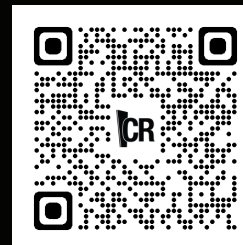

Celebrate *Dark Side* with Pink Droyd

Laser show, music from Pink Floyd closing out Sweetwater Pavilion year

Because of its synchronous rotation, no one will ever see the “dark side” of the moon from Earth. Even among astronauts, only a handful have seen the dark side from space.

Fans of Pink Floyd, however, will get the chance to experience *The Dark Side of the Moon* in its entirety when local tribute band Pink Droyd celebrate the 50th anniversary of the iconic album and more at Sweetwater Performance Pavilion on Sept. 30.

LIGHTING UP THE NIGHT

Co-founder Daniel Fisher, who handles keyboards, synthesizers, theremin, and vocals for Pink Droyd, said the center of this full-production performance will be a laser light show worthy of the 50th anniversary celebration.

“One of our absolute favorite places to play is the pavilion because the lasers look so amazing bouncing off the white ceiling of the dome,” he said.

Fisher said every seat in the pavilion has a different view of the light show, and the lasers not only make “a painting in the air. They make a separate painting on the ceiling. They’re both fascinating to watch and they each behave differently.”

The first half of the show will be filled with fan favorites from other albums, and Fisher said most people recognize a lot more of the Pink Floyd repertoire than they think.

With that, he unpacked the deeper meaning behind the band’s music, which he said has broad appeal to fans and casual listeners alike.

“Pink Floyd has always been about positive change,” he said. “When they talk about ‘us and them,’ they’re talking about all of the things that cause war and just looking at that stuff. Pink Floyd has always been about positive suggestions for humanity, or at least looking at problems that we’re having that hopefully would suggest some solutions.”

LOVE OF PINK FLOYD

Of course, each member of the band is a fan of Pink Floyd, Fisher said. This love of music drives the band to build a concert experience that does justice to Pink Floyd’s music and legacy.

“It’s based on our love of Pink Floyd music, and not just the actual sound of it, but getting everything else right: the visuals, the props, the storylines, the lasers,” he said. “And then even the transition, the sound effects that connect each song to the next, we get all of that in a way that makes us happy.”

Fisher, a former staff sergeant in the Army, says his passion for Pink Floyd began at 11.

“I played Pink Floyd on the piano at my home for my parents, and my parents would listen to me play Pink Floyd for hours,” he said. “They didn’t know anything about rock bands. All they knew was they really liked my piano arrangement. And when I finally got to (Berklee College in Boston), I started meeting people who were good enough to play the other part.”

LIKE-MINDED MUSICIANS

Fisher became a member of a Pink Floyd tribute band in Boston in the early 2000s before an opportunity at Sweetwater Sound brought him back to Fort Wayne. This move, however, initially left him without the opportunity or connections to perform his favorite music.

“I really wanted to start another Pink Floyd tribute because I really enjoyed doing that,” he said. “Just coincidentally, a guy named Kevin Quandt was putting on a show with friends of his own. He was trying to do a Pink Floyd show, not a band, but just a single show.”

Quandt was able to track down and recruit Fisher for this one-off show. With that performance, the seed for Pink Droyd was planted and it’s been producing fruit since 2006.

Now, Fisher and Quandt (vocals/guitar) are joined by Jim Sizelove (drums), Trevor Krall (bass/vocals), Phil Schurger (lead guitar), Ash Morris (tenor sax), Evan Sturzenberger (vocals), Lisa McDavid (vocals), and Jill Jugloff (vocals).

“Not only do I enjoy it, but enjoying it while the lasers are shooting over the top of your head and the lights are going and videos are going and the background singers are going,” he said. “And the audience just loves hearing each of these songs. And I don’t have any delusions that they’re cheering for me. I know they’re not cheering for me. They’re cheering for those songs. But I love those songs, too.”

“Our job is to just bring as much of the feeling that we got from actually seeing Floyd back in the day, and we’re trying to bring that exact feeling to the audience.”

Clyde jazzed to host Culbertson

Playing selections from Trilogy when he visits Sept. 30

Much like his music, there is really no pigeon-holing Brian Culbertson.

The multi-instrumentalist with 25 albums and 40 Billboard No. 1 singles is also a visual artist and has a wine club.

"I am inspired by all the visual arts, from photography, filmmaking, graphic design, architecture, sculpture, and fine art," he says on his website.

He may love art in all its forms, but when he comes to The Clyde Theatre on Saturday, Sept. 30, his attention will be on his bread and butter: contemporary jazz.

THREE-STORY ARC

Prior to his visit to Fort Wayne, the man of many hats was in Chicago from Sept. 14-16, hosting a Jazz Getaway, which he also does in New Orleans (March 14-17) and Napa, California (June 5-9). With the Chicago Jazz Getaway behind him, Culbertson's focus is now on his Trilogy Tour, which kicks off Thursday, Sept. 21, in Chesterfield, Missouri.

Showcasing his work ethic, Culbertson will play 10 shows in 11 nights, wrapping up Oct. 1 in Madison, Wisconsin. Following a month off, he'll get right back on the road.

On tour, he'll be performing from his three-album *Trilogy* collection. *The Trilogy* began with *Red* on Sept. 24, 2021. *Blue* followed on Jan. 14, 2022, and *White* closed out the "three-part arc of a long-term relationship" on May 6, 2022.

"Hearing the three albums in a row provides the context," Culbertson says on his website. "All the songs on *Red* were clearly about passion and love. *Blue* is melancholy and sad songs, breakup songs and 'losing people' songs. Once you get to part three, *White* is all about songs that have an uplifting feel to them. Emotionally, they all feel similar even though they are stylistically broad."

COLLECTING AWARDS

Before embarking on any of his business endeavors, Culbertson

was a college student trying to make his way in the music world.

The son of a music teacher, Culbertson was attending DePaul University in Chicago when he recorded *Long Night Out* in 1994. Sending the album to Mesa/Blue Moon, he received a record deal and has not looked back, releasing 25 albums in 29 years, as well as two live records.

Along the way, his talent has been awarded with numerous honors, including Keyboardist of the Year at the Oasis Smooth Jazz Awards in 2001, International Artist of the Year at the Canadian Smooth Jazz Awards in 2010, and Artist of the

Year by the Smooth Jazz Network in 2020. His busiest year came in 2011 following the release of *XII*. That year he won six awards at the Oasis Smooth Jazz Awards for Entertainer of the Year, Keyboardist of the Year, Male Artist of the Year, Song of the Year for "That's Life," Album of the Year, and Collaboration of the Year with Earl Klugh.

Klugh was featured on the song "That's Life," but he wasn't the only musician Culbertson collaborated with on *XII*, as Faith Evans, Chuck Brown, Kenny Lattimore, Brian McKnight, Avant, and Ray Parker Jr. are also featured.

The performers on that album are only a sampling of the heavy-hitters he's shared a studio or stage alongside. A small sampling of that list includes Stevie Wonder, Bootsy Collins, Prince, Michael McDonald, Buddy Guy, and Barry Manilow.

Addison Agen returns for Baker Street Centre show

Singer-songwriter has seen growth since The Voice appearance

Everybody in Fort Wayne knows Addison Agen. She's the northeast Indiana girl who was the runner-up in season 13 of NBC's singing competition series *The Voice* in 2017 when she was still in high school.

About a month after the final episode aired in January 2018, Agen came back to Fort Wayne to perform two shows at Embassy Theatre, playing for thousands of local fans.

Although conversations with music business executives followed her season on *The Voice*, Agen didn't want a musical style to be dictated to her by the pop producers who took an interest, so she struck out on her own.

Today, out of the television limelight, Agen is forging her own career as an independent artist, and that suits her just fine.

In June 2021, she released her second solo album, *When the Morning Comes*. She wrote all the songs and recorded it with producers and musicians in Michigan, using a small budget funded through a Kickstarter campaign, and released it independently. Agen, with her distinctive voice, made the record to define her own style as an Americana artist with an acoustic folk sound.

Agen recently completed an associate's degree in graphic design, and since then has taken up residence in Nashville, Tennessee, where she is immersing herself in the songwriting culture.

RETURNING HOME

Forging her way in Nashville, she'll be visiting with her Fort Wayne friends for an intimate performance at Baker Street Centre on Friday, Sept. 29.

"We'll be traveling through and playing a show with our friend Max Lockwood," she said in a phone interview with *Whatzup*. "I just travel as a small intimate setup at this point. It's me and Mike Gronsky on guitar. And then Max Lockwood will join in for a couple songs. It'll be a small, intimate night just purely for storytelling and song sharing."

"I moved to Nashville about a year ago and have been writing so much," she added. "I have had quite the crazy ride with music over the past couple of years."

In the concert at Baker Street Centre Agen says, "I'll be telling a little bit of my life story, with a couple songs of other people's stories. All the stories that have really impacted me to make me who I am will be told throughout the night, weaved through with, obviously, plenty of songs."

GOING HER OWN WAY

Agen's musical journey in Nashville has been fruitful.

"I fell into the kindest, most wonderful community of songwriters, and a lot of female songwriters, too," she said. "It's cool to be around such like-minded community."

"It's been really good for me, for my inspiration. It's been easier than I thought it would be — super challenging to meet new people, but in this town it's sort of like everybody wants to meet everybody and write songs with everybody. The way to hang out here is just like, 'Oh, let's go write a song together.' And to me that's the greatest thing ever."

Agen is planning a new album with no definite timetable, but this one will be a Nashville production, with co-writers — the people that are mentoring her and increasing her musical knowledge as she writes with them. She's going to fund the project herself since she is still working without management, a publishing company, or record label.

"It would be awesome to have all that one day, but that hasn't come around yet," she said of representation.

In the meantime, she's on the subscription service Patreon, where a few dozen patrons encourage her to keep putting out music. She also gets opportunities to tour across the country and play house concerts.

"Patreon has been a blessing for sure," she said. "The money from Patreon is definitely going back into getting music out there for people."

LEARNING AS SHE GOES

Finding opportunities to collaborate with more established songwriters in Nashville and building up a catalog of new songs is Agen's priority. She's determined to develop her craft and become a better musician.

"I'm learning from the people that I'm co-writing with," she says. "It's just not through structured education."

Still, the road calls to her, and she's not neglecting opportunities to win new fans in live performances.

"I play probably 50-60 concerts (in a year), but that includes travel days, so probably a third of the year I'm traveling," she said.

In addition to house concerts for Patreon fans, she books other opportunities.

"We do venues, festivals, house concerts, churches," she said. "It's a mix of all of the things that we love."

JUMPING AT OPPORTUNITY

Agen has popped up in a couple of performances here recently, including June 2022 at the Middle Waves festival and this past July at the Three Rivers Festival. But she was featured in a unique performance last holiday

season that not a lot of people know about.

On Dec. 17, the musicians of the Fort Wayne Philharmonic Orchestra had just gone on strike over contract negotiations. On nothing but a couple days of word of mouth and social media posts, the 65 or more musicians gave a free Christmas concert at Purdue University Fort Wayne. More than 1,000 people attended and gave donations. Robert Nance of Heartland Sings conducted the orchestra, and the featured singer was Agen.

"I got a call the week of, and they said, 'Hey, would you be willing to come up and play with us?'" she said. "I don't think I'll ever say no to playing with an orchestra!"

With Nance at the piano, Agen sang one of her favorite songs, "River" by Joni Mitchell, from 1971. In a thrill for folks my age, she sang "Grown-Up Christmas List," in the orchestral arrangement Amy Grant sang from 1992.

"I grew up singing that song with my mom at different Christmas functions and things," Agen said. "It had been years since I'd sang it, so it was cool."

"We're friends with a lot of people in the orchestra, and also I would have done anything to support them. It was super worthwhile for me."

No matter where she travels, Agen is thinking about her friends in Fort Wayne. With the concert at Baker Street Centre she has a chance to catch us up with stories from her musical journey.

"It's going to be great. I'm super excited," she said.

Play takes trip into the absurd

'Anti-play' The Bald Soprano at Williams Theatre has fun with marriage, language

New, unusual, and experimental ideas have propelled theater forward through the centuries. While Americans were enjoying realist plays primarily on our stages during the first half of the 20th century, Europeans gave up on trying to represent objective truth. Instead, wild experimentation reigned across the continent. These experiments also sought to portray reality, but from a different vantage point. The experiments took on the representation of reality from the subject's own limited perspective, exposing all of the fallibility and foibles of human action.



Director's Notes

BEV REDMAN

This half-century of European experimentation reached its peak with the genre Theatre of the Absurd following World War II. Literary critic Martin Esslin coined the term when titling his book on a collection of writers that he suggested had several things in common. Esslin suggested works by Samuel Beckett, Harold Pinter, Arthur Adamov, and Eugène Ionesco, among others, were "absurdist" because they refused to make human actions boil down to rhetorically sound arguments in the way that realist writers had always done.

The Romanian-born French dramatist Eugène Ionesco created his one-act play, *The Bald Soprano*, as an attempt to write something un-entertaining — an "anti-play." He failed miserably because, although sense was lacking, the play was a hit with audiences. The success spurred him on to write more anti-plays.

None of the playwrights Esslin linked together as absurdist mirrored each other. Rather, they are linked for their broad idea about how knowledge works — that our actions are rarely performed with an overall sense of grand design. If there is something besides our will to survive driving us, we cannot know it. Even though we carry the ability to reason, we nevertheless endlessly take part in meaning-making activities that do not lead to the discovery of any final, anxiety-relieving essential truth. We are spinning our wheels until we expire.

The Bald Soprano pokes fun at married life and language at the same time.

In the opening scene, verbal exchanges for this married couple do not require listening since their conversations have been repeated again and again over decades. Consequently, the need to make sense while talking no longer seems necessary if neither is listening.

If failure to listen is explored in the first scene, it is challenged in the next, when a second couple employs intense listening only to figure out something that should have been obvious to them all along. In both of these examples, the exchange of words fails to function in a reliable manner, resulting in a watching and listening experience for the audience that we hope proves to be hilarious.

The Indigo Society

Diana Luna

Fort Wayne's The Indigo Society are a five-piece alternative rock band that packs quite the emotional punch. Wistful vocals from guitarist/vocalist Brody Evans carry over dreamy songs that leave big sonic footprints.

Musically, The Indigo Society make songs that feel big, urgent, and melancholy. Not sad, but thoughtfully aloof, like looking out over a vast and expanding Lake Michigan on an overcast day and thinking about someone you once knew but who are no longer in your life.

There's a lot going into the sound, from alternative to pop to orchestral to hazy psychedelia that hides in layers of delay and keys. There's everything from Smashing Pumpkins to Coldplay to Lumineers to Silversun Pickups to The Besnard Lakes as well as My Morning Jacket.

With the release of their first full-length, *Diana Luna* makes good on the promise of singles and EP *Daisyface* made last year. Big songs, big melodies, and stadium-sized choruses abound.

Diana Luna is filled with songs you'd put on a mixtape and the recipient perks up as soon as The Indigo Society comes on. "Whoa, who is that?" they'd say as album opener "Rain" comes on. Haunting vocals, strummed acoustic, and swells of keys, bass, and drums come in like an emotional whirlwind. There's a majestic quality here, one that feels far larger than the footprint a young Midwest band from The Fort could leave. But leave it they do.

From title track "Diana Luna" to "Don't Look Back" to the chiming single "Grey Poupon," The Indigo Society seem incapable of writing a bad song. "Grey Poupon" captures the spirit of early '90s stalwarts The Cranberries in jangly pop perfection, while "Goodbye June" locks into heavier vibes courtesy of a fuzzed-up guitar sound that captures Silversun Pickups' dark pop swirl.

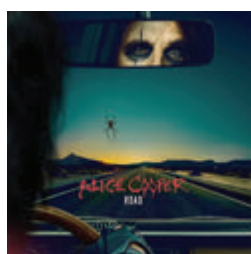
Diana Luna is an open book of a record, showing The Indigo Society's endearing and thoughtful songwriting throughout while adding ear-grabbing production to seal the deal.

The Indigo Society have made a place of their own in that local music scene, and *Diana Luna* is just their opening salvo. Can't wait to see what's next. — J. Hubner

Alice Cooper Road

Two years after paying homage to his hometown with *Detroit Stories*, Alice Cooper is back, this time with his current touring band, for an album dedicated to what they know best: touring.

Recorded live in the studio, with no overdubs,



Cooper's 22nd solo album, *Road*, is a properly themed opus performed with the people he spends the bulk of his time with these days.

The 13 songs are all, in some capacity, centered around the ups and downs of touring and how the band manages every day in a different city. With the help of producer Bob Ezrin, whom Cooper has worked with on several occasions including on classic albums *Killer*, *Billion Dollar Babies*, and *Welcome to My Nightmare*, Cooper revisits that classic sound often, most notably on "Welcome to the Show," where he takes on his rightful persona as the Master of Ceremonies, the catchy "Go Away," the somewhat reimagined version of his song "Road Rats," from 1977's *Lace and Whiskey* titled "Road Rats Forever," and the haunting "100 More Miles."

Cooper also lets the band open up to the harder sound of his *Brutal Planet* and *Dragon-town* era with "Dead Don't Dance," featuring former Cooper guitarist Kane Roberts, and "White Line Frankenstein," featuring Tom Morello of Rage Against the Machine.

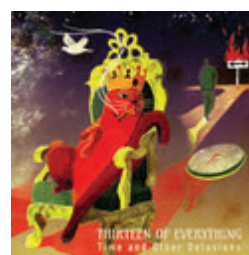
Of course, Cooper's '80s glam metal period is represented with "Big Boots" and "All Over the World." A cover of The Who's "Magic Bus" rounds out the album, feeling a bit unnecessary.

Road also has the energy and feel of a live show, simply due to the way it was recorded. Most of the songs stick with you long after they have ended, making this one of Cooper's strongest efforts of late.

Road is sure to be included near the top of many "Best of 2023" lists. It's a welcome addition to Cooper's legendary catalog. — Chris Hupe

When drummer Bill Bruford held a clinic at Sweetwater a few years ago, one of many things he said was, "One of the great things about the modern music industry is that anyone with a couple mics and a computer can make their own album. And one of the tragic things about the modern music industry is that anyone with a couple mics and a computer can make their own album."

And all those homespun efforts end up on bandcamp.com, for better or worse.

In the case of *Thirteen of Everything*, it is definitely for the better. A regular label would have little use for this prog-laden dad band, but this time, we don't need the label to introduce us an excellent exploration on the prog front.

The sonic and recording quality is superb and nowhere distracts from some superior-sounding old-school prog.

Thirteen seems comfortable at home in the realm of odd time sigs. Any musician who has written and played in an odd time sig knows the next level of skill up from accomplishing this is writing/singing coherent lyrics in the errant

Aztec Camera met the challenge with clever hooks and simple arrangements that strutted around behind the easygoing vocals from Roddy Frame. This first full-length record is almost perfect if only because it fits the blueprint for the era of modern rock and new wave.

"Oblivious" starts things off on the release, followed by "Walk Out Winter" which has elements of Squeeze and Culture Club, but fails to sound as original, if only because the genre had already saturated the market. The last song from side one (on the cassette) was the dreamy "We Could Send Letters." Decent guitars and above average writing make it one of the better tracks from their six-album arc through 1995. Crisp guitars and harmonies with keyboards were their brand, and they nailed it with this track from their debut.

"Pillar to Post" opens the other side with more harmonies and safe lyrics and almost hits the Brit-pop square, but the Scots had a different approach to the sound as noticed when you listen to the regions' other bands like Altered Images, Blow Monkeys, or Bronski Beat. "Lost Outside the Tunnel" also has a sharp acoustic guitar that drives the tempo behind the harmonies and has a touch of The Smiths or early Cure in its arrangement. "Back on Board" is another one of the "pretty songs," and it continues the almost flawless production, even if it contains the simple elements of the music from 40 years ago! — Dennis Donahue

meter. Many will simply cheat and sing a phrase in 4/4 over the odd number of beats, then let the time resolve itself back to the downbeat and come in with another 4/4 phrase. Not *Thirteen of Everything*. If the song is in 5/4, the lyrics are coherently in 5/4 as well.

This work contains not one or two, but three, prog epics that clock in at more than 10 minutes. Two of them float by effortlessly, but "The King of Istanbul" seems like it drags too long.

Oddly enough, a catchy earworm of an instrumental in 5/4 time, "Where the Time Goes," is one of the strongest cuts on the album.

There is enough going on to hold your interest for multiple listenings, and it sounds like familiar classic prog without just being a repeat of what has gone before. — Keith Roman

Invest your time into *Dumb Money*

The always whip-fast and sometimes whip-smart finance comedy *Dumb Money* opens with a definition of its title: A term for what Wall Street investors call amateur day traders looking to get a piece of the action.

The film functions as a cheeky biopic of very recent history, when individual “retail investors” took arms against the hedge funders who claim to know the market better than everyday people. Based on *The Antisocial Network* by Ben Mezrich, the author whose *The Accidental Billionaires* served as the basis for David Fincher’s *The Social Network*, this alt-finance David vs. Goliath story cuts corners to maintain its nimble pace at the expense of its characters. But in their tightly allotted screen time, every member of the impressive ensemble cashes in with moments of wit and humanity that pay dividends.

It’s the summer of 2020 and YouTuber Keith Gill (Paul Dano) has a bit of a wild idea. As his social media persona Roaring Kitty, he tells his fanbase he’s invested more than \$50,000 in video-game retailer GameStop, which was trading for about \$3 a share. Thanks to the hive mind of the subreddit r/WallStreetBets, users from all walks of life, like college students Harmony (Talia Ryder) and Riri (Myha’la Herrold) to nurse Jennifer (America Ferrera) and store clerk Marcus (Anthony Ramos), begin to invest. Soon enough, the phenomenon of the “meme stock” is born, to the chagrin of hedge fund managers like Gabe Plotkin (Seth Rogen) and Ken Griffin (Nick Offerman), who have effectively bet against GameStop. The short squeeze triggers a congressional hearing that also implicates Vlad Tenev (Sebastian Stan), the mind behind the brokerage app that made the tsunami of trading possible.

The reasonable question to ask going into *Dumb Money* is, “How much do I need to know about investing to keep up with this movie?” While director Craig Gillespie won’t expect you to know the intricacies of the stock market or the purview of the House Banking Committee, it would help going in to know how apps like Reddit and Robinhood generally work. Thankfully, Gillespie doesn’t resort to the glib fourth-wall breaks that plagued *The Big Short* and his previous biopic *I, Tonya*. He trusts scribes Lauren Schuler Blum and Rebecca Angelo to lay out what we need to know on the financial side and have the interpersonal conflicts fill in the gaps. The script also throws out fun tidbits like the fact that GameStop was able to be deemed an “essential business” during the pandemic simply because they sell computer mice.

Understandably, the easiest way into this story is through Gill and Dano, who continues a strong streak of lived-in and accessible performances that shed the self-conscious insularity of his earlier work. While the movie seems to sell Gill short in terms of his real-life sound financial analysis, instead portraying him as more of a cat-crazy goofball, Dano imbues the character with a spirited underdog quality that makes him difficult to root against.

Pete Davidson also serves as a fun comic foil to Keith as his slacker brother Kevin, who teases him in real life and behind an internet cipher, all while borrowing his

car without asking. When Keith sets Kevin straight on the difference between Jimmy Buffett and Warren Buffett, Kevin retorts, “See, you’re neither of the Buffetts!”

In addition to *The Accidental Billionaires* connection, *Dumb Money* aims to be the rabble-rousing younger brother to *The Social Network* in several other ways. Its brisk pace across numerous players and locations is assured by editor Kirk Baxter, who won an Oscar with Angus Wall for assembling David Fincher’s 2010 masterpiece. The misguided music score by Will Bates tries desperately to mimic the nervy propulsion behind Trent Reznor and Atticus Ross’ brilliant music for that same movie. But of course, both films are telling true stories based around technology that were turned around into the cinematic realm quite quickly; *The Antisocial Network* is just barely two years old and we already have a movie based on it.

Dumb Money may be short-sighted in its summation of the real-life events, but it’s a flashy and fun way into the rapidly changing world of DIY investing.

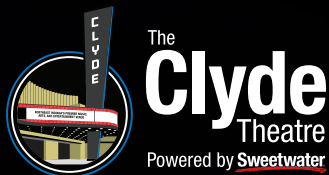

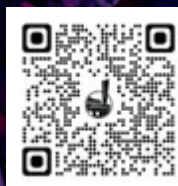
