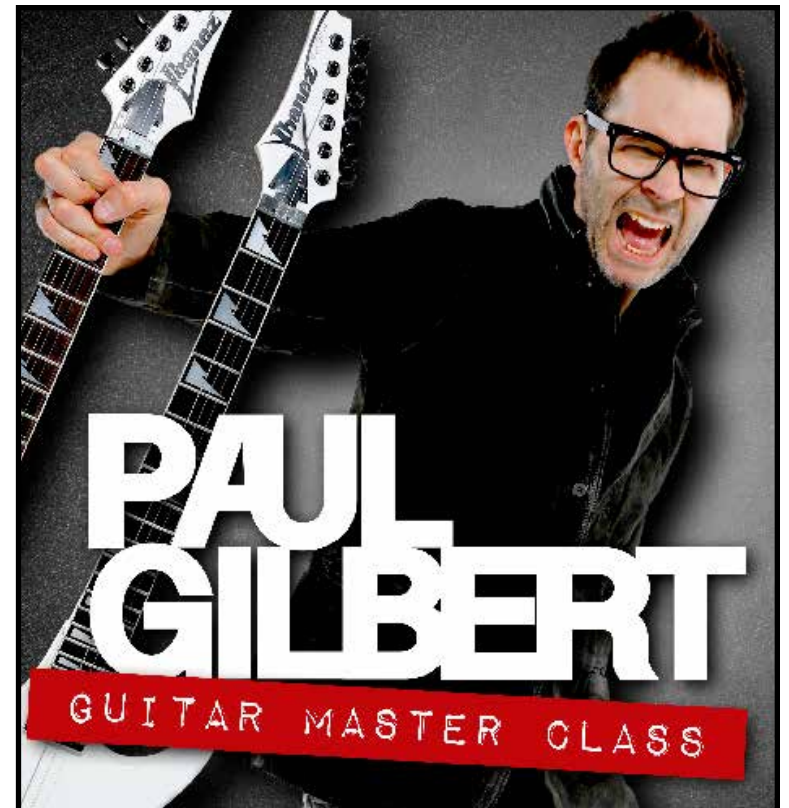
NEEDED DISTRACTION

Regardless of finances, Brown said it feels good to be back.

"A lot of us went through some depression, just because we were instantly jerked out of what was our normal routine," she said. "I'd be the first one to say it hit me, because (roller derby) has been a big part of my life for many, many years. To have it instantly snatched away like that was hard. It was different than ending a season, then going on a break, because everything was in turmoil at that point in time, across the world, including roller derby."

There was a strong turnout at the first training session on Tuesday, April 12, and a lot of new faces will be relied upon. Brown said an ideal roster would include 15 players, which would allow for three rotations of five.

"We've had a lot of people retire," Brown said. "We've had people get married and move away, join the military, go to college; just different things that take their time and focus. So, it was really unknown how many people we would have returning this year."

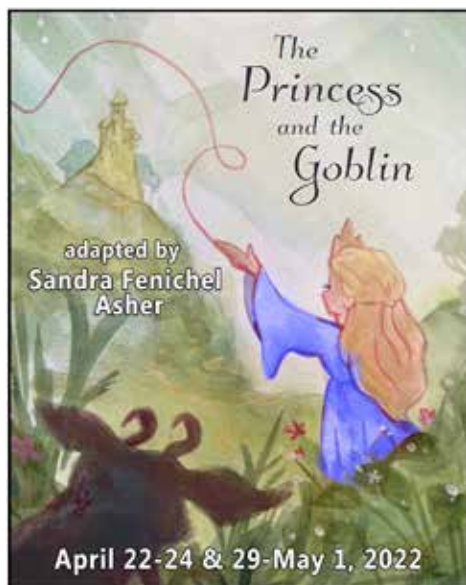

Five for Fighting featured at Foellinger

John Ondrasik, the songwriter and performer known as **Five for Fighting**, will perform at Foellinger Theatre on Saturday, Aug. 13, at 8 p.m.

This delightful show is appropriate for the entire family and will include dance and puppetry and lots of humor.

all for One productions has produced more than 60 full-length stage plays in Fort Wayne the past 20 years. But only a handful have compelled us to produce them a second time. *The Princess and the Goblin* is such a show. Originally staged in the somewhat limited space in the downtown Allen County Public Library auditorium, this is a play which practically begged to be done again in our intimate, flexible black box venue, the PPG ArtsLab.

George MacDonald, a 19th century Scottish pastor and writer, penned this beloved children's fantasy novel in 1872. Our adaptation, written by Sandra Fenichel Asher, is a clever and flexible version, which she suggests can be expanded to include dance and puppetry. We did add both these elements to our 2014 version and are now excited to have included even more.

We are once again partnering with Kinetic Revelation Academy of Dance & the Arts, whose director, Kimberly Bronson, is choreographing several dances and pantomime sequences. Four dancers from her advanced classes will be among the goblins and living "doors" featured in the play. Additionally, local dancer Allison Cwanek, who serves as dance captain for the production, will create another new character, the Dove, who also dances several times.

But that isn't the full extent of the collaborations we're enjoying with local, and mostly young, artists: Lucas Bowman, a talented teenaged craftsman, is designing and constructing several oversized hand puppets to be the goblins' "creatures"; two local composers have been commissioned to write original music; Tori-linn Cwanek, whose incidental music has been heard in four previous afO shows, has created themes for the princess, her mysterious grandmother, and the little goblins; Scott Kump, another longtime afO composer, has concocted a track of layered sampled sounds and percussion for the goblin dancers and their epic battle, which he has designed and choreographed. On top of that, Scott is reprising his 2014 role as the Goblin King!

Colorful, imaginative costuming is being designed and created expressly for our production by lead costumer Mary Swerens, ably assisted by Joyce Klaus. Our two leads, playing Curdie and the princess, are Isaiah Powers and Melanie Klaus, both 14-year-old home-schoolers.

Also featured in the cast are adult actors Dotty Miller (the great-great-grandmother), Abbey Pfenning (Lootie), Leena Edgar (goblin queen), Zachariah Littleford (goblin prince), and Dennis Nichols (Sir Walter).

Fort Wayne will celebrate Earth Day with a variety of activities centering around Eagle Marsh Nature Preserve, 6801 Engle Road, on Sunday, April 24.

With dozens of conservation partners, businesses, educational institutions, government agencies, and local conservation organizations, Earth Day Fort Wayne is a free event from 1-5 p.m. at the Eagle Marsh Barn.

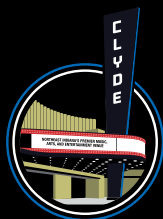

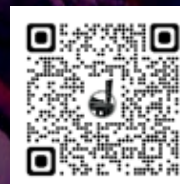

For the record: Vinyl's big day officially back

Local stores ready exclusives, bands for Record Day

It's back, and it's back to normal.

Record Store Day will celebrate all things vinyl Saturday, April 23, bringing back most of the elements that made the tradition great: bands, food, community, and, most of all, plenty of those exclusive releases.

Locally, all three Wooden Nickel locations as well as Neat Neat Neat Records and Music will open at 10 a.m., and there will be lines, so if there is something you really want, you should probably plan on getting there early.

Welcome Back Records opened on Broadway in early February, which was, unfortunately, a little too late to be added to the official Record Store Day promotion, so they won't have any of the exclusive releases, owner Morrison Agen said. The store will still be celebrating, opening at 8 a.m., "with great deals throughout the store," he said.

Agen added that as a bonus, anyone buying any a Third Man Records product at his store that day will be entered into a drawing for a Third Man Bumblefuzz guitar pedal valued at more than \$300.

At Karma Records in Warsaw, owner John Vance said they will be open at 8 a.m. with lots of Record Store Day titles available along with goody bags while supplies last. Vance said his customers are a little more transient, often choosing to make his store a first stop of many or a mid-stop between South Bend and Fort Wayne as they seek out coveted titles.

"Our audience is in and out all day," Vance said. "Fortunately, we are in a cool location where customers often stop while they are making a day of it."

EXCLUSIVE ITEMS

At Wooden Nickel, owner Bob Roets said in an interview with *Whatzup* that he does his best to order as much product as he thinks people will want. However, it can be hard to predict what demand will be, while also being at the mercy of distributors who ration out releases

among the hundreds of stores that participate nationally.

This year's selection is chock-full of collectibles with some of the more sought-after items expected to include a new 7-inch single from 2022 Record Store Day Ambassador Taylor Swift and a double-LP edition of *The Gold Experience* from Prince, an album Roets said he hasn't been able to get for years.

Releases from the Rolling Stones, Santana, and Stevie Nicks are also likely to be popular, as well as Pearl Jam, Childish Gambino, Def Leppard, Judas Priest, The Who, and Alice In Chains.

The soundtrack from David Lynch's *Blue Velvet* should be a hot seller, as well as a new 7-inch single from Foo Fighters.

The full list of special releases is available at RecordStoreDay.com, although not every title on the list will be available at Wooden Nickel or Neat Neat Neat.

RENEWED INTEREST

Often lauded as the main factor in the resurgence of vinyl, Record

Store Day began in 2008 when vinyl sales were at an all-time low.

The renewed interest generated by the event helped sales begin growing at an astronomical rate as new fans discovered the warmth of vinyl and longtime fans repurchased classics and discovered new artists.

According to Statista, an online portal for market data, vinyl album sales in the United States have grown every year since that first Record Store Day, surpassing digital and CD sales in 2021 with a 41.7 million albums sold, more than 45 times what was sold in 2007.

Although the COVID-19 pandemic did its damage to independent record stores, those that were able to weather the storm found that vinyl collecting had come back in an even bigger way. Because many people were sequestered for a long period of time, Roets said, a lot of teens and 20-somethings began the hobby of collecting vinyl.

"Turntable sales went way up, and a new generation has been discovering it," he said.

DEMAND OUTWEIGHS SUPPLY

Unfortunately, the record industry was unprepared for this rapid increase in demand, resulting in long delays in manufacturing that continue to be an issue.

"A lot of these plants that were running a three-to-four-month lead time are now running 10-11 months," Roets said. "We are still trying to get albums that were supposed to be produced last May or June."

The result of this backlog is that most titles have taken a backseat at manufacturing plants, resulting in supply shortages on a lot of staple products.

"We are scouring distributors looking for product and buying as much as we can when we can get it," Roets said.

THE PARTY RETURNS

Record Store Day has been forced to pivot its focus since the pandemic began, organizing three separate and smaller events each year called Record Store Day Drops.

Drops were designed to help stores by simply getting the product

to them, then into the hands of customers as safely as possible. While the records came, there weren't the parties that had become associated with the annual event.

This year, Record Store Day returns to "normal" with one big day full of festivities.

Roets said that although all locations will have some of the exclusive and collectible products, Wooden Nickel's celebration will be focused at the North Anthony location with Crystal C-Note, Alicia Pyle, The Kickbacks, and Adam Baker & The Heartache set to perform from noon to 5 p.m.

Old Crown Coffee will be on hand after a two-year absence to provide a delicious complement to the return of Cindy Roets' highly sought-after homemade cookies.

Goody bags of free stuff will be available to the early birds at all locations, but, Roets said, they are usually gone by noon. You can currently pick up a coupon at any Wooden Nickel to get 10 percent off most non-RSD product April 23.

Customers may also enter a raffle at each location on Record Store Day for a chance to win one of the prizes available, including a Wooden Nickel gift certificate, an Audio Technica turntable, a Rolling Stones *Exile on Main Street* deluxe box set, a Guns N' Roses *Appetite for Destruction* super-deluxe box set, a *History of The Eagles* box set, or a *Def Jam 30th Anniversary Greatest Hits* box set.

At Neat Neat Neat, they will do things a little bit differently with collectors filling out "wish lists" while in line and giving them to store personnel to gather before the store officially opens, thus assuring there will be no mad rush for product when the sale commences.

Bands that will play at that location, starting at 4 p.m., will be The Namby Pamby, Swell Time, and Snakehandler Church, the new project from Fort Wayne's Pete Dio.

This will be 40th anniversary of Wooden Nickel and the 15th anniversary of Record Store Day. Both have become traditions in our community that deserve to be celebrated. Thus, the only option is to get up early April 23, and fill your shopping bags with music.

Support local music and independent record stores. If you love music, this is your day.

Huerco S.

Plonk



Brian Leeds might not be a household name, but his reputation in the electronic music community is unparalleled.

Coming from a background in deep house music, Leeds has taken his musical project Huerco S. into new and exciting places. Basing songs on loops and a kind of distant sort of malaise, Huerco S. sounds like a slow moving rave in the distance while waking from anesthesia.

Colonial Patterns from 2013 was the foundation of Leeds' distinct sound, while 2016's *For Those of You Who Have Never (And Also Those Who Have)* saw his sound become more contemplative and ambient in nature. For his first album as Huerco S. in six years, Leeds pushes further into the unknown while building from his original musical DNA. *Plonk* is electronic music in an ethereal and playful mood.

This is music meant to lose yourself in. Ten tracks titled "Plonk I"–"Plonk X", these tracks are a series of moods. From inquisitive and shaded to light and airy, *Plonk* runs the gamut. A sonic wilderness to explore and find something new with each listen.

"Plonk I" brings to mind Cluster's playful *Curiosum*, while "Plonk II" is more in line with OPN's breakthrough album *Replica*. "Plonk III" sounds like Mark Isham's excellent *Vapor Drawings*.

Other tracks like "Plonk VII" has a playfulness, while also having the feeling of floating through space. Album closer "Plonk X" is 11 minutes of drone that subdues you into its dark and foreboding sound world. Leeds has made an album that feels like a journey, with the closer seemingly taking us into a kind of dark bliss.

What Leeds, aka Huerco S. has in common with artists like Daniel Lopatin, Nate Utesch, Cluster, and Mark Isham is that they all carved their own path in the world of electronic music. Ethereal, eclectic, eccentric, and decidedly unique in a world that is hard to stand out in. Huerco S. makes music that is engaging and ever-evolving, and *Plonk* is proof of that while being another evolution of his sound. — *J. Hubner*

Weezer

SZNZ: Spring



The time to recognize that each new Weezer project is going to be 90 percent gimmick and 10 percent artistry is long past. But it's still hard not to be impressed at Rivers Cuomo's seemingly boundless ability to come up with new ideas for how to describe an album (as opposed to new ideas for actually making an album anyone wants to listen to). That ability is on full display with *SZNZ*, a four-EP project that will release a seasonally-themed EP at the change of each

season in 2022. The first delightful installment is, of course, *SZNZ: Spring*, which released on the vernal equinox.

The EP opens with "Opening Night," which borrows the melody from Vivaldi's "La Primavera," the spring part of his Four Seasons concerto suite. Pretty predictable, but at least it's solidly on theme. But then Cuomo starts singing "Shakespeare makes me happy," revealing that he was inspired by the Bard's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. Most people could look at that play's title and realize it's not about spring, but not Cuomo. He runs with the idea, throwing medieval-ish chants and melodies into frothy love songs.

As with 2021's *Van Weezer*, a hard rock-inspired album that grafted theme-specific bits onto stock Weezer tunes, *SZNZ: Spring* combines the obvious with the familiar. For the most part, the songs sound like Weezer, with the exception of "A Little Bit of Love," which sounds like Lumineers.

The seasonal gimmick might have been interesting (but probably not) if Cuomo's conception of spring extended beyond the clichés of silly love songs and ye olde Ren-Faire balladry. But, as it as, *SZNZ: Spring* doesn't exactly make one eager for what's to come throughout the rest of the year. — *Evan Gillespie*

Blood Incantation

Timewave Zero



Denver's Blood Incantation has made a reputation for themselves as one of the premier death metal bands, eschewing the typical grind of lyrics about war and blood and carnage for something a little headier and cosmic. And after the release of 2019's *Hidden History of the Human Race*, Blood Incantation became one of the most talked about and forward-thinking metal bands working.

Continuing their evolution in sound and aesthetic, Blood Incantation has released their all-instrumental album, *Timewave Zero*. Trading their typical instruments for synthesizers, the band has made an epic ambient metal album and a bold shift in sound. The cosmic death metal is pretty much all cosmic here, giving us a Tangerine Dream-heavy record with small movements that take the listener on an ever-expanding listening experience. Headphones aren't required, but they are encouraged.

I actually came to Blood Incantation via singer/guitarist Paul Riedl's solo work. Outside of the metal scene, Riedl makes late-night improvised synth albums. Ambient and new age in nature, sonically they're light-years from Blood Incantation. But aesthetically these quiet synth albums are just an extension of what Riedl is doing with his metal band.

The album is broken up into two sides, "Io" and "Ea," with each side having four movements. It looks into Tangerine Dream, Vangelis, and Klaus Schulze vibes. All dark and foreboding synth tones that float in a cloud of reverb and shadows,

Pink Floyd

Wish You Were Here (1975)



Pink Floyd's ninth U.S. release was the album that followed the timeless *Dark Side of the Moon*.

One of the most popular albums of all time, *Dark Side* was released at the infancy of the early '70s album-oriented rock FM radio. The album remained in the Billboard Top 200 for 591 consecutive weeks. Oddly, it was the success of *Dark Side* that inspired the band to write *Wish You Were Here*. This was the "we hate each other" album that, although psychedelic and musically compelling, was extremely bitter and depressing. This is the album where the stardom and ego of the band caught up with them. Like 1979's *The Wall*, this was Roger Waters giving everyone the middle finger.

With only five tracks, it starts off with the customary keyboards and the clean David Gilmour guitar, acting as the casual, and yet direct, lead into the whole album. Some have said "Shine on You Crazy Diamond" was a reference to ousted Pink Floyd founder Syd Barrett. The song ends with a sleepy little sax solo, which was a nice touch for a track that is mostly acid rock in its format.

"Welcome to the Machine" is pure Floyd as it attacks the music industry, and "Have a Cigar" is just as direct. And then we get the angst that Waters believes he needs to share in "Wish You Were Here." It's the blues on acid, and although not pretty, Waters was never afraid to bare his soul. The album finishes with "Shine on... Parts 6-9" including a medley of guitar riffs and a dreamy synthesizer that calms us down and leaves us exhausted. It's not better than *Dark Side*, but it's hard to compare two completely different records. — *Dennis Donahue*

Timewave Zero is influenced by early synthesizer albums of the '70s, albums you drop the needle on and take a journey with. This is not a party album. There will be no head-banging or ripping guitar solos.

If soundtracks like *Sorcerer* or *Blade Runner* or records by Rudiger Lorenz, Steve Roach, and Lisa Bella Donna get your brain humming, then you are going to absolutely love Blood Incantation's new direction. If you don't know any of those names and are needing a metal fix, this won't be for you. But if you're looking for something to zone out with after a long day, and if you like to be adventurous musically, then give *Timewave Zero* a shot. — *J. Hubner*

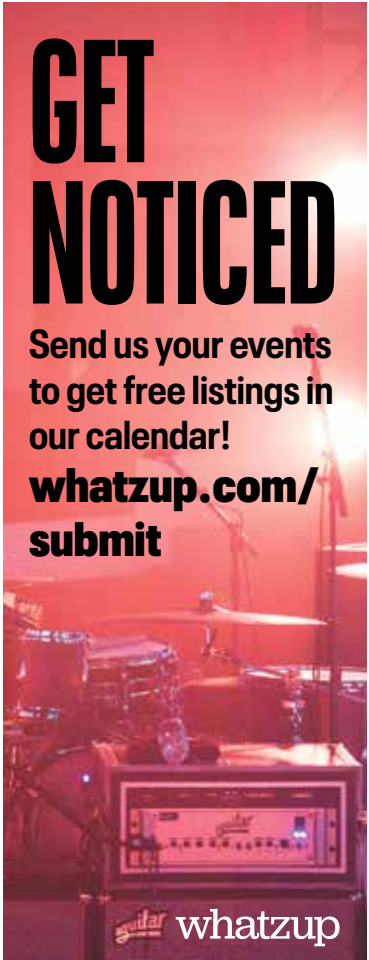

Script doesn't carry enough weight

Following up one of the very best performances of his career in *Pig*, Nicolas Cage is back with his most challenging role yet: Nicolas Cage.

The taunted and vaunted star is naturally playing a heightened version of himself in the cheekily titled *The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent*, an undeniably affable, if frustratingly cursory, buddy comedy that may still satisfy the cult of Cage. That the finished product is more *Midnight Run* than *Being John Malkovich* is completely understandable from a marketing standpoint, but may be disappointing for those expecting, as the tagline boasts, "The Most Nicolas Cage Movie Ever."

Yes, there are plenty of Easter eggs and nods to numerous films in Cage's 40-year pilgrimage on-screen, but the fan service often feels more like window dressing than an integral part of what makes the mechanics of the movie work.

We meet this version of Cage as he is overselling himself to a director (David Gordon Green, in a cameo), who already seems nervous to cast him in his *King Lear* riff. As has seemingly been the case for the real-life Cage, this version is also struggling with finances, as mortgages and alimony to his ex-wife Olivia (Sharon Horgan) add up to more than he has to repay. Given the circumstances, his agent Richard (Neil Patrick Harris) is excited to report that Cage has been offered \$1 million just to show up to the birthday party of wealthy super-fan Javi (Pedro Pascal). On his way to Spain, Cage is stopped by a pair of CIA agents (Tiffany Haddish and Ike Barinholtz), who don't buy that Javi has become a billionaire strictly from working in the olive industry. As Cage and Javi's bond grows closer, Cage is torn between helping the CIA and protecting his new friend from danger.

What's most important about *The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent* is that writer/director Tom Gormican is in on the joke with Cage, and seems to understand both the person and the persona at the center of this meta comedy. At various points in the film, Cage is confronted by a devil-on-the-shoulder version of his *Wild at Heart* character, whose bawdy advice is designed to get them back to the top, no matter what. It's a derivative, but effective, way to bifurcate Cage's larger-than-life screen presence from how he most likely behaves in real life. Gormican is able to reconcile Nic Cage: *Leaving Las Vegas*, Oscar winner with Nic Cage: star of *The Wicker Man* (yes, it's referenced), and create a universe where both can peacefully co-exist.

The seeds of a great movie are there, but the soil isn't packed as well as it could be. Having Cage go to an eccentric billionaire's fancy villa and reflect on his storied screen career through the eyes of a super-fan is a terrific comedic setup. But Gormican wimps out, and dedicates most of the runtime to a broad storyline where Cage is investigating Javi's potential cartel connections behind his back and doing a poor job of spying at the CIA's behest. It sets up moderately funny scenes,

like one where Cage breaks into a server room and accidentally gets knocked out by his own tranquilizing weapon. Cage sells it as well as Leonardo DiCaprio did in the Lemmon Quaalude scene from *The Wolf of Wall Street*, but it's a nondescript sequence that could be in any other spy comedy from the last 10 years.

When the movie focuses on the friendship between Cage and Javi, it becomes sharper, both as a specific kind of drug-fueled buddy comedy and a compendium of Cage conceits. The inevitable scene where Cage finds Javi's embarrassing shrine of his memorabilia features plenty of references to his past projects, but also narrows in on the peculiar bond between the two characters. When Cage happens upon a sequined pillow with his face on it and makes a self-effacing remark while swiping his hand across it, Javi lovingly puts the pattern back in order to reveal his face once more. Javi knows all sorts of fun facts about Cage, like the fact that he did his own car stunts for *Gone In 60 Seconds*, but still has more to learn about who the man actually is off-camera.

A more focused script would've made *The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent* an even bigger joy for fans. But as is, it's an enjoyable romp centered around Hollywood's most beguiling thespian.
