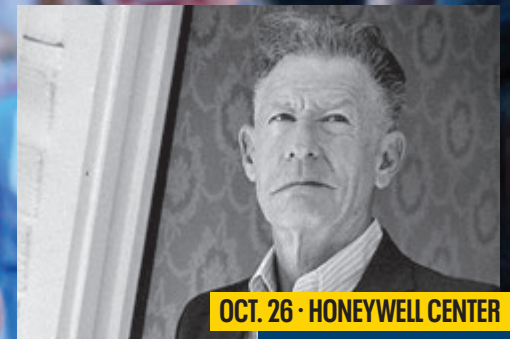

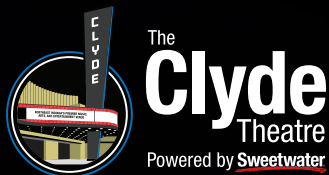

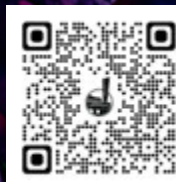

Lyle Lovett taps friend for show at Honeywell

Country star joined by Leo Kottke for acoustic performance on Oct. 26

Lyle Lovett released *12th of June* last year, his first album of original material since 2012's *Release Me*. In yet another example of the pandemic getting in the way of best-laid plans, Lovett had things all lined up for a much earlier arrival of his latest batch of music.

"We recorded these tracks in November of 2019 with the idea of finishing them in March of 2020," Lovett said in a phone interview.

While Lovett did get to join his Large Band in the studio and record the basic tracks for *12th of June*, the pandemic had a huge effect on mixing and other work required from that point forward to finish the album.

"Chuck Ainlay, my producer in Nashville (Tennessee), would go through tracks and mix and go through as we made edits and changes," Lovett said. "He would email me everything he was doing, and then I would listen on my own. It was just not the same. The back and forth is just not as much fun, really, because a decision that would take five minutes to make in the studio would end up being two or three days by e-mail.

"So, it slowed everything down immensely. It's just not as much fun listening and analyzing something all by yourself as it is working with people. So I missed the interaction. I missed the humanity in making the record, and it felt more, in the context of being isolated from the world anyway, it added to that feeling of isolation rather than helped to diminish it."

With the pandemic subsided, Lovett is back on the road, making a stop at Honeywell Center in Wabash on Thursday, Oct. 26, with folk singer Leo Kottke.

LARGE BAND REIMAGINES CLASSIC BALLADS

Eventually, Lovett got to work in person with Ainlay to put the finishing touches on *12th of June*.

Lovett, one of music's finest and most literate songwriters, has done his share of excellent

albums that lean toward country and feature a good bit of acoustic instrumentation with 1987's *Pontiac*, 1992's *Joshua Judges Ruth*, 2012's *Release Me*, and *12th of June*, his third studio album billed with his Large Band.

With this ensemble of talented musicians, Lovett is able to greatly expand his musical reach. That's obvious right from the start of *12th of June*, which opens with a version of jazz great Horace Silver's "Cookin' at the Continental," a lively instrumental that lets the Large Band showcase their considerable chops.

Three duets with Lovett's longtime vocal counterpart Francine Reed further cement the jazz credentials of all involved as they tackle two songs associated with Nat King Cole: the peppy "Straighten Up and Fly Right," the bluesy ballad "Gee Baby, Ain't I Good to You," and the David Frishberg-penned standard "Peel Me A Grape."

Lovett's more country-leaning sound emerges on the ballads "Her Loving Man," "The Mocking Ones," and the title track, while "Pig Meat Man" puts a bit of soul and blues into the mix. "Are We Dancing" adds a string-laden ballad that is rooted in the pre-rock n' roll era.

INCORPORATING PERSONAL LIFE INTO SONGS

The 10-year gap between *12th of June* and *Release Me* was largely the product of being between record deals and needing time to figure out how he wanted to release his next collection of songs. That was coupled with a major development in Lovett's personal life: his marriage to longtime girlfriend April Kimble in 2017, followed by the birth of the couple's twins.

Along with touring commitments — Lovett tends to play about 100 concerts during normal years — these factors absorbed a lot of time.

Marriage and fatherhood figure prominently into the lyrics of the original songs on *12th of June*. "Her Loving Man" is a tribute to Kimble and her intelligence, wisdom, and warmth. The title song is a touching tune that imagines a father carrying his love for his wife and children into the next life. Lovett applies his trademark wry humor to "Pants Is Overrated," which was inspired one day when his children were resisting the idea of getting dressed, and "Pig Meat Man" is an ode to pork.

Having already done a winter/spring run with his acoustic band, followed by a summer tour with his full 14-member Large Band, Lovett is ending the year by trading songs with Kottke on a solo acoustic tour. He just finished similar shows with John Hiatt and Chris Isaak.

"You know, it's just so much fun because this is a chance for me to hang out with some of my favorite songwriters and to get to talk with them," Lovett said.

Spirit Bomb brings explosive anime show to Sweetwater

Filling void felt by fans who want to see their favorite songs played

If you like anime, art, and incredible rock, then Spirit Bomb is for you.

“Spirit Bomb is an explosive anime tribute band making waves across the nation,” their website reads. “Fronted by vocalist Elaina Sekino and guitarist Kevin (Samuel), better known as Tuning the World, they join forces to create an unforgettable live concert experience for anime enthusiasts worldwide.”

Sekino and Samuel are joined by Nate Buesching on bass and Damian Hyde on drums. They will perform at Sweetwater Sound on Saturday, Oct. 21.

PAYING HIS DUES

I have had the pleasure of working with Spirit Bomb in the past, and even though I am not big into anime, it was such a fun and unique experience. Seeing all the cosplay within the crowd and watching faces light up when their favorite show is represented is quite the joy.

“I’ve been local to Fort Wayne since I moved here in middle school,” Samuel said. “That’s roughly when I picked up the guitar and got into recording at the same time. I scratched out my ideas for songs on a Fostex 4-track tape player ... this was pre-Napster times!”

“I was surrounded by music thankfully from my father who has been a regular gigging bass player since I was born. He encouraged me to pick up the guitar and inspired me greatly. Shout out to my mom for buying my first guitar though and getting me into lessons early on.”

Moving around quite a bit when he was young, Samuel has always felt at home on stage.

“I always admired the stage and knew I wanted to be a guitar player in a big band,” he said. “I got to it right out of high school and landed a spot in a local band around 2005 that had some radio play on local stations. I knew my strengths in the band as guitar player, but also learned what it took to promote and negotiate deals for the band.”

After moving out of the Summit City, Samuel would return, picking up where he left off.

“Fast forward to 2012, I moved back to Fort Wayne and started a new band called Thematic,” he said. “Social media was picking up then, and many independent artists started to emerge out of nowhere. I knew we had a chance to get this band thing going in a direction that could lead to the big stages. We invested in our own recording gear and spent many months in the basement working on our

debut album and landed spots on concerts opening for national bands.”

However, just as Thematic, which included Buesching, Ryan Schmidt, and Adam Cesarz, got moving, good ol’ 2020 came along.

“We made our second album and released it in January of 2020, and then everything shut down,” Samuel said. “All the steam was gone in an instant with the pandemic. I decided to not sit and wait, and pushed the release out as an interactive album release instead of the standard, ‘Our album on Spotify just dropped. Check it out please!’ I sought out animation artists to create an entire full-length movie that played out along with the concept and story of our album called *Skyrunner*.”

SPIRIT BOMB TAKES SHAPE

When asking them about their origin story, Sekino and Samuel share similar stories.

“Kevin and I met through another gig,” Sekino said. “He found out I was half Japanese and that I spoke Japanese, and he immediately went on a rant about his love of anime.”

“It turned out he had an anime YouTube channel with a pretty big following. When he asked me to collaborate on a cover for his channel, I was like, ‘Why not?’ I was excited to sing in Japanese.

“We recorded ‘See You Space Cowboy’ from *Cowboy Bebop*, and I made an offhand

comment about how there was probably a market for live anime music at anime conventions and such. Kevin took that idea and ran with it!

“The next thing I knew, he had a website set up, had a logo ... he even had a name picked out. Spirit Bomb was born.”

If the idea seemed to come out of nowhere for Sekino, it was something Samuel latched onto.

“I had been compiling a long list of songs we could do for our show and built playback tracks to help support our performances,” he said. “After a couple shows as a duet, I felt like we lacked the dynamics to really bring us to the next level.”

That next level meant more members on the team.

“In walks Damian Hyde, who had seen our debut performance at the 2022 Cherry Blossom Festival,” Samuel said. “He wanted to join the band and fulfill the role of drummer. His skills were on another level, and his love for anime might even exceed mine.”

Then came Buesching, who Samuel was familiar with from their time in Thematic.

“Nate’s a multitalented musician and we’ve known each other for 15 years,” Samuel said. “Don’t let his Oni mask fool you. He’s a standup comedian and a giant muscular teddy bear.”

GIVING FANS WHAT THEY WANT

The band provides plenty of pop, showcased by their recent set at Piere’s ahead of the metal act hanabie out of Japan. Along with their excellent musicianship, they also play anime on a screen behind, much to the elation of fans.

“Spirit Bomb, or Genki Dama as it’s known Japan, is a reference to the character Goku from (the popular anime series) *Dragon Ball Z* and his famous last-ditch effort powerful attack. Spirit Bomb was created to give fans of anime and Japanese culture an experience that can’t be found here in the U.S.

“Many fans of anime know their favorite songs from the show, but might not ever get a chance to see those artists come to the U.S. and perform live in concert. We took our skills and expertise as musicians and professionals in the music industry to bring this to an underserved audience.

“Like Goku’s *genki dama*, Spirit Bomb gather their power from all the great anime music in existence to coalesce into an explosive live performance.”

Spirit Bomb find inspiration through the diverse crowds that come to their shows and how much passion they have for Japanese culture.

“I think it’s fascinating that such a massive demographic of Americans are so interested in Japanese culture through anime,” Sekino said. “At many of the events we perform at, I’m the only Japanese person present. It’s a real treat to represent Japan and get to interface with fans who love anime so much. The music we perform means so much to them. It’s truly humbling at times.

“This music is really special. It spans every genre from rock to pop to jazz to classical — there really is something for everyone. I’ve had people approach me after shows and say they came just because their friend, kid, or spouse was into anime, but that they ended up having a blast.”

That appreciation is evident. When they performed at Sweetwater in November 2022, the show sold out the 250-seat Performance Theatre. Because of that, this year’s show will be in the 500-seat training center.

“We look forward to performing over 90 minutes of music plus having some special guests and cosplay showcase,” Samuel said. “We want to see you best outfits.”

Along with songs from you favorite anime, Spirit Bomb are also working on original material. They recently released the single “Asai Yume” on streaming services.

The Phil stay busy with Chamber, Freimann series

Intimate settings offer up-close performances by talented musicians

Everybody knows the Fort Wayne Philharmonic as the monumental orchestra where well upwards of 65 musicians perform major classical symphonies and concertos with international solo stars in Auer Performance Hall at Purdue University Fort Wayne. That's the Masterworks series.

While the orchestra is more than the sum of its parts, the parts make interesting music, too.

The Phil is launching their Chamber Orchestra series, which they call The Sound of Innovation, three concerts with a different class of music that calls for 30 or 40 musicians. This year they are in a new space at Electric Works, where tickets come with “tasting boxes” of food and drink from the Union Street Market.

Then there's the most intimate musical experience, the Freimann series, where you can sit up close in a small hall and hear groups of three, four, or five musicians play. It's called “chamber music,” a whole other dimension of “classical.” Each of the four Freimann concerts will be given twice: a Wednesday evening show at The History Center downtown and on a Sunday afternoon at the Rhinehart Recital Hall at PFW.

THE MAN WITH THE KNOWLEDGE

Explaining all this is complicated, as the Philharmonic lists 45 performances in Fort Wayne on the calendar in this season, October through May. Each series, Masterworks, Pops, Family, Youth Orchestras, Chamber Orchestra, and Freimann, run in parallel.

One musician who is on top of all this is principal bass player Adrian Mann, the orchestra's librarian since 1973. This is the orchestra's 80th season, and his 51st, so nobody is more Philharmonic than Mann. He is also an accomplished arranger and composer.

“The constant remark that we get from audience members is, ‘I really enjoy being up close and personal and watching the musicians’ interaction,’” Mann said about the Freimann series. “And the fact that there's no conductor means that each of the musicians is responsible for making it work.”

“In The History Center, half of it is the charm of the building. It's a very old building. It's got all the history of Fort Wayne in it. And it's more like playing in somebody's living room. It's in the middle of the city and it's got big tall windows where you can see traffic going on and people going by.”

In contrast is the modern Rhinehart at PFW, built in 2007, and designed for chamber music. It's adjacent to Auer Performance Hall where the orchestra performs.

CHAMBER ORCHESTRA SERIES

The Chamber Orchestra series begins Saturday, Oct. 21, at Electric Works. Young conductor Alex Lee leads the orchestra in passionate short pieces by Satie, Brahms, Fauré, Saint-Saëns, Morton Gould, and contemporary composer Jessie Montgomery. Cellist Andre Gaskins is featured.

On Dec. 22 at the Auer at PFW, as part of the Chamber Orchestra series, they present the timeless *Messiah* by Handel, with conductor Benjamin Rivera, the Fort Wayne Philharmonic Chorus, and soloists.

On Feb. 10, conductor Troy Webdell presents short pieces by Holst, Bizet, Shostakovich, Purcell, Schubert, and Respighi — music spanning 300 years.

The final Sound of Innovation concert is March 16, conducted by Benjamin Rivera. It opens with Fauré's *Pavane*, Op. 50. Next is Mozart's *Concerto for Horn*, K. 495, featuring the Philharmonic's new French horn player Kimberlee Hebdon. Composer William Grant Still's energetic *Danzas de Panama* is featured, along with several of Brahms' lively Liebeslieder Waltzes and Hungarian Dances, which were originally written for piano and later orchestrated.

FREIMANN SERIES

This year's Freimann series theme is Brahms and The Romantic Spirit.

Johannes Brahms (1833-1897) is one of the greatest figures in Western music. His works spanned the Romantic era, while he influenced his contemporaries and composers who came after. The four concerts feature earlier music that influenced him, pieces by Brahms himself, and music by 20th-century “neo-romantic” composers continuing in Brahms' footsteps.

The Freimann series begins Wednesday, Oct. 25, with a concert featuring Robert Schumann's *Piano Quartet*, Op. 47, Samuel Barber's wind quintet *Summer Music*, and Dvořák's piece for two violins and viola, Op. 74.

The next concert is *Exotic Discoveries*, Jan. 24 and 28. It begins with Mann's piece *MuroLibes*, which he wrote for and will perform with Philharmonic musicians Alexandra Tsilibes on violin and Akira Murotani on trumpet. Next up is Alvin Etler's *Sonata for Bassoon and Piano*, and Brahms' student Ethel Smyth's *String Quintet*, Op. 1.

The Freimann series continues Feb. 28 and March 3 with Beethoven's last string quartet, Op. 135. It begins with *Four Outings for Brass* by André Previn, who passed away in 2019, and Clara Schumann's *Piano Trio*, Op. 17.

The last Freimann concert is the flagship, *Brahms and The Romantic Spirit*, May 8 and May 12. It begins with Beethoven's *Wind Sextet*, Op. 71. Beethoven died before Brahms was born, but Brahms built his music on Beethoven's foundation. Then out of nowhere comes *Rising* for flute and string quartet, by contemporary American composer Joan Tower, who turned 85 this year. It's capped by Brahms' *Piano Quartet No. 3*, Op. 60, with violin, viola

As a result, entrepreneurs don't fork over money to gain the right tools and equipment at the start. They are also free from maintenance headaches.

"It is like living with your parents and then getting your first apartment," Robinson said. "The commitment isn't as big, but you are still on your own to do some things."

In short, cooks and bakers show up with their food and get to work being creative.

"I can have several businesses (in the kitchen) at one time," Robinson said. "They reserve the time and days they want and they can do it 24/7."

Clint Black is not resting on laurels

Country star will perform Oct. 28 at Honeywell Center

Clint Black considers himself lazy. It's a rather absurd statement when you consider what he accomplished during the pandemic-fueled lockdown.

In addition to performing on a regular livestream and launching his line of Clint Black Cowboy Coffee, he pitched and was cleared to host *Talking in Circles with Clint Black*, a television show that's a behind-the-scenes conversation of two entertainers talking shop.

All this came on top of releasing 2020's *Out of Sane*, his 13th studio outing. And now with live music venues back up and running, Black's welcoming his return to the road.

"My booking agent — we renamed him rescheduling agent — and he did a great job of keeping things moved up just far enough in front of us so they might happen," he said. "Now I'm as busy as I like to be."

His 2023 schedule includes a healthy run of dates that continues into early February. Amid that run is an Oct. 28 stop at Honeywell Center in Wabash.

WINNING FORMULA

As for *Out of Sane*, it's a collection of songs that find Black sticking with the tried and true,

working with longtime collaborator Hayden Nichols.

After opening with the bluesy slow-burner "Hell Bent," Black switches gears into the twangy toe-tapper "My Best Thinkin'" and the sentimental "America (Still in Love With You)," both penned with friend and fellow Nashville, Tennessee, veteran Steve Wariner.

Elsewhere, Black delivers a solid reading of Fred Neil's "Everybody's Talkin'."

"It's still one of the songs I can listen to when I'm overexposed to it and my ears are still happy," he said.

BECOMING DISENFRANCHISED

Born in Long Branch, New Jersey, Black and his family moved to his grandfather's hometown of Katy, Texas, before the future country star's first birthday.

After dropping out of high school and performing his music at bars for about a decade, Black burst out of the gate with his multi-platinum 1989 debut *Killin' Time*. Along with performers like Steve Earle, k.d. lang, Dwight Yoakam, and Lyle Lovett, the Texan stormed Music Row as an artist who penned his own material.

Despite turning out hit-laden follow-ups that included 1990's *Put Yourself in My Shoes*, 1993's *No Time to Kill*, and 1994's *One Emotion*, Black faced pressure from then-label RCA to start relying on outside composers for material.

After agreeing to change a verse in a song at the request of RCA's Joe Galante, Black found himself

in the president's office having an uncomfortable conversation about wanting to continue writing his own material.

"I recorded the new verse, sent it in and (Galante) loved it," Black said. "So, I went in and talked to him and told him I wanted to be cooperative, but I didn't understand the pressure to record outside songs when I have so many songs that I had written."

"He said they just wanted a little taste and it broke my heart. If he would have said that he didn't think my songs were that great anymore, I would have felt better. It would have still hurt, but it wasn't about that. It was about spreading the revenue from my record to share it with the people on Music Row and I thought that was the exact wrong reason to do anything."

Following the release of 1999's

D'lectrified, Black and RCA parted ways.

POPPING UP ON TELEVISION

While Black has continued making music and touring, he has expanded into television and film.

Among the shows he's appeared on are *Secret Talents of the Stars*, "I worked on my jokes and performed in a comedy club"; *Celebrity Duets*, "I sang a song with Cheech (Marin)"; and *Celebrity Apprentice*, "I'm glad I have it behind me. That up-close, upfront, and personal exposure to ugliness is more than I ever want to see again."

In 2020, he and his wife, Lisa Hartman Black, appeared in *The Masked Singer* as "Snow Owls," competing as the series' first duet competitors while riding in a mobile egg. As difficult an experience as it was,

Black was happy coming out of the other end of it.

"It was really challenging in a good way," he said. "The challenge in a bad way was singing inside that suit. You can't see, the little lenses you're looking out of are fogged up after 30 seconds, and you're sweating. If you have to move at all, it's perilous because it's inside of that egg. We had inches at a time."

"But I typically like stuff like that because I don't see myself as too precious to step into weird things. I sometimes second-guess myself after getting in it. I like being a little afraid of things, and I like finding myself in situations where something comes out that otherwise wouldn't have happened."

Don't miss your chance to see him on back on the road, where he is most comfortable.

Family Series performs music from Mexico, China, Middle East

Hey, kids and parents: Want to travel around the world without leaving Fort Wayne? Want to hear great stories, do fun activities, and enjoy fascinating music?

Well, the Fort Wayne Philharmonic Orchestra isn't just about their big, imposing Masterworks concerts. They also give concerts for children and their families and sponsor Youth Orchestras with high school musicians and singers.

To learn about the Youth Orchestras and Family Series, *Whatzup* spoke with The Phil's conductor Troy Webdell, who also conducts the South Shore Orchestra in Valparaiso.

Orchestral musicians play music from all over the world, and the lucky ones get to travel all over, too. Between his concerts here, Webdell toured China with musicians from the U.S. for a decade, playing Western and Chinese classical music.

YOUTH ORCHESTRAS

Conducted by Webdell, Youth Orchestras will perform their fall concert at 4 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 22, at the Purdue University Fort Wayne's Auer Performance Hall. They will be joined by the Fort Wayne Children's Choir and the PFW Chorus.

Youth Orchestras will also be at Grand Wayne Center during the annual Night of Lights on Wednesday, Nov. 22.

The season continues into 2024 when Youth Orchestras perform at The FAME Festival on March 16 at Grand Wayne Center. Their spring concert is March 24 at Auer Performance Hall.

The season finale is May 12 at Auer.

DÍA DE LOS MUERTOS

The Family Series includes four concerts that take families to Mexico, China, the Middle East, and back to Fort Wayne.

Each Saturday event starts at 10 a.m. with an hour of children's and family activities. There will be hands-on crafts and storytelling by folks from Fort Wayne Museum of Art and Allen County Public Library. Sweetwater will also provide the Instrument Playground, where kids and parents can play instruments the orchestra plays.

Then at 11 a.m., Webdell will lead the orchestra of 50 musicians in a one-hour concert of

classical and pop music.

"During the pandemic, when no one was performing, I did this radio show called *Stories in Music* on WBNI, and it featured children's books with orchestral music," Webdell said. "Last season, we made it come to life" with live concerts. This season, "we're taking a twist on it; it's going to be world music."

Día de los Muertos: A Day of the Dead Celebration kicks the series off Saturday, Oct. 28. Fort Wayne's own children's dance group Amaneceres de Mexico, with their colorful costumes, will perform. The music features "Remember Me" from the 2017 Disney Pixar movie *Coco*, Camille Saint-Saëns' spooky *Danse Macabre*, and short pieces by living Mexican composers Mariana Villanueva and Arturo Marquez.

Amaneceres de Mexico is a children's traditional folk dance group, or ballet folklórico de niños, that have been performing at local events year-round for 20 years. "Amaneceres" means "sunrises." The group has 20 girls and boys as young as 3.

Director Margarita Walley started dancing in her hometown of Juárez, Chihuahua, Mexico. As a young woman, she led a group that got to perform on TV in El Paso, Texas. She has called Fort Wayne home for 25 years.

Mexican ballet folklórico showcases couples dancing in varied styles from different states around Mexico, complete with lots of costume changes. Walley, who has trained and rehearsed the children in her group year-round for a generation, is proud to say she makes most of those elaborate, colorful costumes herself.

"I'm a busy girl," she said in an understatement.

The children of Amaneceres will also dance at Fort Wayne Museum of Art on Nov. 5 at the conclusion of their community *Día de los Muertos* exhibition. That day will be full of family activities.

CHINESE NEW YEAR

Teenage Fanclub

*Nothing
Lasts Forever*



The Scottish power pop band Teenage Fanclub have had an illustrious career. Forming in 1989, they released their debut, *A Catholic Education*, in 1990 during peak college rock years. Teenage Fanclub added a fuzzed-out, sweetly melancholy voice to the noise coming from the music underground. They made albums that were endearing and offered a voice to the lovelorn romantics.

With 1991's *Bandwagonesque* they secured their place in the hallowed halls of alternative rock.

Nothing Lasts Forever is the 13th album from the band, following 2021's *Endless Arcade*, which was their first since the departure of co-founder Gerard Love. Despite losing Love, Teenage Fanclub have kept the magic alive and have evolved the sound into a quieter-yet-evocative style.

Nothing Lasts Forever is the sound of a band moving on. There's a feeling of wanting to take the sound into new territory, while staying true what we've come to know.

"Foreign Land" opens in a haze of feedback before locking into a folksy acoustic groove. Driving rhythm and vocal harmonies bring it into Beta Band territory. "Tired of Being Alone" locks into *Bandwagonesque* vibes but with a more subdued vibe. "See the Light" works well in a middle-of-the-road groove and tasteful horns giving the song a soulful feel.

The album does not have the big dynamic shifts of songs like "What You Do to Me" or "The Concept," but it keeps you listening and engaged. It is layered in McGuinn-esque vocal turns and catchy melodies that make the songs ear worm-worthy. Songs like "Falling Into the Sun" and "Middle of My Mind" are late-career highs.

Teenage Fanclub have continued to evolve their sound 30 years in, and *Nothing Lasts Forever* feels like a new beginning. — *J. Hubner*

Cannibal Corpse

Chaos Horrific



Four decades into their career, death metal pioneers Cannibal Corpse have released their 16th studio album. It ticks all the boxes: disgusting album cover, hilariously graphic song titles, and sludgy riffs and sick blast beats galore.

"Overlords of Violence" showcases underappreciated bassist/founding member Alex Webster for a quick introduction before the band bludgeons in full force. In enters the iconic George "Corpsegrinder" Fisher to push down the true stamp of a CC album, horrifying lyrics of

brutal violence. The band has never shied from embracing the caricature that they have created for themselves and the entire death metal genre.

After a couple fast-paced songs, "Summoned for Sacrifice" comes in like an old-school Slayer riff. Mid-tempo death metal songs are few and far between, and this one is indeed a banger and a standout song on the album.

The chugginess returns with "Blood Blind," and tech metal even comes into play with the chaotic riffing of "Vengeful Invasion."

By the time the title track arrives, the tempo has hit full throttle, and it isn't until the 10th and final track, "Drain You Empty," that the band finally slows down to hit a dramatic finale.

Though they have absorbed techniques from other subgenres of extreme metal, the tried-and-true formula is what you're getting here. If you have enjoyed the first 15 Cannibal Corpse albums, this one isn't gonna throw any curveballs.

If you're not familiar with the band or the genre in general, it's also safe to say that it is in acquired taste. Tread with caution, but remember it's all in good fun and there is no evidence thus far that anyone in this band has actually participated in any of the traumatizing acts that the lyrics suggest. — *Jamie DeVinney*

Animal Collective *Isn't It Now?*



Over the course of 12 albums since 2000's *Spirit They're Gone, Spirit They've Vanished*, Animal Collective releases have slowed in the past few years, with 2022's *Time Skiffs* coming six years after *Painting With.*

Well, they've picked up the pace, as we now have *Isn't It Now?*

Their latest effort is a collection fans should approve, with songs catching the feels of their early days as well as more recent times.

Opening with "Soul Capturer," you get that old-school Animal Collective with melodic instrumentation and Avey Tare's haunting melodies.

The good times continue on "Genie's Open," which opens with a mesmerizing beat on loop that builds into much more with bells and heavier bass that would fit well on The Beach Boys' *Pet Sounds*.

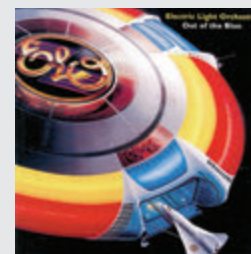
One the shortest tracks, with a two-and-a-half minute runtime, is "Broke Zodiac" which breaks out with a Caribbean vibe, and the chill carries throughout. They get into their hometown roots with "Magicians from Baltimore," tapping into Pink Floyd vibes with a beautiful chorus that Collective fans have grown to love.

Then, as a friend told me, "things get weird" with the 22-minute "Defeat." Beginning slowly with vocals over a droning organ, things rarely pick up. There is a good song that kicks in a mere 9:30 in, but that lasts only a couple minutes before there's an interlude of nonsense I could hear standing under a power line. That lasts until

Electric Light Orchestra

Out of the Blue
(1977)



Electric Light Orchestra were formed in 1970 and released the hit,

"Roll Over Beethoven," in early 1973. Formed by Bev Bevan and Jeff Lynne, ELO combined pop and synthesized orchestra with guitars and vocals. Following the hit singles "Livin' Thing," "Strange Magic," and "Do Ya," ELO was sometimes compared to The Beatles because of the harmonies and musical production.

Their seventh release, *Out of the Blue*, was a double album that solidified who they were in the mainstream of '70s stadium rock.

Lynne wrote the album in 25 days in Munich, an accomplishment that blows the mind when you listen to it.

Catchy tunes included "Turn to Stone," "Sweet Talkin' Woman," and "Mr. Blue Sky." The other tracks capture the musical innovations that Lynne and Bevan had created in earlier works.

"Across the Border," "Birmingham Blues," and "Wild West Hero" almost sound like songs from different bands because of the diverse styles and sounds.

The dreamy "Starlight" and "The Whale" are soothing, while "Jungle" is a funky track that uses strings, synthesizers, and percussion. It seems as if everything on the album was designed for a good pair of headphones.

This was their finest collection, and although 1979's "Don't Bring Me Down" was a huge hit, the founders went their separate ways in the '80s. — *Dennis Donahue*

another actual song breaks out again at 14:20 with a fun bass line that ebbs and flows until the song peters out.

Things get back on track with "Gem and I," and "Stride Rite" is a departure with an almost Roy Orbison feel before opening up a bit, but it keeps a nightclub vibe.

On "All the Clubs Are Broken," they get about as poppy as you'll find. Things close out with "King's Walk" as Avey Tare (David Portner), Panda Bear (Noah Lennox), Deakin (Josh Dibb), and Geologist (Brian Weitz) provide their characteristic chants over instrumentation.

Are there moments I get bored with this album? Yes. Are there excellent moments? Yes. It's a true mix what we've come to expect from Animal Collective over the years, for better and for worse. — *Anthony Gadson*

Make reservation to see new thriller

Following up her exceptional narrative feature debut *The Assistant* from 2020, Australian filmmaker Kitty Green is back with what could be described as another workplace thriller.

Trading the frigid interiors of New York for the sweltering expanse of The Outback, *The Royal Hotel* is obviously rougher around the edges by comparison but still playing with the same themes of gender politics and power dynamics.

Holding the center of both films is Julia Garner, a terrific actress familiar to many for her award-winning work as Ruth Langmore in the Netflix series *Ozark*. There's never any guessing what's on Ruth's mind; she's an emotionally explosive character and eminently watchable as such. But seeing Garner in this pair of films, it's fascinating seeing how much she can drive the trajectory of a story even in more restrained performances.

In *The Royal Hotel*, Hanna (Garner) and her best friend Liv (Jessica Henwick) are young Americans who find themselves low on funds during their work travel program. Desperate for cash, they agree to a bartending gig in a remote Australian town populated mainly by unrefined miners — “You’re gonna have to be OK with a little male attention,” an employment officer cautions them ahead of their assignment. They’re driven to their new workplace/living quarters, The Royal Hotel, a rundown pub run by the perpetually drunk or hungover Billy (Hugo Weaving) and his much more reliable cook Carol (Ursula Yovich). Hanna and Liv try to make the best of the unsavory situation, keeping their heads down while cracking open longnecks for roughnecks, but the advances of the male patrons push the undesirable circumstances into even more hostile territory.

One of the challenges in watching *The Royal Hotel* is in restraining oneself from asking the question, “Why don’t they just get out of there?” every five minutes. In that way, it may play more like a slasher movie than a traditional psychological thriller, but along with co-writer Oscar Redding, Green comes with just enough justifications to sustain the film’s taut 91-minute runtime. Most of these are spoken by Liv, the more adventurous of the two travelers and the most seemingly oblivious with the squalor of their surroundings. “That’ll be us in a few weeks,” Liv jokes as an overserved female flasher is being pulled down from dancing atop the bar. Just because Hanna is the more level-headed of the two and more of an audience surrogate doesn’t mean she isn’t given just as many chances to hightail it out of the dilapidated bar.

If *The Royal Hotel* is somewhat disappointing in comparison to *The Assistant*, it’s the fact that the subjects and threats here are a bit more shallow and less intellectually engaging. The toxic masculinity and permissible behavior on display at the film production company where *The Assistant* takes place lead to chilling conversations with startling subtext. Yes, it’s more believable that the surly men in *The Royal Hotel* would hurl salty language across the pub as opposed to sneaking veiled threats, but there isn’t quite as much nuance in their menace. The most overtly intimidating of the patrons, an ironically named Dolly (Daniel Henshall), is highlighted in one of the movie’s best scenes where he

spoils the wedding anniversary of a couple who mistakenly visit the bar. The sequence best demonstrates how quickly a sour situation can escalate, and the film could have used a few more tactfully deployed examples to match it.

Nevertheless, Green’s direction displays her aptitude for simmering thrillers that get under our skin and slowly set up a final act with explosive outcomes.

Garner proves key to the formula once again, her Hanna ever so slightly revealing degrees of separation between herself and the more free-spirited Liv. Knowing the kind of powder keg performances that she’s given in the past, it’s exciting to see how much pent-up rage Garner will let come through in her character.

Henwick’s performance is the more laid-back, and when she’s not volleying sexist jabs from bawdy bar dwellers, she has some fun bits of levity. I was tickled by the moment where she treats a box of white wine like manna from heaven.

It’s no tourist ad for the land down under, but *The Royal Hotel* is worth checking into for a tense and thrilling trip.

In all, Childers has released six studio albums, including *Rustin' in the Rain* last month as well as several EPs and singles.

SG Goodman will open the Pine Knob and United Center shows, with **Addeem the Artist** accompanying for the show at Ruoff.

Madison Beer plans '24 tour

Pop singer-songwriter **Madison Beer** emerged in 2017 after Justin Bieber noticed her and tweeted out a link of one of her videos to his millions of followers, greatly elevating her popularity.

With that notoriety firmly in the rearview mirror, Beer continues to make music, releasing her sophomore full-length, *Silence Between Songs*, last month.

She is waiting until the calendar slips to 2024 to support it.

When it does fire up, the five-month Spinnin' Tour will stop at Riviera Theatre in Chicago on April 26, Andrew J. Brady Music Center in Cincinnati on April 30, The Egyptian Room at Old National Centre in Indianapolis on May 1, and The Fillmore in Detroit on May 3.

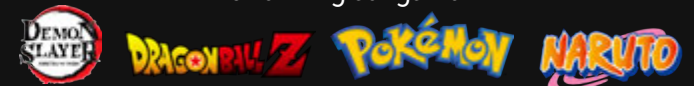
